## Come to Jesus this Christmas!

- It was originally written in Latin, by John Francis Wade.
- I. Come back and <u>see</u> the Christ of Christmas: Jesus Christ the Lord! (Vs. 1)
  - A. Get back to who Christmas is all about: Jesus Christ! (Vs. 1; Lk 2:8-17a)
  - B. Acall to get back to where it happened: Bethlehem! (Lk 2:15; Micah 5:2; Matt 2:1; Lk 2:4-7)
  - C. Christmas is a call to all! (Vs. 1a)
    - 1. Christmas is for all people! (Lk 2:10)
    - 2. Our song is calling the <u>faithful</u>: Christians who have been waiting faithfully for Jesus their Messiah to come!
- II. Come and worship the Christ of Christmas! (Vs. 2-3; chorus)
  - A Who is singing about Jesus at Christmas?
    - 1. The <u>angels</u> sang about Jesus and worshipped! (Lk 2:13-14)
    - 2. The shepherds sangabout Jesus! (vs. 20)
    - 3. We ought to sing about Jesus! (Vs. 3; chorus)

- B. Why are we to worship Jesus? (Vs. 2; &3 last line)
  - 1. Jesus is <u>God</u> and is to be worshipped as God!
  - 2. Jesus is the <u>Lord</u>: He has all power and authority! (vs. 4 & chorus)
- C. <u>How</u> are we to worship Jesus this Christmas (and every day?)
  - 1. Keep Jesus first! (Vs. 3, line 1-2)
  - 2. Be faithful to <u>come</u> and worship and serve at EBC!
  - 3. Be faithful to <u>invite</u> and bring others to Jesus and EBC this Christmas: 12/21 and 12/24!

## Christmas Carol Takeaways:

- 1. When we come back to the heart of Christmas we will be more joyful!
- 2. When we come back to the heart of Christmas we will be more <u>triumphant</u>: (1 Cor 15:57; 2 Cor 2:14)
