

Many people these days are thinking outside the box and exploring the idea of being cremated or seeking cremation alternatives.

If you go with the traditional cremation you can get your loved ones out of the house for a day to scatter your ashes in the mountains.

Or, you can have your remains built into jewelry for any occasion—yes, you can

have your ashes pressed into a precious diamond. It's your call.

There is a new technology catching on which allows you to be turned into compost so you can return back to the earth.

Another alternative is having your nutrient-rich remains added to a giant seedpod; eventually turning you into a Giant Redwood Tree (or tree of your choice).

Funeral pyres can get out of control so quickly (especially during the dry season), so we highly recommend visiting us in person and chatting
