What's Your Point? Read Mark 10:35-45

Do you remember a time when you felt important because of your association with someone else? Maybe it was in school and you got to hang with the cool kids. Maybe it was being asked to lunch by company leadership. Perhaps it even happened at church when you spent more time than usual with your new friend, the Pastor.

As humans we sometimes think our friends, acquaintances, or colleagues elevate our status. It is true that whom we surround ourselves with is important. Parents are correct when tell their children to hang out with the right crowd. Successful people do most times achieve success by surrounding themselves with other successful people. But the reality is that who we really are is mostly determined by our own actions, not the actions of others.

The trap for a Christian is the belief that it is enough to simply associate with Jesus Christ. James and John thought something similar in Mark's Gospel when they asked for seats of prominence next to Jesus in his coming Kingdom. But Jesus explained to them that essentially it is not who you associate with that makes all the difference, it is becoming like those with whom you associate. We are called to become Jesus in the world, to be a servant of all, just as he chose to do.

I bet it was great for the first disciples to hang with Jesus. But in the end, the goal was not for others to look at them and think they were so wonderful. The goal was for others to look at them and see not themselves, but only Jesus who always pointed to God.

A STATE OF THE STA

The Story Behind the song: "The Solid Rock"

"So ignorant was I that I did not know there was a God. My Sundays were spent on the streets (of London) in play." Those were the words of Edward Mote, who rose from an unruly childhood to become a great writer and minister. He composed only one song, but a great song it is, indeed. It has been a favorite of people around the world.

In his early adult years, Mote attended Tottenham Court Road Chapel where he heard sermons by the noted John Hyatt. He soon learned from Hyatt's sermons that Jesus Christ could take away all the fears of life and give him the peace of heart and mind that he had long desired.

He became a carpenter apprentice and through hard labor and conscientious efforts came to own his own cabinet shop. One day while walking to his work, he began thinking that he should write a hymn. Before he reached his shop he had the chorus:

"On Christ the solid rock I stand; All other ground is sinking sand."

Before the day ended, he had four stanzas. The following Sunday, he visited in the home of a friend, a minister, whose wife was at the point of death. During the afternoon, they read from the scriptures and prayed with her. As the preacher looked for a hymnal to sing from, as was his custom, he could find none. Mote reached into his pocket and pulled out his verses and asked if they might be sung to her. And so they were. She seemed to enjoy them very much. Mote was so pleased that she found comfort in his verses, he had 1,000 copies printed for distribution among his friends.

"My hope is built on nothing less
Than Jesus' blood and righteousness.
I dare not trust the sweetest frame,
But wholly lean on Jesus' name."
Chorus:
"On Christ the solid Rock, I stand;
All other ground is sinking sand,
All other ground is sinking sand."

Sometime later, Edward Mote became a Baptist preacher. His efforts made it possible for a house of worship to be built for his congregation. They were so grateful they offered to deed the property to him, but he replied, "I do not want the Chapel, I want only the pulpit; and when I cease to preach Christ, then turn me out of that."

He served this congregation for more than 20 years, never missing a single Sunday for any cause.

In his 77th year, as he lay on his bed of sickness, he replied, "I think I am going to heaven. Yes, I am nearing port. The truths I have preached I am now living upon, and they will do to die upon. Ah! The precious blood, which takes away all our sins. It is this,

which makes peace with God."

What a victorious ending of a useful life. He was reared in a godless home, learned an honorable trade and gave it all up to become a preacher. His memory will remain for generations because he took time one day to write a simple gospel song.

"Therefore whosoever heareth these sayings of mine, and doeth them, I will liken him unto a wise man, which built his house upon a rock."



MINUTES OF THE MAY 12, 2021 CONSISTORY MEETING

The regular meeting of St. Paul's UCC Consistory was called to order at 6:02 p.m. by President Marsha Landers. Pastor Rhonda opened the meeting with a review of our church covenant followed by prayer.

Present: Elders: Jane Nuss, Mary Holtzapple, Kevin Gehres, Joan Leffel and Marsha Landers; Trustees: Larry Kill, and Kyle Opperman; Deacons: Lynda Hadley, Melinda Silber, Susan Spencer, Kelly Kill, Jennifer Ginter, Carol and Lynn Schmidt, Linda McDonald, Becky Anderson, Jill Dickman and Jen Lucas. Also present were, Treasurer, David Dickman, Administrative Assistant Carolyn Garrison, Custodian Bob Schumacher and guest Jim Huckemeyer.

