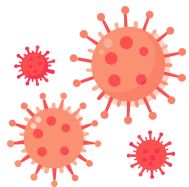


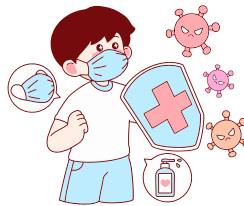
PUBLIC HEALTH EMERGENCY ACTIVATION GUIDE

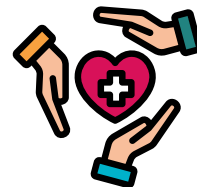

D. Activation Priorities

1. Protect staff and clients
2. Maintain critical services
3. Implement remote operations
4. Communicate health guidance
5. Coordinate with public health authorities

- Return-to-work planning
- Service restoration
- Mental health support
- Policy revisions
