Rhonda's Reflections



One day, a father came home tired from his job late in the evening, slumped into his chair and turned on the TV to watch the evening news. His five-year-old son came by and gave him a hug. The boy sat for a while and watched

his father watching TV. Finally, he asked, "Daddy, can I ask a question? I was wondering how much money you make in an hour?" "Well," the father said impatiently, "it's really not important and you're probably too young to be asking questions like that, but if you need to know, I make \$22.00 an hour." The boy ran up to his bedroom, and soon ran back with some dollar bills in his hand. "Daddy," he exclaimed, handing him the dollar bills. "I've saved exactly \$11.00 since Christmas. Can I buy a half-hour of your time?"

I was fortunate to have a dad who was different than the dad in this story. My dad would talk and listen to my sisters and I about our days, our friends, our concerns, our lives. We never felt that we had to purchase a 'half an hour' of time for his presence always reaffirmed for us that we were important, we were valuable, and most of all, we were loved.

I'm very much aware that my deepest images of God have come from my parents. There is an old proverb that says: What God is to the world – so parents are to their children. We learn about God from the ones who nurture us. It is because of my parents that my God is a God of presence – One who always has time for me – One who cherishes me and longs to spend time with me in a joyful abandon – One who constantly reminds me that I am important, and valuable, and most of all, loved.

So, the story, like the Gospel, comes with a challenge for all of us. Whomever is in our care, whomever we are called to nurture, whomever we love – we must always remember that we are image-bearers of God for them. Each time someone comes to

us with a concern, and we put our phone down, or turn off Netflix, or pause our Facebook surfing and give another our full attention, we remind them that they are important to us and we become an image of God to them, a God who always claims them as important. Each time we listen to another person - really listen - to understand, and not merely to respond, when we hear what they are saying and discern perhaps what they are not saying, we remind them that they are valuable. We become an image of God for them, a God who tells them of their infinite worth. Every time we forgive another or heal a relationship or give someone a second chance, we become an image of God for them, a God whose love is endless and enduring.

In the summer days ahead, I pray you will find ways to be present to those you love, to those with whom you work, to strangers you meet along the way.

Be an image of God. Always.

Jim's Musical Notes Need Thee Every Hour (1872)

Not that we are sufficient of ourselves to think of anything as being from ourselves, but our sufficiency is from God. 2 Corinthians 3:5

In his book, *The Practice of the Presence of God*, Brother Lawrence claimed to be as close to God while working in the kitchen as when praying in the chapel. The Lord, after all, is *always* near us, thus wherever we are is holy ground. That was the experience of Annie Hawks, a housewife and mother of three in Brooklyn, New York.

As a child, Annie Sherwood had dabbled in poetry, her first verse being published when she was 14. In 1857, she married Charles Hawks and they established their home in Brooklyn, joining Dr. Robert Lowry's Hanson Place Baptist Church. With the good doctor's encouragement, she began writing Sunday school songs for children, and he set them to music.

"I Need Thee Every Hour" was written on a bright June morning in 1872. Annie later wrote, "One day as a young wife and mother of 37 years of age, I was busy with my regular household tasks. Suddenly, I became so filled with the sense of nearness to the Master that, wondering how one could live without Him, either in joy or pain, these words, 'I Need Thee Every Hour,' were ushered into my mind, the thought at once taking full possession of me."

The next Sunday, Annie handed these words to Dr. Lowry, who wrote the tune and chorus while seated at the little organ in the living room of his Brooklyn parsonage. Later that year, it was sung for the first time at the National Baptist Sunday School Association meeting in Cincinnati, Ohio, and published in a hymnbook the following year.

When Annie's husband died sixteen years later, she found that her own hymn was among her greatest comforts. "I did not understand at first why this hymn had touched the great throbbing heart of humanity," Annie wrote. "It was not until long after, when

the shadow fell over my way, the shadow of great loss, that I understood something of the comforting power in the words which I had been permitted to give out to others in my hour of sweet serenity and peace."

Sometime after Charles' death, Annie moved to Bennington, Vermont, to live with her daughter and son-in-law. All in all, she wrote over four hundred hymns during her eighty-three years, though only this one is still widely sung.

Old Business:

- Kevin Gehres gave a brief update on Disaster Ministries regarding Templed Hills donating a trailer (which went to Dayton due to all the work still needing to be done during the 2019 tornado), the Southern Ohio/Northern Kentucky Association donated money to put tools in the trailer. 
