The Season After Pentecost – Ordinary Time

We have now entered the Season after Pentecost. The liturgical color stays green, and we are in what is referred to as "ordinary time" which is the longest season of the church year, reflecting that most of our life is spent in the "in between" times—in between the big, exciting events of life. For the most part, our life consists of ordinary, everyday stuff.

Yet, the Season after Pentecost invites us to look within instead of looking around, to find the extraordinary in the ordinary, and to allow our ordinary everyday life to become our prayer. To discover that every moment is sacred. Perhaps the greatest obstacle to discovering and living the sacrament of the moment is the busyness of the moment.

St. Augustine said that our hearts are restless until they rest in God. "Resting in God" sounds like a great idea, but many of us think we are too busy to take time to rest in God. And if we can just do or schedule a little bit more, then maybe that restless feeling will go away. My experience, however, is that it never completely goes away. That restless feeling is God calling to us.

We may not have "resting in God" written on our calendar, yet during this Season after Pentecost, God is calling us to rest in God's presence. It is a reminder of and a time to acknowledge and experience God's presence and God's faithfulness in the mundane day-to-day stuff of our lives.

We gather every Sunday morning at 10:00 a.m. beginning June 4<sup>th</sup> to worship God and be refreshed for the week ahead. Join us. Invite someone to join you. All are welcome at St. Paul's United Church of Christ, St. Marys.

## **FAQ About Restoring the 1954 Schantz Organ**

#### What will happen to

### the organ during the renovation?

The following is a quote from Luke Tegtmeier from Schantz Organ Company:

"Your organ's mechanism is full of leather to control the flow of air to the nearly 800 pipes. To replace the leather, we would remove all of the pipes to allow us to bring most of the organ's mechanism back to our shop. The metal pipes would be stored on-site if possible, while the stoppered metal pipes would also come back to our shop to allow us to replace the leather stoppers."

By having an updated organ with 21st-century technology, the instrument will be greatly expanded in flexi-



bility and usability making it more inviting to recruit and retain future organists.

#### **BE AN ORGAN DONOR**

... when the mechanisms (leather) fail, the organ has holes in its sound production.



#### **HIGHLIGHTS OF THE MAY 10, 2023 CONSISTORY MEETING**

Pastor Rhonda reported that we had 4 representatives (Susan Braun, Janet Gibson, Kevin Gehres, Pastor Rhonda) to the Northwest Ohio Association annual meeting at St. Paul's, Wapak. Rev. Dan Busch, Association Minister, asked Pastor Rhonda to be a Heartland Conference Clergy Delegate to the UCC General Synod, June 30 -July 5 in Indianapolis.


- Trustees shared they have ordered a new 5 ton air conditioner for the sanctuary. They also have been working on the Phase 1 items on the approved Safety items for the church.
- Christian Education & Nurture reports we have 10 campers registered for church camp at Templed Hills for this summer. Registrations are still accepted, up until the individual camp events.
- Christian Mission & Outreach is working on a draft for a potential "Ride Share" program, offering transportation to church.
- Constitution Revision Committee shared recommendations to update the current Constitution. The Consistory will schedule a future Congregational meeting to present, and vote on these changes.
- A "Tour of Churches" is scheduled for July 9th, offering the community the opportunity of seeing the beauty, and uniqueness, of the St. Marys city churches.
- The Consistory discussed a Strategic Planning Process framework, as presented by facilitator, Ruth Knous. Volunteers are being sought for the committee, which will begin its work in the summer of 2023.
