**“Food for Thought, Food for the Soul,
and Some Mashed Potatoes on the Side.”**

Summer has a way of revealing what is really going on inside of us.

You can usually tell by about the third straight day of heat, humidity, traffic, broken air conditioners, vacation packing, family road trips, and somebody saying, “Are we there yet?” for the fifteenth time.

It does not take long before what is inside of us starts showing up on the outside.

A person can look calm and holy on Sunday morning in church... but let the internet quit working during the seventh inning of a ballgame or let someone cut them off in the Walmart parking lot, and suddenly we discover just how much “spiritual growth” still needs to happen.

The truth is that our reactions are not determined only by what happens around us. They are shaped by whoever is in control within us.

If self is in charge, we usually react out of anger, pride, fear, impatience, or the desperate need to be right. But when Christ is truly shaping our hearts, our responses begin to look different.

1 Peter 2:21–23 reminds us that when Jesus was insulted, He did not insult in return. When He suffered, He did not threaten others. Jesus did not allow the chaos around Him to become the chaos within Him.

That is not weakness. That is spiritual maturity.

Following Christ is not simply about believing in Jesus. It is about allowing Jesus to transform the way we live, speak, react, and love.

So maybe this summer, the real question is not:
“What is happening around me?”

Maybe the deeper question is:
“Who is controlling what is happening inside of me?”

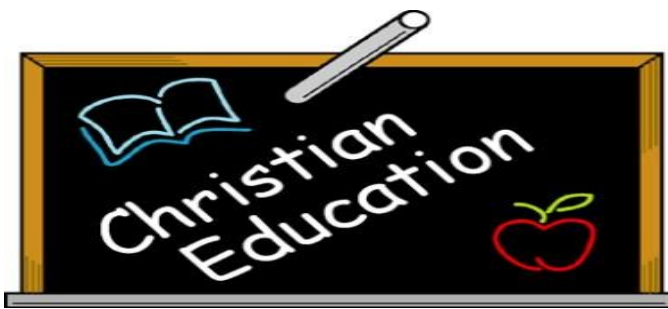

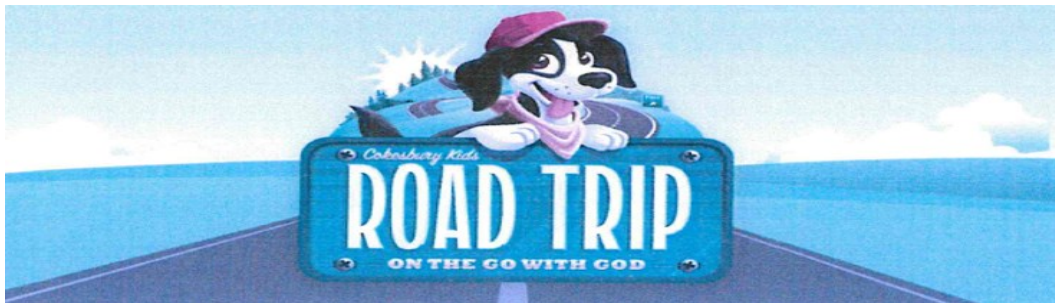
VACATION BIBLE SCHOOL

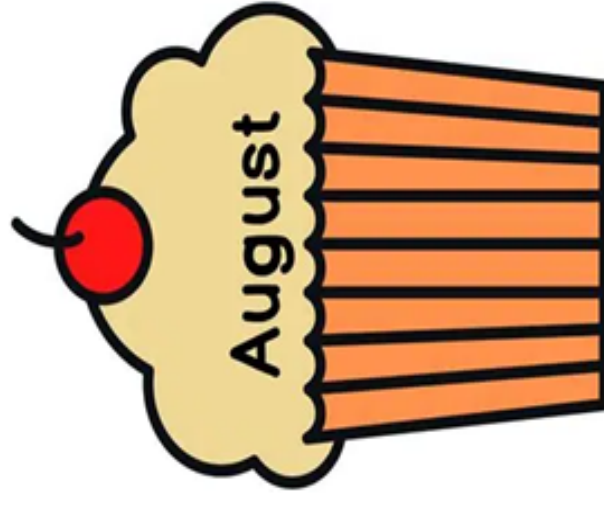
