President Pat Schmidt was not in attendance. Secretary Trustee Jim Milhaupt was her substitute leader for this meeting. Jim called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. Father Bob did the opening prayer.

MINUTES

Judy Hurlburt made a motion to approve the meeting minutes from the December 11, 2025 meeting. Jim Milhaupt seconded the motion. Motion carried.

ATTENDANCE

OPEN FORUM

Cheri Ver Voort brought up two errors found in the meeting minutes from the October 9, 2025, meeting. The council agreed to strike out the sentences/words that were typed in error or were misquoted. The first sentence is under the heading Property & Finance Update: “Bank statements are not accurate right now as bills are coming in, and some insurance money is also coming in.” The second error is under the heading Cemetery Update: “and adding speed bumps.”

FAITH FORMATION UPDATE

Maggie was not in attendance, but she left the council an update. Family Ministry, trunk or treat in October went really well! We had a few more trunk hosts than in the past. Live Nativity also had a great participation this year. Maggie mentioned how she was more aggressive (or annoying) in promoting volunteer sign up among faith formation families and it helped especially on Friday night. The attendance list for Sunday’s Children’s Liturgy shows a steady (if small) attendance at most 8:30 a.m. Masses. Therefore, Children’s Liturgy will continue (for now) at both 8:30 a.m. and 10:30 a.m. Mass. Faith Formation’s fall semester went well. She is grateful to the catechists who make it possible and to the parents who have prioritized faith formation in a busy world. She sends a thank you to the Knights of Columbus for providing their annual Christmas treats to the children, and special thanks to Adam Kurzynski and Rich Vander Zanden who helped hand out the bags on our last class before Christmas. Thanks to Willy and some Grandpa Patrol helpers who helped swap the Live Nativity storage room with the 3rd grade classroom. Advent Family Faith Night was a success on December 3. There was a round-robin with 4 different crafts/games/activities/prayer stations for families to do together with great attendance (26 families). The P3 (Pizza and Prayer with Parents) Nights have also been going well. We had one in November and December. The next one is January 14.

Maggie also wrote: Thanks so much to the Knights, Mary's Girls, and some generous parishioners who have provided the money to cover the cost of our once-a-month pizza nights. Giving families an opportunity to have a meal together that they don't have to cook/clean up or buy from a restaurant is a simple way to provide for the tangible human needs of busy parents/kids. Just as critical, the vibe of a busy parish hall full of happy parents and kids enjoying food and laughing and having fellowship is precisely the goal of P3. I'm also grateful to the several faith formation parents who have, unprompted, brought drinks or desserts to share to go with our pizzas. Some parents stay for part of Holy Hour once kids go to class, which is wonderful!

MARY'S GIRLS

Pat Schmidt was not in attendance but sent her update through email. Mary's Girls will be saying their monthly Rosary on January 13 at 2 p.m. in church. Their January monthly meeting will be at 2 p.m. on Sunday, January 25 in the Bona Room. Michelle Otto mentioned an update from last December's meeting: Mary's Girls purchased only 115 books as gifts for St. Paul parishioners and not 200. This was a good number to purchase as there are still some books available at each entrance. A special thank you goes out to Mary's Girls for the Christmas gift this year!
