
ONLINE GIVING IS AVAILABLE


THANK YOU FOR ALL OF THE LANTERNS!




Highlights from the December 12, 2023 Consistory Meeting

- Budget and Finance presented the 2024 proposed Church Budget, which was reviewed and approved.
- The Trustees shared they are working on upgrading the interior/exterior camera security system. They are looking into grants to assist in the costs of replacement. They have put the door numbers above the outside doors.
- Mission, Outreach & Evangelism reported the congregation had supported the Sunday School project with the purchase of 134 solar lanterns for the children in Ukraine.
- The Strategic Planning Committee will be presenting the results in a joint planning meeting with the Consistory at their January or February meeting.
- The Safety Committee reported that they are working on CPR training, in conjunction with the SMFD, for interested church members, training will be held early 2024.
- Fred Scheer reported church signage for the west side of the church is in and will be installed soon.
- 175th Anniversary Committee is working on events/celebrations for 2024, concentrating on the June 9 Sunday.
