ISRAEL TOUR IN JESUS' STEPS

(Optional Jordan, Egypt, Luxor extensions June 23-July 1, 2026)

Sun., June 14	Overnight flight to Tel Aviv, Israel.
Mon., June 15	Arrive in Tel Aviv. Transfer to hotel on the Mediterranean Sea, in view of Joppa. Upon arrival, rest or enjoy the beach. Buffet supper at 7:00. Evening worship and overnight in Tel Aviv on the Mediterranean Sea.
Tues., June 16	Breakfast buffet. Depart for Joppa, Caesarea, Megiddo, Nazareth, Cana, and the Sea of Galilee. Supper and overnight on the Sea of Galilee.
Wed., June 17	Visit to Magdala and boat ride on the Sea of Galilee. Lunch. Bus to Mount of Beatitudes, Tabgha, Capernaum, Bethsaida. Visit Jordan River baptismal site. Free time for resting and swimming at the Sea of Galilee. Supper, worship, and overnight at the Sea of Galilee.
Thurs., June 18	Depart Galilee. Bus Jericho and the Judean wilderness. Float at the Dead Sea. Supper and overnight at the Dead Sea.
Fri., June 19	Depart for Masada, Qumran, Good Samaritan Road, and the Old City of Jerusalem. Supper and evening walk to western wall to welcome Shabbat. Overnight in Jerusalem.
Sabbath, June 20	Worship and communion at the Garden Tomb. Lunch provided. Visit Mount of Olives, Garden of Gethsemane, Pool of Bethesda/St. Anne's Church, Via Dolorosa, Church of the Holy Sepulcher. Supper and worship. Nighttime outdoor "Light & Sound" celebration of Jerusalem at Citadel/Herod's Palace. Overnight in Old City of Jerusalem.
Sun., June 21	Old City sites: Temple Mount, Jerusalem Archaeological Park, Southern Steps. Lunch and visit to Bethlehem and Valley of Elah (David & Goliath). Supper, worship, and overnight in Old City of Jerusalem.
Mon., June 22	Old City sites: Citadel/Herod's Palace (site of Jesus' trial) and Upper Room. Lunch. City of David, Hezekiah's Tunnel, Pool of Siloam. Afternoon free time. Depart for Ben Gurion International Airport, arriving at 6:00 p.m. for overnight flights departing at 10:00 p.m. or later. (Travelers continuing to Jordan will stay in Jerusalem.)
Tues., June 23	Israel-only travelers arrive home.

OPTIONAL JORDAN EXTENSION: MOUNT NEBO-PETRA-WADI RUM

Mon., June 22	Supper and overnight in Old City of Jerusalem.
Tues, June 23	Depart for Jordan via Allenby Border Crossing. Visit Mount Nebo, Machaerus, and arrive at Petra. Overnight in Petra.
Wed., June 24	Morning visit to Petra. Lunch and afternoon departure for Wadi Rum (two-hour jeep tour). Overnight at luxury tented camp in Wadi Rum.
Thurs., June 25	Depart Wadi Rum for Amman (for those not going to Egypt). Arrive Amman airport by 5:00 p.m. for international flights. (Optional hotel overnight in Amman.)
Fri, June 26	Arrive home.

OPTIONAL EGYPT EXTENSION: MOUNT SINAI-CAIRO-PYRAMIDS/SPHINX

Thurs, June 25	Bus from Wadi Rum to Taba border/Egypt. Cross into Egypt; dinner and overnight at the Red Sea.
Friday, June 26	Relaxing morning at Red Sea (Gulf of Aqaba), with opportunity for world-class snorkeling. Lunch and afternoon departure for Mount Sinai. Supper, Friday night vespers, and overnight at the base of Mount Sinai.
Sabbath, June 27	Sunrise camel-climb of Mount Sinai. Descend for breakfast and visit to St. Catherine's monastery. Drive to Cairo. En route, stop by Rephidim, Elim, and Marah (Exodus route). Supper and overnight in Cairo.
Sunday, June 28	Visit the Nile River and Pyramids and Sphinx at Giza Plateau. Lunch. Visit the new Grand Egyptian Museum displaying ancient Egyptian treasures including that of Tutankhamun. Supper and overnight in Cairo.
Monday, June 29	Fly out. (Airport transfer provided.)

OPTIONAL LUXOR EXTENSION

Monday, June 29	Fly to fabulous Luxor to visit Valley of the Kings and Tombs of the Royals, Overnight in Luxor overlooking Nile River.
Tuesday, June 30	[Optional sunrise hot air balloon ride over Valley of the Kings, weather-permitting.] Breakfast and tour of Luxor/Karnak temples and Queen Hatshepsut Temple. Fly back to Cairo, arriving by 10:00 p.m. Optional overnight at airport hotel.
Wed., July 1	Fly home.

Israel Tour: \$2750/person (double occupancy); \$3390/single room; \$2600/third person in triple room. Tour includes: first-class hotels/resorts, ground transportation, sightseeing and admissions, gratuities, breakfast and supper daily, Sabbath lunch, post-departure trip insurance. (Not included: daily lunches and initial hotel transfer.)

