Discussion

1. Who was someone you looked up to when you were younger, and what made their example meaningful to you?
2. What resonated with you from Sunday's worship?

Read 1 Timothy 4:12.

3. Why do you think Paul challenged Timothy not to let others look down on him because of his age?
4. Which of the five areas Paul mentions—speech, conduct, love, faith, or purity—stands out to you most? Why?

Read Matthew 19:4 and 18:6.

5. What does Jesus' attitude toward children and young people teach us about their value in the Kingdom of God?

Read 2 Peter 1:12.

6. Why is "remembering" important in the Christian life, especially across generations?
7. What does your speech, conduct, love, faith, and purity reveal about your spiritual maturity right now?
8. How can you encourage, mentor, or invest in someone younger in faith this week?
9. Where is God calling you to "live differently" so others can see Jesus through your example?

Next Steps

- **Love Jesus:** Pray for the graduates and their next steps.
- **Connect with Others:** Ask God to identify a youth within the church to connect with. And do it!
