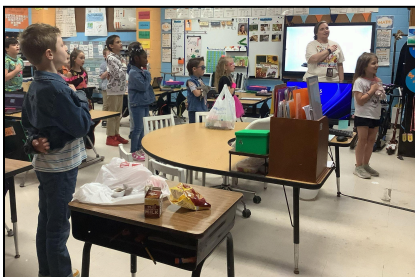
A day in the life - tiger edition

2nd grade doing Accelerated Reading

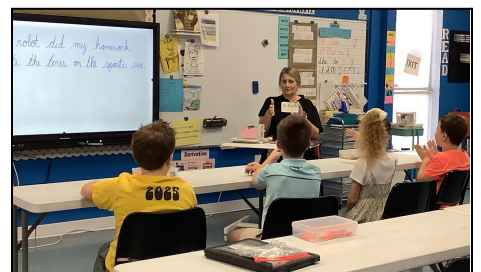

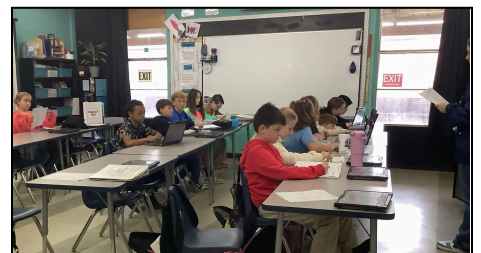
3rd graders going through the lunch line in the cafeteria to get pizza.

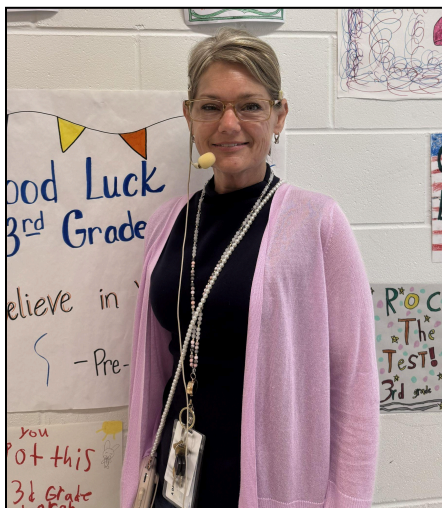
