### Important Dates for this Term

The Month of the Rosary (October)
In the Catholic Church this is a time dedicated to meditating on the life of Jesus Christ through the repetition of the Rosary prayer, which is rooted in

Scripture and honors Mary, the mother of Jesus.

All Saints (1st November)

We celebrate the lives of special and ordinary people who have responded to God's invitation to love.

The Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed (All Souls) (2<sup>nd</sup> November)

Advent (Begins 30th November)

Advent means 'coming'. We think of the coming of Jesus when he was born but we also think of his promise that he would come again at the end of time. It is a time of waiting and preparing. It is only in the last week of Advent that we focus upon the events to be celebrated at Christmas.

The Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary (8<sup>th</sup> December)

This feast marks the first stage of the existence of Mary, the mother of Jesus.

She was 'full of grace' from the very beginning and co-operated with God throughout her life.

When December 8 falls on a Sunday, the Immaculate Conception is transferred to Monday

Christmas Day, The Nativity of the Lord (25<sup>th</sup> December) On this day we begin our celebration of the birth of Christ.





### R.E. - To know You more clearly

The children in Early Years, Key Stage One and Lower KS2 are now following the model curriculum from the new Religious Education Directory- To know You more clearly. This term they will be studying two topics; 'Creation and Covenant' and 'Prophecy and Promise'. The children will hear scripture from the Bible, they will explore what it is Christians believe, they will celebrate Christian mystery and prayer, and they will look at the impact of faith on how Christians live.



# CREATION AND COVENANT (Autumn 1) Prayer and Liturgy at Home

<u>Gather</u> together as a family, light a candle and make the Sign of the Cross.

<u>Listen</u> to the scripture, 'Genesis 1:31'.

<u>Respond</u> to the Word, by praying the Our Father together to thank God for His wonderful creations.

As you <u>Go Forth</u>, remember to look for God's wonders all around you, no matter how big or small.

# PROPHECY AND PROMISE (Autumn 2) Prayer and Liturgy at Home

<u>Gather</u> together as a family, light a candle and make the Sign of the Cross.

<u>Listen</u> to the scripture, *Luke 2:4-7*.

Respond to the Word, praying together: Dear God, we ask for your blessing over our family during this holy season of Advent. Amen.

As you <u>Go Forth</u> during the Advent season of Advent, try each day to live out one kind deed, *demonstrating your faith*.

#### R.E. - Come and See

The children in Years' 5 and 6 will continue to follow the Come and See programme of work for R.E. This term they will be studying the three themes of Domestic Church (Family), Baptism and Confirmation (Belonging) and Advent and Christmas (Loving). Each class will approach the themes through different topics. The children will also spend a week studying Judaism.



#### DOMESTIC CHURCH - FAMILY

(w/c 3rd September 2025 - 10th October 2025)

Year 6- LOVING - God who never stops loving

Talk about/Make a collage using family photographs of all the significant family members— grandparents, parents, children, aunts, uncles etc. who show God's love. Write underneath it "We show God's love to one another."

Year 5- LIFE CHOICES - Marriage, commitment and service Year 6- VOCATION AND COMMITMENT- The vocation of priesthood and religious life

Talk to someone who has been to a Baptism and/or Confirmation about their memories of this celebration.

#### JUDAISM

(w/c 17th November 2025)

Pupils will study various aspects of Judaism for one/two weeks. Ask them what they have been learning about.
