Rhonda's Reflections for Holy Week

I have vivid memories of Easter Sunday while growing up. I remember the dresses, the hats and the gloves. I remember egg hunts with Sunday School friends and ham dinners with my family. All of these are important memories.

God calls us to remember and to tell. Throughout the Old Testament, God commands His people to pass His stories from generation to generation, so that all will know where they come from and whose they are. Throughout the New Testament, Christ tells His disciples to remember Him whenever they celebrate Holy Communion and God calls the disciples to tell Christ's stories to all nations.

This is a critical season in the church for remembering and telling God's story; to tell and hear the story of Palm Sunday; to remember and retell the story of the Last Supper; to meditate upon the story of Christ's death on the cross; and to proclaim with praise and thanksgiving the story of Christ's victory over death on Easter Sunday.

This year, I am encouraging everyone not to skip steps in the story to get right to the happy ending. Let us not pass by Palm Sunday, Maundy Thursday, or Good Friday and go straight to Easter. Let us be the people of the story by reading every word, retracing every significant step that Christ took, all to be able to experience the full impact of Easter morning with jubilation and gratitude.





Early Days

On June 10, 1849 a group of German Protestant Christians of St. Marys organized the "German Evangelical Protestant Congregation of St. Marys, Ohio" under the leadership of the Reverend Adolph Conradi who was then pastor of the St. Peter's Congregation in New Bremen, Ohio. According to a report made by Rev. Conradi to the Joint Synod of Ohio (now a part of the American Lutheran Church), the congregation consisted in the beginning of about thirty families. This congregation was destined to become the mother of the two fine, strong, congregations now known as "The Zion Evangelical Lutheran Church" and "St. Paul's Evangelical and Reformed Church", respectively. By an act of the State Legislature this congregation was incorporated in 1850 and the certificate of charter was granted.

Apparently the purpose for the founding of this congregation was two-fold: (1) to provide a means of worship for German-speaking people and (2)

The St. Paul's UCC was called to order March 12, 2024, by President Marsha Landers.

- Consistory decided to put information into the Personnel Handbook that the church is exempt from paying Unemployment so that is clear to all employees.
- ♦ Ideas were suggested, and avenues to explore, to aid in finding an Administrative Assistant. Posting will bein various places and contacting area colleges were two of the suggestions.
- Rev. Rhonda Hainer prayed for wisdom and commitment for the consistory members. She also said that the congregation has many members who are sick or have had surgery. She has been busy making many, many calls visits. Rev. Hainer said she is planning a "Blessing of the Soil" on April 28 with a number of special effects.
- The next meeting will be held on Tuesday, April9th.
- The Elders and Deacons discussed communion for the upcoming Holy season.
- Trustees said since the Women's Guild is purchasing new chairs for Heritage Hall, Larry Kill sold two carts of metal chairs and 6 old, unused tables to the Auglaize County Agricultural Society. The money will go to the purchase of more new chairs.
- In his Financial Report, Dave noted the Organ Fund has three CDs. He asked permission to discontinue using the blue deposit books used for many years since we have duplicate deposit slips and the bank staples on a confirmation deposit slip after they county the money. Permission was given.
- The Stewardship Committee recommended that an assistant treasurer be sought to become familiar with our methods of accounting and reporting. They also suggested adding Dane Marsee to the VANC on-line giving account to make the system more useable to our members.
- The Organ Fund has a quilt made by women of the church that will be offered during a silent auction item and emphasized the members to put in a bid.



- ♦ The Strategic Planning Committee reported they have outlined the "roadmap" of strategies following the compilation of the letters. There are four areas of improving the life of the church to make decisions and appeal to the community.
- Consistory approved a donation to the City of St. Marys Fire Department to aid in fire prevention education. They also noted that the second Sunday in May there will be a loose offering donation to the Hirschfeld Foundation for Scholarships.
- ◆ The Ash Wednesday and the Lenten offerings will go into the current Fund.
