Rhonda's Reflections



Dear St. Paul's Friends, Recently, I came upon a poem based on Exodus 33:12-23 – "God's Breadcrumbs," by Jennifer McLean.

The forest is dark and scary.

We are afraid! We don't know the way! What shall we do? How do we go on?

God: Think! Remember! I have told you the way! You are not my equal, so FOLLOW me!

Right foot goodness, Left foot grace; Right foot mercy, Left foot love.

One step at a time.

Keep your eyes on my back.

Never forget what I told you.

I am with you

Always.

I think this poem speaks to many of us! So many times we wonder: What shall I do? How do we go on? Well, goodness, grace, mercy, and love have been given abundantly to us. Just one step at a time. And if we keep our eyes on God's back and never forget what God has told us, we will make it through. This is so.

A small example: a farmer friend was frustrated because her little bull got out again. The farmer couldn't figure out how he got out, much less how to get him back in with the girls! But then she stopped and thought, "What can I do?" I realized God had given me a brain that was a bit smarter than that little bull and figured it out. This week, a much more important example: One of you was very sad over a variety of issues. We talked it through, and you realized one step at a time would make it possible to go forward – slowly, to be sure, but surely.

I think of those in Ukraine, hiding in bomb shelters, in hospitals being shelled, their loved ones fighting for freedom. And I pray, God, may my prayers make a difference in their lives, so they can go on, knowing that God is with them throughout the terror. I think of the families whose loved ones were murdered by mass shooting in Raleigh, North Carolina, and other places in our country. What shall we do in the face of such unspeakable horror? How do we go on? Our words and actions must work together to end our nation's epidemic of gun violence. May our love and God's grace be with the families who have lost their loved ones to this evil violence.

We remember God is with us no matter what, everywhere, always. We remember that the Good will always conquer the evil. The darkness is defeated by the Light every time.



The regular meeting of St. Paul's UCC Consistory was called to order at 6:00 p.m. by President Susan Braun. Pastor Rhonda opened the meeting by reading a poem entitled Autumn by Rainer Maria Rilke. Rhonda followed the poem with prayer.

Also, present were, Pastor Rhonda Hainer, Treasurer, David Dickman, and, Administrative Assistant Carolyn Garrison.

Minutes: Susan Braun

 Minutes from September 14, 2022, meeting were reviewed. Becky Anderson stated that the Organ Committee reported last month that they would be ready to make a presentation on All Saints Sunday. Becky reported that they will not be ready. Lori Now made a motion to approve the minutes. Jill Dickman seconded. Motion carried.

Financial Report: David Dickman

 David submitted for review of the Financial Report for the month of September 2022. There being no further discussion, President Susan asked to file the August financial report for review by the church Administrative Assistant.

- Rally Day was fun. The Sunday School Children sang songs they had learned at VBS. The Women's Guild sponsored a pizza luncheon and the Sr. High youth served ice cream sundaes.
- We celebrated the baptism of Truman Wale.
- Starting in October, once a month, we will feature an Endof-Life series which will take place in lieu of David's Adult Forum class. The series will run through January.
- This Sunday, Jeanette Tangeman will assist me in offering a Healing Service at 7 pm.
- The Fall Harvest Meal Craft and Bake Sale was held, and the dinner was delicious.
- Recently, I've met with the Sunday School children in The Gathering Room and shared with them the story about Jonah and the Big Fish.
- The past two Sundays, I resumed Children's Chat.
- Last Sunday, Third Grade Bibles were presented to three of the four third grade students.
- As a member of the Heartland Conference Church and Ministry Committee, I participated in two meetings as well as a luncheon for Retired UCC Clergy.
- Visited hospitals, homes and senior living centers.
- As we have returned to our normal worship schedule, there has been an uptick in Sunday worship attendance.

 Discussion included the pros and cons of getting yearly envelopes versus quarterly. Carolyn is to check in with the company tomorrow.


