Jim's Musical Notes "Lord Speak to Me" (1872)

Frances Ridley Havergal came by her love of hymnology naturally. Her father, Rev William Henry Havergal, was an Anglican clergyman who devoted his life to improving the music of the Church of England, writing over 100 hymns himself.

Frances, born in the rectory at Astley, Worcestershire, on December 14, 1836, was a delightful child who began reading and memorizing the Bible at age four. By age seven, she was already writing poems. At age nine her family moved to the rectory of St. Nicholas, Worcester, and there she had her own room. "Dear child, "her mother told her, "you have your own little bedroom now, it ought to be a little Bethel."

"I could not then make head or tail of what she meant," Frances later wrote, "and often wondered, until some months later, when in Genesis, I came to the chapter; and then I understood it. Having that small room to myself developed memmuch as a child; it was mine, and to me, it was the coziest little nest in the world."

A deep sadness fell on her at age eleven, however, when her mother became ill. Calling Frances to her bedside, she said, "You are my youngest little girl, and I feel more anxious about you than the rest. I do pray for the Holy Spirit to lead and guide you. And remember, nothing but the blood of Christ can make you clean and lovely in God's sight."

"Oh, mamma, I am sure you will get better and go to church again."

"No, dear child; the church mamma is going to is the general assembly and the church of the Firstborn in heaven. How glorious to know I shall soon see my Savior face to face! Now go and play and sing some of your little hymns for me."

When her mother died shortly afterward, Frances crept again and again into the room when no one was near, drawing aside the curtain, looking at the stilled form. But she never forgot her mother's last words to her, and soon thereafter she gained assurance of her salvation.

Frances Ridley Havergal went on to become a deeply spiritual writer of hymns and devotional books. This hymn, originally entitled "A Worker's Prayer," was written on April 28, 1872, at Winterdyne, Bewdley, England, for the use of lay helpers in the church.



The Organ Committee met May 4, 2022. We met with Luke from Schantz Organ Co. It would not be to our advantage to segment the refurbishing of the organ into two separate jobs. It would cost approximately \$15,000 more and take twice as long to complete the job. It would take three months for each segment, which means we would be without an organ for six months. The consensus was to proceed with the project as a whole and only be without the organ for approximately three months. Fundraising will be started soon, perhaps this summer. The project will not be done for three to five years. That gives us time to raise the needed funds. We can sign a contract with Schantz when we have a ten percent down payment, approximately \$20,000. Eighty percent will be paid as the project progresses. The remaining ten percent needs to be paid when the job is complete.

Old Business: None

New Business:

- Discussion regarding summer worship time. What date do we want to start it? Do we keep it at 10:30 and just remain consistent year-around? Do we want to start at 10:00 just for the three months and possibly vote on moving our service time to 10:00 permanently? Joan Leffel made a motion to start services at 10:00. Tim Hirschfeld seconded the motion, motion carried. Suggestions for having two services were brought up, and the pros and cons of doing two services were discussed. After a lengthy discussion, Tim Hirschfeld made a motion to have two services during June, July and August, with the first service being at 8:30 and the second service at 10:00 a.m. starting June 5th. Joan Leffel seconded the motion. Motion carried.
- Due to the meeting running late, Pastor Rhonda asked that we table Kevin's presentation on Disaster Ministries.

There being no further matters to discuss, Tim Hirschfeld made the motion to adjourn and Larry Kill seconded. The regular meeting adjourned at 7:36 p.m.
