Find 5 interesting words in a book you are reading. Write them down and draw a picture for each. Write about something you did at the weekend. Use first, next, then, finally. Practise counting in 2s, 5s, or 10s. Write down the numbers or say them out loud to someone at home. Write your own multiplication or division word problems (e.g., "I have 4 bags with 3 apples in each. How many apples?"). Find as many pairs of numbers that make 10 as you can! Write them down and draw a picture to show one of your pairs (for example, 6 apples and 4 apples). Extra Challenge: Can you write the matching subtraction fact? (e.g., $10 - 7 = 3$)	Find 3 things made of metal and 3 things made of plastic. Which do you think conduct electricity? Draw a poster showing one way to stay safe around electricity (e.g., don't touch plugs with wet hands). Draw your dream garden. Include at least 3 plants and label them. Draw your favourite fruit or vegetable and write where it grows.	Write a menu for a Tudor feast. What would you eat and drink? Draw a simple timeline of the Tudor time period showing Henry VIII, Edward VI, and Mary I. Make a colourful poster inviting people to visit one part of the British Isles. Include a picture of a famous landmark and one fun fact. Draw a simple map of the British Isles and label England, Scotland, Wales, and Ireland. Add the flags for each country.	Draw a poster showing one piece of "good news" Jesus brings (e.g., love, forgiveness, peace). Make a card for Easter with a picture and a short message about why Christians celebrate.
