







Penitential Rite

Nicene Creed

To them that seek you, o how kind! But what are you to them that find?


No tongue of mortal can express, no letters write his blessedness, Alone who has you in his heart, knows love of Jesus! What you are.

Be our delight O Jesus now. As by and by our prize art thou And grant our glorying may be world without end alone in thee. Amen.




