Call isn't necessarily something spectacular, like Superman or Batman.
Sometimes call is as quiet as the wind breezing past the summer leaves. Sometimes it is the

seemingly ordinary when others have grandiose calls.

Take, for instance, George Bailey in *It's a Wonderful Life*. George continues to find himself cemented to his hometown while his brother and others are called in other directions. His brother goes to college, works outside of Bedford Falls, goes to war and becomes a war hero. His friend Sam begins a plastics business. Everyone lives the dreams that George himself could never have. Because of the perspective that George has on his life, he takes for granted the little moments that create the universe. George's call is seen in life's little moments. George saves his brother. George makes loans available to those who couldn't otherwise afford a house. George gives people ideas. George loves the town and those in the town, willing to maintain an honest business for the good of the people. George's call is as important as everyone else around him except that the perception of his call is what the world sees as small.

What if George hadn't answered those calls? We see the outcome in the "what if George wasn't born" portion of the movie. His brother would have died. The death of his brother rippled into the world. Others would have died because he hadn't served in WWII. His friends would live on the streets. The town would have been bought by Mr. Potter and turned into the slums. George's mother and wife face the world with angst.

George Bailey was called to be alive and called to serve in Bedford

Falls.

Just like George, everyone is called in both unique and ordinary ways. The world would be a very different place if we made different decisions or if we had never been born. Yes, we get frustrated with our lives. We forget that the little steps impact the greater universe. And we get upset with the track our lives are on.

So, when we don't feel that our lives make a difference or that we have a purpose here, know that we are all George Baileys – willing to take the little steps in front of us and building a better kingdom of God.

Present: *Elders:* Joan Leffel, Bill Nuss, Janet Gibson, and Lori Now *Trustees:* Larry Kill, and DeWayne Marsee; *Deacons:* Linda McDonald, Fred Scheer, Carol Waesch, Susan Braun, Tom Dickman, Jill Dickman, Jen Lucas, Susan Spencer, Jennifer Ginter, and Becky Anderson. Also, present were, Pastor Rhonda Hainer, Treasurer, David Dickman, and, Administrative Assistant Carolyn Garrison.

Minutes: Susan Braun

Minutes from October 12, 2022, meeting were reviewed.
Jen Lucas asked about a clarification from Becky Anderson
(Volunteer Coordinator of Special Music) on church
members getting paid for musical talent during services.
Becky explained that only students (including college), and
outsiders, will receive payment. Jill Dickman made a motion
to approve the minutes. Joan Leffel seconded. Motion
carried.

Financial Report: David Dickman

 David submitted for review of the Financial Report for the month of October 2022. There being no further discussion, President Susan asked to file the October financial report for review by the church Administrative Assistant.

President's Report: Susan Braun

- The church office was contacted by the Chamber of Commerce regarding an Elf on the Shelf promotion. For liability purposes, and lack of appropriateness for a church, we respectfully declined.
- Ken and Susan Braun handed out 125 bags of candy (with information on our Sunday School classes and worship

times), in the church parking lot on Trick-or-Treat. They ran out of candy bags within 50 minutes.

Pastor's Report: Pastor Rhonda

- World Communion Sunday, the children brought the bread to the altar, and it was discovered that the pre-packaged communion/wafer cups had gone bad and needed to be thrown out.
- Attended an Excellence in Ministry Meeting
- Attended Church and Ministry Committee Meeting with a Retirement Clergy luncheon at Trinity UCC in Tiffin, Ohio.
- Attended Christian Ed, Pastoral Relations, and Stewardship Committee meetings.
- Conducted one funeral.
- Led a special Healing Worship Service with Rev. Jeanette Tangeman, assisting.
- Began the four once-a-month End-of-Life Series program with Attorney Zach Farrell, and this week with Funeral Director Kent Miller. They have been well received.
- All Saint's Sunday Worship was meaningful, beginning with carrying in the Memorial Bell Banner. So many contributed bells in memory of loved ones. This will be an ongoing tradition.
- Blue Christmas Worship Service will be held on Sunday, November 20th at 4 pm.in the sanctuary. This is in recognition that holidays are not always cheerful times for many.