Trip Insurance: Post-departure trip Insurance is included. The insurance covers post-departure emergencies, including hospitalization and lost luggage.

Optional Jordan Tour: \$1050/person (double occupancy); \$1300/single room; \$1000/third person. Includes: two nights in hotels and one night in Wadi Rum desert camp, transportation (including jeep tour in Wadi Rum and horseback ride in Petra), sightseeing and admissions, local guide, gratuities, two meals, Jordan entry visa, exit tax. (Not included: daily lunches.)

Optional Egypt Tour: \$1250/person (double occupancy); \$1550/sgl; \$1150/third person. Accommodations at Red Sea, Mount Sinai, and Cairo; entrance fees and sightseeing; transportation in AC Deluxe coach; all meals except initial lunch; gratuities; local guide; Taba border tax, Sinai tax, and entry visa.

Optional Extension to Luxor/Valley of the Kings (includes flight): \$825/person (double occupancy); \$1025 single; \$750/third person. Includes all admissions, meals, gratuities, overnight in Luxor on the Nile River, and roundtrip flight from Cairo-Luxor. (Optional airport hotel March 31 at \$250/dbl room or \$200/sgl room.)

International Flight (Israel-Only Tour). Est. \$1000-\$1500. Flight recommendations will be provided. If you would like assistance for a fee, you may call Butler Travel at 503-879-5005. You can book your departing flight from your home airport June 14 to Tel Aviv (arriving June 15, preferably mid-day). Our group will meet for supper on June 15 at 7:00 p.m. For the return flight from Israel, we will arrive at the airport June 22 at 5:00 p.m. for flights departing after 8:00 p.m. and later (most leave after midnight June 23). Travelers choosing to stay overnight June 22-23 can book the Sadot Airport Hotel online.

International Flight (Israel + Jordan): Est. \$1000-\$1500. If you're including the Jordan extension, you should book a multi-city itinerary as follows: June 14: Home to Tel Aviv; June 25/26: Amman to home. We'll return to the Amman airport by 5:00 p.m. on June 25 for flights departing after 8:00 p.m. If your flight doesn't depart until later the next day, an Amman hotel can be reserved for you for \$200/dbl room or \$150/sgl.

International Flight (Israel+Jordan+Egypt travelers). Est. \$1000-\$1500. If you're including the Egypt extension, you should book a multi-city itinerary as follows: June 14: Home to Tel Aviv; June 29/July 1: Cairo to home (depending on whether you're including the Luxor extension).

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

PASSPORTS. Your passport must be valid for at least six months after our return date. Please take a photo of your passport and email it to yourself as a back-up. (No visas to Israel are needed for citizens of the U.S. and many other western countries. Group visas are included for Jordan and Egypt.)

VACCINATIONS & Testing: None required.

CHECKED BAGGAGE. Most international carriers allow one free checked suitcase (up to 50 pounds).

PACKING TIPS: People typically overpack, not underpack. On most days in Israel you can wear pants, Capri pants, or modest skirts. On two of the days, you can wear modest shorts all day, along with most evenings. (No sleeveless shirts, please.) For our visit to the Temple Mount, you'll need long pants or a full-length skirt. Women must also wear long sleeves and avoid scooping neck lines. (A scarf is also a good idea.) For those continuing to Jordan and Egypt, you can wear modest shorts. Wear comfortable footwear all days, and bring your swimming suit for our Dead Sea float and other swimming opportunities. There are paid laundry services at the hotels. You may find it helpful to carry a small daypack containing a water bottle, sunscreen, tissue paper, hand sanitizer wipes, a Bible, pen and paper.

HAIRDRYERS, SOAP, AND SHAMPOO, AND SAFES are provided in our hotel rooms.

ELECTRONICS. Israel uses European-style outlets (round prongs), so you will need a round-prong adapter for electronics. (You can buy these for about \$15 at Best Buy.) Israel uses a 220-volt electric current, rather than 110 as used in the U.S. If your appliances are suitable for both 110 and 220 volts, you won't need to buy a transformer. Most laptops and phones work fine.

WATER: Tap water is safe to drink in Israel. Bottled mineral water is also readily available, and travelers are encouraged to drink a lot. (Tip: drink even before you're thirsty.)

WI-FI. Our hotels and bus have free WI-FI.

PHONE SERVICE. You can set up an international calling plan with your mobile phone provider ahead of time.

MONEY. American dollars and debit/credit cards are welcome most everywhere. You'll want to alert your debit/credit card bank ahead of time that you'll be traveling to Israel. ATMs are widely available, and dispense local currency (with a fee). Many travelers bring about \$200 in cash, as well as their debit/credit card. Lunches cost about \$15, and bottled water \$1. Your other primary expense will be any shopping you choose to do.

SHOPPING: Our main shopping opportunity will be in Jerusalem's Old City markets. Haggling on price is part of the culture, so enjoy the process.
