So, often we want this light that is shined upon Jesus to stop there. But Jesus does not let that happen. The magicians and sorcerers point to the star, the star points to Jesus, and then Jesus points...to you. You are the light of the world. The question then becomes, what are you going to do with the divine light that shines upon you and within you? You can let the light stop at you, as King Herod did, which leads to the path of power through oppression and bondage, to the path of darkness and death. Or you can refract the light onto others, which leads to the path of love and compassion, peacemaking and blessing, to the path of light and life.

You are the light of the world. Not because of your religious affiliation. Not because of your nationality. Not because of your social class. But because of your humanity. As a child of God, as part of creation, you were created in God's image and declared good. You are the light of the world. You are God's deepest desire. God's hope for the future of creation. What will you do with that light? Will you love those beside you, even when they infuriate you? Will cry out when you see injustice? When you encounter someone different from you, whether it is her hijab head covering, the tattoos crawling down his arm, or the business suit that she wears, will you whisper to them, "You are the light of the world."

You are the one through whom the world will encounter God.

When everything else is darkness, you might be the only light they see. What will you do with that light? Do not hide it

under a bushel basket, but let your light shine before others, that they may see God.

The regular meeting of St. Paul's UCC Consistory was called to order at 6:00 p.m. by President Susan Braun. Pastor Rhonda presented each Consistory member with an angel ornament, opened with a reading from the book of Luke, chapter 2:8-9, and asked the question, "Whose Angel will You be?" sharing the Good News of Christ's birth and the message of hope, peace, joy, and love. She followed with a prayer.

Present: Elders: Joan Leffel, Bill Nuss, Kevin Gehres, and Lori Now Trustees: Larry Kill, and DeWayne Marsee; Deacons: Linda McDonald, Fred Scheer, Carol Waesch, Susan Braun, Tom Dickman, Jill Dickman, Susan Spencer, Jennifer Ginter, Carol Schmidt, and Becky Anderson. Also, present were, Pastor Rhonda Hainer, Treasurer, David Dickman, and, Administrative Assistant Carolyn Garrison.

Minutes: Susan Braun

 Minutes from the November 9, 2022, meeting were reviewed. Lori Now made a motion to approve the minutes.
 DeWayne Marsee seconded. Motion carried.

Financial Report: David Dickman

 David submitted for review of the Financial Report for the month of November 2022. There being no further discussion, President Susan asked to file the November financial report for review by the church Administrative Assistant.

President's Report: Susan Braun

• Received a letter from Jim Huckemeyer resigning his position effective immediately from Consistory due to scheduling conflicts on Wednesday evenings, and it is hard for him to be an Elder when he is also in charge of running the video. Jim has two years remaining on his term. President Susan read the Consistory guidelines from our church Constitution and President Susan asked for any recommendations of someone to fill Jim's term. Jill Dickman spoke up and asked President Susan, whose term ends in 2022 if she would be willing to stay on Consistory and fill Jim's vacancy. President Susan agreed to fill the vacant Elder position starting in January 2023. Jill Dickman then made the nomination for Susan Braun to fill Jim Huckemeyer's vacant position. Joan Leffel seconded the motion. Motion carried.

- The children's Christmas program was phenomenal. Maddy Frankenhauser and the Sunday School teachers did a wonderful job. Thank you Joan Leffel and Jane Nuss for their leadership and commitment to serve St. Paul's families.
- The Christmas Eve Communion and Candlelight service will be at 7 pm. Holy Communion will be passed in the pews for this service. There will be a brief communion rehearsal this Sunday following the worship service.

- Thank you to DeWayne Marsee for the new outdoor signage which will aid in providing helpful hospitality to visitors.
- St. Paul's hosted the Hospice Memorial Service led by the St. Marys Hospice staff. The service was meaningful for those in attendance, and the Hospice staff was impressed with our facilities.
- Fred Scheer is making wooden risers (like those used for the Hospice service) for votive candles to be used for persons to light for special prayer.

- Working on installing shelving in the (classroom that used to be the Able Office), as well as installing appropriate wiring for Breaking Bread freezers.
- Due to a radiator leak on the third floor of the Education Building, causing water damage to the ceiling and carpet in the Pastor's office, the carpet was cleaned and the ceiling will be repainted in the spring. The leak was repaired.

- Thanks to all those volunteering to help out when needed to cover on Sundays due to other commitments.
- When Linda and I started, as Co-Head Deacons, there was always a paper form that documented the amount of money that was collected from the Sunday School kids (as

well as the loose offering during worship). This system is a great way to double-check the amounts of what Sunday School took in, as well as the loose offering that the Deacons/Elders have to count. Lately, the Deacons/Elders have been having to count both the loose offering and the Sunday School offering. Is this just an oversight? Joan Leffel stated that for a while there were no slips for us to use, as we had used them all up. I just realized the other day that there were more slips on our desk. We have been extremely busy the last few months. However, it is also OK for the deacons to do our count for us.

- According to the Constitution, the congregational meeting is designated to occur on the second Sunday in December. The meeting, of course, was this past Sunday, the same day as the Children's Program. The conflict is that a lot of the Sunday School teachers were attending to the kids after the program, as they should be. This caused plenty of folks to not be able to attend the meeting, even if they wanted to. In previous years, the Children's Program generally fell on the third Sunday of December. President Susan asked if we have any other nominations, with no other nominations, President Susan announced that nominations were closed. President Susan stated that nominations for Vice President are now open. Jill Dickman asked the current President, Susan Braun since she is staying Consistory with filling Jim Huckemeyer's term if she would be willing to be the Vice President of Consistory. Susan stated that she would be willing. President Susan then asked if there were any other nominations, with no other nominations, President Susan announced that nominations were closed. With only one person being nominated for both President and Vice President, we declare that the nominees are elected by unanimous consent.
- President Susan announced that it has been five years since the church Constitution has been amended. In 2023 there will be a committee formed to review the Constitution and see if anything needs to be updated.
- Kevin Gehres shared with Consistory that this morning on the Heartland Conference Enews, Andrew Warner who is with the National Office Stewardship and Generosity Minister, made a very "cool" point in his piece this morning because he talked about how some annual meetings in churches can be very painful to sit through as they can be very cut and dry, and varying in length.
 Here at St. Paul's we are down here and we eat, some

people are still eating their pie and we eat, some business. It is very short and sweet. Andrew's point was to raise in celebration of the previous year's accomplishments within the congregation. One way to do that would be for

each committee to select a picture from that year that would be included in the annual meeting booklet above, below, or beside their small report so that it would give the reader more of an incentive to be involved. Andrew's point was that those things don't have to necessarily be dry, and can be a celebration of the year's accomplishments as the annual meeting is all about the year in review. This would also be another opportunity to highlight those committees that we highlighted back in the spring. After some discussion, committees will submit photos to be displayed on the Fellowship Hall screen during the annual meeting. Pastor Rhonda spoke up and said that our theme this year could be "GIFT" Growing In Faith Together.

• Kevin Gehres also wanted to let everyone know, as Disaster Ministries Coordinator, that as of a week ago December 13th, we had not just met, but exceeded our goal of 2022 of buckets, kits, and backpacks here at Heartland Conference. In no small part to the heart of this church and the willingness, we all gave the financial backing of almost 100 of those kits and buckets from St. Paul's here in St. Marys. Kudos to all of you and all of our congregation for all of the hard work and willingness to support that ministry.

There being no further matters to discuss, President Susan dismissed the staff and moved the meeting into Executive Session at 6:55 p.m.