- Advent lesson plans are being reworked to be correlating with a current children's book with the meaning of Christmas and a craft to go with it.
- December 11th is the Christmas program during worship, and we are working on songs and speaking parts.

Stewardship: Kevin Gehres (via Pastor Rhonda)

- The committee met on October 18th, with five members present. Items discussed included: the possibility of streamlining The Communicator, as well as a short survey to get a read on how members would like to receive it (mail, email, pickup in person on Sundays).
- Making sure members understood not just "What" they were giving to, by the "Why" ... such as OCWM (Our Church's Wider Mission).
- The likelihood that we need to add a member or two, as we move into 2023, as current members opt to step back: Kevin Gehres, Chairperson, Jane Laird, Joan Leffel, Jerry Lucas, Kara Birt, and Rhonda Hainer.

Organ Refurbishing Committee: Becky Anderson

- They have set their campaign kickoff date for January 15, 2023.
- Schantz will be here later this month to tune the organ.
 Rich Spencer will be on hand to video what needs to be accomplished with the organ refurbishing. Rich will then show highlight clips at worship monthly.

Safety Committee: DeWayne Marsee

 The committee has met a couple of times and are hoping to finalize a list to present to Pastor Rhonda, followed by a presentation in December to Consistory.

Old Business:

- Linda McDonald has looked into CPR classes. The Fire
 Department can do CPR/AED classes for \$17. They allow six
 people per class, and the class is only for one evening. Get
 with Linda if you want to get scheduled for this class at the
 Fire Department. The hospital also holds a more detailed
 class (with testing) of CPR/AED/First Aid. Their class is \$54
 and requires multiple classes.
- Susan Braun and Kevin Gehres met on a previous date to review Article VIII of the Constitution. Susan mentioned that the Constitution currently states that a Nominating Committee shall consist of five members. Currently, there are three members of said committee. A discussion was held on the proposed changes to the Constitution, which were discussed at the October 2021, meeting. The Consistory had agreed to suggest changes to Article VIII of the Constitution regarding the number of members on the Nominating Committee (reducing from 5 to 3) with additional members named at the discretion of the President of Consistory, as well as removing language in Article VIII that Consistory members could not be reelected to consecutive terms. These proposed revisions to the Constitution were to have been discussed and voted upon at the February 2022, Congregational meeting. However, the proposed revisions were inadvertently not addressed. Jen Lucas made a motion to reaffirm the proposed changes in Article VIII (which would reduce the number of members on the Nominating Committee from 5 to 3, with additional members named at the discretion of the President of the Consistory, as well as removing language that Consistory members could not be re-elected to consecutive terms) and to bring the recommended revisions to the Constitution to the December 11, 2022, Annual Meeting for approval by the Congregation. Jill Dickman seconded the motion. Motion passed.

New Business:

- Susan Braun announced that the 2023 Consistory Search
 Committee consists of Fred Scheer, Jennifer Ginter, and
 Janet Gibson. The following names are those who have
 accepted a position. For Deacon (four needed), Ruth
 Knous, Marsha Heckler, one person who has not committed
 yet, and one vacant spot. For Elders, Kelly Kill has accepted,
 and one vacant spot remains. For Trustee, Larry Kill. Lori
 Now made a motion to approve said nominations.
 DeWayne Marsee seconded. Motion passed.
- Pastor Rhonda asked Consistory about reimbursing
 Jeanette Tangeman for gas as she has been transporting a
 member, who doesn't drive, back and forth to Miami Valley
 Hospital to visit with the member's spouse. Rhonda asked
 about the gas/mileage money budgeted for the Senior
 Pastor, and offered that since she doesn't use that money,
 or turn in receipts to be reimbursed if it could it be offered
 to Jeanette. After some discussion, it was determined that
 Pastor Rhonda can use her Pastor's Discretionary account
 to purchase a gas card for Jeanette.
