## Worship Service, February 22nd at 7:00 p.m.

Plan now to attend the service of worship offered for Ash Wednesday at 7:00 p.m. This will be a traditional worship service that will include a message by Pastor Rhonda and both the imposition of Ashes and Holy Communion.

Since the beginning of the church, Christians have observed the days of our Lord's passion and resurrection with great devotion. It became one of the greatest traditions of the church to prepare for these events through serious examination of our spiritual lives.

The season of Lent is a time of penitence, discipline, and renewal. In the Ash Wednesday service we are reminded of our mortality, we confess our sins, and we experience forgiveness through Christ's death and resurrection.

The "imposition of ashes" is a central part of the service. You are invited to come forward to receive the ashes on your forehead. In Scripture, ashes serve both as a symbol of mortality and as a sign of mourning and repentance.

But neither sin nor death are the final word. We leave the service in confidence and gratitude: Christ has conquered death, and nothing can separate us from the love of God, which is in Christ Jesus, our Lord.



Ash Wednesday, February 22nd at 7:00 pm begins our annual series of Wednesday Lenten Services.
Communion will be offered at the Ash Wednesday Service. There will be six services, with the last one occurring on April 5th. Make this worship experience part of your Lenten remembrance.

# **End of Life Questions**

For the past several months, Pastor Rhonda has hosted sessions on **End of Life Issues** with guest speakers who have covered these subjects: estate planning, financial planning, funeral planning, personal end of life wishes.

As your pastor, I believe my role is not to provide you with the answers. My job is to help you find the answer that is right for you, and to remind you (often) that you already knew the answer. I am not trying to sway a family to what I would do if I were in their shoes because I am not in their shoes.

The following is how to address **End of Life Questions**.

How do I say a final goodbye to my loved one, and when is the right time to do so?

How do we ask our loved one about her final wishes without making her feel that we are hurrying her death?


In my experience, waiting until a loved one is near death (as we see on TV) is not the best time to tell someone how you feel. I recommend being open and honest with your loved one regularly. This eliminates the need for a final goodbye and the sadness people feel if they weren't present for a final goodbye. If you have always wanted to ask a parent something, do it now. If you want your loved one to know you love them, now is the time to say it.

There are times leading up to a person's death when the family gathers around to be present. If I am invited into this sacred time/space, I will encourage storytelling and memory sharing. Too often, the loved one who is dying is no longer able to participate verbally in the conversation.

My thought is to tell your loved ones you love them each time you talk, as we cannot predict what the future holds. I say this not to worry or alarm anyone. Instead, this is a reminder that all life is frail and ends and I would rather my loved ones know I love them than feel guilty that I didn't tell them!

How do we ask our loved one about her final wishes/hopes/dreams without making her feel that we are hurrying her death?

My best suggestion is to ask the question. "Hey Mom, is there anything you regret not doing? Hey Dad, what is on your bucket list? Is there anywhere you always wanted to travel and never did? Is there a food you have never eaten and would like to try? I wonder if there are any broken relationships you would like



We can become paralyzed by our fears, thinking that if we ask the wrong question that our loved one will think that we no longer want them in our lives. I think being honest is the most helpful. "Mom, I love you and if there is any wish, dream, hope I can help make come true for you, I want to do it. So, is there anything you want to do before you die?"

You might be surprised by how simple the request is. Some people just want to feel the sunshine on their faces or see the ocean one more time or eat their favorite French fries, or dance to a favorite song. If the request is a bit more difficult to make happen, be creative. If your Dad always wanted to go to Italy and that is no longer possible, turn a room in your home into Italy. Hang magazine pictures on the walls. Play Italian music. Serve an Italian meal. Watch a movie that takes place in Italy.

Be brave, my friends! You are stronger than you know and can make it day by day through the hard questions of life!

Each day we live is a gift from God. Our response to God is how we spend that day. That doesn't mean that every day has to be the most productive day ever. You may remember that God rested on the seventh day and told us to do the same. If each day we can brighten the life of another, ease a little suffering, spread a little kindness, we will make God's world a better and more loving place.

**HEAL** is St. Paul's grief group of people who gather monthly on the third Thursday at 1:30 to Help Each other Adjust to Loss. Pastor Rhonda is a trained bereavement counselor, and leads this group for anyone who has recently or long ago experienced a loss of a loved one and would like a safe place to

share their feelings. **HEAL** grief group is open to all faiths. The next meeting is **February**, **16**, **2023**, **1:30 p.m.** in the old library.





One month in for 2023 and we are excited to see what the new year brings. Our winter quarter of lessons continues with

Bible stories about John the Baptist's introduction, Jesus' early ministry in Capernaum ending the quarter with the unexpected way of the King. We start our Sunday School by joining in the Gathering Room to review the children's week with them, then give them a glimpse of what their lesson will be for the day, starting with a scripture reading. Maddy works with them on music selections. We then split them into groups, and they go to the second floor for rotational classes for 1<sup>st</sup> to 5<sup>th</sup> grade. Those two classrooms are Theatre Room (which has actual movie seats) and they either act out the lesson, a teacher reads it to them, or they all participate in some way. Can we get to the top of the wall? We'll see and share pictures with the congregation.

April 2nd is Palm Sunday! For the first time ever (we think), we will have an Easter program. The kids have already started learning the songs, and next up is speaking parts. The youth from Nursery to Senior High will be doing the entire service. Remember the date because we don't think you will want to miss this service.

# UNAPPROVED MINUTES OF THE JANUARY 11, 2023 CONSISTORY MEETING

The regular meeting of St. Paul's UCC Consistory was called to order at 6:00 p.m. by President Susan Braun. Pastor Rhonda opened the meeting with prayer.

#### **Old Business:**

- President Susan thanked those members whose Consistory term is completed. Those members were excused to leave the meeting.

#### **New Business:**

- The 2023 Communion Schedule, Deacon Schedule,
   Communion Processional list, Deacon Responsibilities list,
   and list of Consistory members were passed around.
- Pastor Rhonda installed Marsha Heckler into the Consistory as she was unable to attend installation on January 8th.
- President Kevin thanked Susan Braun for her leadership over Consistory in 2022. Kevin also thanked Larry Kill and DeWayne Marsee for all of their hard work around the church, and also for the Constitution change allowing for some of the prior Consistory members to remain on Consistory.
- DeWayne Marsee passed around a document of various items that the Safety Committee discussed in depth, including how to keep the church safe for all who enter our church and to review the UCC stance/terms on firearms.
   The National UCC office has done extensive research on

- this matter. After some discussion, Carol Schmidt made a motion for Consistory to review these items and report any recommendations at the February Consistory meeting. Carol Gehres seconded the motion.
- President Kevin explained that it was time to review the church Constitution, and possibly bring it up to date. - Kelly Kill discussed the information management in the office, that being the Churchsoft software, and whether there is a better option available. After several calls to area

churches, some of them used Churchsoft, and some used a different software that costs several thousand dollars. Our annual fee with Churchsoft is \$350/year. For an additional cost of \$130, Pastor Rhonda would be able to have the mobile access she has been asking about. Kelly explained that there are many areas of the software that is not being used, and updates are also needed. Kelly will be working with Carolyn to review/train on these items. Kelly also mentioned that for \$45, there is a 30-minute training session with Churchsoft to consider.

There being no further matters to discuss, Tom Dickman made the motion to adjourn and Jen Lucas seconded. The meeting adjourned at 7:43 p.m.
