

# 1 Samuel 17:4-8

New Revised Standard Version Updated Edition

<sup>4</sup> And there came out from the camp of the Philistines a champion named Goliath, of Gath, whose height was four cubits and a span. <sup>5</sup> He had a helmet of bronze on his head, and he was armed with a coat of mail; the weight of the coat was five thousand shekels of bronze. <sup>6</sup> He had greaves of bronze on his legs and a javelin of bronze slung between his shoulders. <sup>7</sup> The shaft of his spear was like a weaver's beam, and his spear's head weighed six hundred shekels of iron, and his shieldbearer went before him. 8 He stood and shouted to the ranks of Israel, "Why have you come out to draw up for battle? Am I not a Philistine, and are you not servants of Saul? Choose<sup>[b]</sup> a man for yourselves, and let him come down to me.

# 1 Samuel 17:32-33

<sup>32</sup> David said to Saul, "Let no one's heart fail because of him; your servant will go and fight with this Philistine." <sup>33</sup> Saul said to David, "You are not able to go

against this Philistine to fight with him, for you are just a boy, and he has been a warrior from his youth."

# 1 Samuel 17:38-43

<sup>38</sup> Saul clothed David with his armor; he put a bronze helmet on his head and clothed him with a coat of mail. <sup>39</sup> David strapped Saul's sword over the armor, and he tried in vain to walk, for he was not used to them. Then David said to Saul, "I cannot walk with these, for I am not used to them." So David removed them. <sup>40</sup> Then he took his staff in his hand and chose five smooth stones from the wadi and put them in his shepherd's bag, in the pouch; his sling was in his hand, and he drew near to the Philistine.

<sup>41</sup> The Philistine came on and drew near to David, with his shield-bearer in front of him. <sup>42</sup> When the Philistine looked and saw David, he disdained him, for he was only a youth, ruddy and handsome in appearance. <sup>43</sup> The Philistine said to David, "Am I a dog, that you come to me with sticks?" And the Philistine cursed David by his gods.

# 1 Samuel 17:48-49

<sup>48</sup> When the Philistine drew nearer to meet David, David ran quickly toward the battle line to meet the Philistine. <sup>49</sup> David put his hand in his bag, took out a stone, slung it, and struck the Philistine on his forehead; the stone sank into his forehead, and he fell face down on the ground.

# CONGREGATION MEETING SEPTEMBER 24th

A congregation meeting has been scheduled for September 24th, immediately following worship service. This meeting is to vote on changes to the church Constitution. Potential changes are listed below. Please mark your calendar and plan on attending.

In response to the changing landscape of attendance, faithfulness, and being good stewards of our community together, your St. Paul's Consistory has recommended the following changes to the Constitution: (Paraphrased)

**Article II - Faith** 

Insert a #4: "Romans 15:7, and welcoming all to join us in our faith journey."

**Article VIII - Consistory** 

Revise #3: "Elders & Deacons...change 3 year term to 2 years."

Add a new #17: "Consistory to present an annual report to the congregation in February."

**Article X - Congregational Officers** 

Revise to read: "The current Consistory President & Vice President shall serve same for the congregation." (Thus deleting the positions of President & VP of Congregation)

**Article XII - Congregational Meetings** 

"Change to one meeting per year, held in December."

"Budget & Finance Committee to present annual church budget to Consistory for discussion and approval."

**Article XIV - Delete entire Article** 

"All societies and committees are subordinate to the Consistory, and shall report annually to the Congregation."
