Discussion

1. Can you think of an event or moment that completely changed the direction of your life? What made it so significant?

2. What resonated with you from Sunday's worship?

Read 1 Corinthians 15:1-20.

3. Paul says the death, burial, and resurrection of Jesus are "of first importance." Why do you think he begins his summary of the gospel here? What would be lost if the resurrection were removed from the Christian faith?

4. Paul reminds the Corinthians that the risen Jesus appeared to many eyewitnesses, including himself. How does the resurrection give confidence that our faith is rooted in a real event rather than simply an inspiring idea?

Read 1 Corinthians 15:50-58.

5. Paul looks ahead to the future resurrection and declares, "Death has been swallowed up in victory." How does the promise of resurrection shape the way Christians face suffering, loss, and even death?

6. Paul concludes by saying, "Always give yourselves fully to the work of the Lord, because you know that your labor in the Lord is not in vain." How does the resurrection give purpose to the ordinary ways we serve Christ each day?

7. Looking back over the Dear Corinth, Part 1 series, what is one truth that has most challenged or encouraged you? How is God inviting you to live differently because Jesus is alive?

For what I received I passed on to you as of first importance: that Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures, that he was buried, that he was raised on the third day according to the Scriptures, and that he appeared to Cephas, and then to the Twelve.