Christian Education and Nurture: Mary Holtzapple

- Christian Ed held a meeting on May 6th to discuss the upcoming Vacation Bible School, Senior Breakfast and volunteers for VBS.
- Sunday School children will be planting flowers around the church this coming Sunday.
- We have nine kids signed up to go to church camp this summer. The amount attending is down due to Covid.

Administrative Assistant, Carolyn Garrison, asked Consistory how much is the church going to pay toward the cost for each child? There is \$4,000 in the church budget and in the past, there have been various amounts given each child depending on the outcome of who won the mission they held earlier in the spring. Jill Dickman made a motion to pay \$250 toward each child attending church camp. Mary Holtzapple seconded. Motion carried.

Minutes:

Minutes from the March 10, 2021, meeting were reviewed.
 Carol Schmidt made a motion to approve the minutes. Jane Nuss seconded. Motion carried.

Financial Report: David Dickman

 David reviewed the Financial Report for the month of March 2021. There being no other questions, President Marsha asked to file the financial report for review by the church Administrative Assistant.

<u>President's Report:</u> No report <u>Pastor's Report:</u> Rhonda Hainer

- Pastor Rhonda picked up on some items that were "tabled" last month while she was away on vacation:
 - Request for two worship services in the summer. Rhonda explained that moving to two services given the post-pandemic experience is <u>not</u> an option for this church as with most churches, our attendance is lower than pre-pandemic. Splitting the attendance into two worship services will reduce the size even more and create the feelings of failure. It would be better to lose a few more at one service rather than to have two services.
 - Another item tabled last month was the church time for summer. Rhonda stated that she participated in a Continuing Education course sponsored by the UCC which fulfilled the boundary training that clergy have to complete yearly. This particular course was

led by Rev. Jim Keith of the Riverside Church in New York City with 150 Ohio clergy in attendance (via zoom). It was the position of the majority of the participants that churches should maintain the same worship schedule as they do the rest of the year for the following reasons. Continuity is important, change is difficult, and no one schedule is the same for everybody. It is better that we stay with the same time. If you choose to schedule worship at a different time. Rhonda stated that she would support Consistory's decision, as that is up to Consistory to decide.

- Another item, according to the CDC, it has been confirmed that there is a low risk of getting Covid by surface contact, so we have returned the hymnals to the pews given the CDC advice and given the fact that many in our congregation have been vaccinated, Rhonda recommended that we resume passing the offering plates and return to normal communion. Rhonda went on to say that she sees doing this as a reasonable action as it still safeguards the lives of people. Rhonda stated that because she does feel better to be cautious, given our commitment to the health of each other, she does recommend that we continue to social distance in the pews as we do already, maintain "The Wave," and wearing masks since that is the guidance of the CDC.
- In April Rhonda stated that she attended (via Zoom) the Heartland Conference Annual Meeting with Jim Huckemeyer, Kevin Gehres, as well as Jeanette Tangeman.
- The Grief Support Group that was held around the holidays will be resuming May 20th at 1 p.m.
- Rhonda stated that she has plans to start inviting small groups out to her home for cookouts with the hopes of

- trying to get to know more and more of the families that are not in attendance currently.
- Rhonda has been a part of the VBS planning and will be one of the Leaders.
- The church had one student confirmed and one baby baptized. Up and coming there is a family that would like to join the church as well as a baptism of their child. There are also two more baptisms scheduled.
- Rhonda shared information with the Consistory that the St. Marys Ministerium is planning a community worship at Summerfest to be held Sunday morning, August 15th. Last year prior to the festival being canceled, we declined the invite due to the lack of enforcement of wearing masks.
- Rhonda expressed some of the "dreams" that she has to include:
- -a hog roast and family activities for Rally Day in August.
- -a church outdoor "movie night" using the old screen and the vacant lot next to the church. --An evening gathering called "Seek and Soak" once a month where we have people come together and sing hymns and have prayer time, no sermon, but a time to seek God and soak in God.
- Rhonda said that she has a call into someone who does long range planning and would like to move forward with that as soon as she can get that person secured, and to find out what that may entail as we are to that point that we tabled last year because of Covid. Jen Lucas has stepped back from leading the Long-Range Committee due to her commitment to heading up the Personnel Committee. Rhonda went on to say that she believes that it would be a good move for us to have someone to come in and work with us to plan for the future, where we are going, who we are, and what we are about.


