Proverbs 18:1-21 NRSV/UE

- [1] The one who lives alone is self-indulgent, showing contempt for all sound judgment.
- [2] A fool takes no pleasure in understanding, but only in expressing personal opinion.
- [3] When wickedness comes, contempt comes also, and with dishonor comes disgrace.
- [4] The words of the mouth are deep waters; the fountain of wisdom is a gushing stream.
- [5] It is not right to be partial to the guilty or to subvert the innocent in judgement.
- [6] A fool's lips bring strife, and a fool's mouth invites a flogging.
- [7] The mouths of fools are their ruin, and their lips a snare to themselves.
- [8] The words of the whisperer are like delicious morsels; they go down into the inner parts of the body.
- [9] One who is slack in work is close kin to the vandal.
- [10] The name of the LORD is a strong tower; the righteous run into it and are safe.
- [11] The wealth of the rich is their strong city; in their imagination it is like a high wall.

- [14] The human spirit will endure sickness, but a broken spirit—who can bear?
- [15] An intelligent mind acquires knowledge and the ear of the wise seeks knowledge.

- [16] A gift opens doors; it gives access to the great.
- [17] The one who first states a case seems right, until the other comes and cross-examines.
- [18] Casting the lot puts an end to disputes and decides between powerful contenders.
- [19] An ally offended is stronger than a city; such quarreling is like the bars of a castle.
- [20] From the fruit of the mouth one's stomach is satisfied; the yield of the lips brings satisfaction.
- [21] Death and life are in the power of the tongue, and those who love it will eat its fruits.

Second Scripture Reading James 3 NRSV/UE

[1] Not many of you should become teachers, my brothers and sisters, for you know that we who teach will face stricter judgment.

[2] For all of us make many mistakes. Anyone who makes no mistakes in speaking is mature, able to keep the whole body in check with a bridle. [3] If we put bits into the mouths of horses to make them obey us, we guide their whole bodies. [4] Or look at ships: though they are so large and are driven by strong winds, yet they are guided by a very small rudder wherever the will of the pilot directs. [5] So also the tongue is a small member, yet it boasts of great exploits.

How great a forest is set ablaze by such a small fire! [6] And the tongue is a fire. The tongue is placed among our members as a world of iniquity; it stains the whole body, sets on fire the cycle of life, and is itself set on fire by hell. [7] For every species of beast and bird, of reptile and sea creature, can be tamed and has been tamed by the human species, [8] but no one can tame the tongue—a restless evil, full of deadly poison. [9] With it we bless the Lord and Father, and with it we curse people, made in the likeness of God. [10] From the same mouth comes a blessing and a curse. My brothers and sisters, this ought not to be so. [11] Does a spring pour forth from the same opening both fresh and brackish water? [12] Can a fig tree, my brothers and sisters, yield olives or a grapevine figs? No more can salt water yield fresh.

[13] Who is wise and knowledgeable among you? Show by your good life that your works are done with gentleness born of wisdom. [14] But if you have bitter envy and selfish ambition in your hearts, do not be arrogant and lie about the truth. [15] This is not wisdom that comes down from above but is earthly, unspiritual, devilish. [16] For where there is envy and selfish ambition, there will also be disorder and wickedness of every kind. [17] But the wisdom from above is first pure, then peaceable, gentle, willing to yield, full or mercy and good fruits, without a trace of partiality or

hypocrisy. [18] And the fruit of righteousness is sown in peace by those who make peace.
