Writing a Check

Step-by-Step Instructions

******USE ONLY BLUE OR BLACK INK******

1 Date the Check

Write the current date in the top right corner. You can use the format MM/DD/YYYY (06/29/2026) or spell out the month (June 29, 2026).

2 Payee Information

On the line that says, "Pay to the Order of" write the full name of the person or company you are paying. Ensure the spelling is correct to avoid issues with cashing the check (Trinity UMC).

3 Amount in Numbers

In the small box on the right, write the amount you are paying in numbers (\$100.00). Start writing close to the dollar sign to prevent alterations.

4 Amount in Words

On the line below the payee's name, write out the amount in words (One hundred dollars and 00/100). This helps ensure the check is processed correctly.

5 Memo

In the lower-left corner, you can write a note about the purpose of the check, such as an invoice number or what the payment is for (Building Fund). This is optional but can be helpful for your records.

6 Signature

Sign the check on the bottom right line. Use the same signature that is on file with your bank as the check is not valid without your signature.

UPDATE

We are all happy that spring has finally arrived. However, until we get some much needed rain, we will not add mulch, lawn plugging, seeding, and plantings. Unfortunately our irrigation/sprinkler system is not working well due to the low water table (dry well). This means any plantings must be watered by the use of the hoses which surround the buildings. As a reminder, if you plant it---you will have to water and weed it yourselves.

The heat and air bills have almost doubled due to the doors being left open for loading and unloading of groceries, supplies and charity-type events. We all are guilty of this issue, but we all need to help out to "reduce the use." Hopefully by the end of the year Trinity can get back on the small commercial billing rate.

With that being said, the Trustees have drafted and approved a new Building Usage Agreement which is comparable to local Myrtle Beach rental rates. This was done to try to manage and recover our utilities and building expenses.

Hopefully by the time you read this newsletter, the ceiling in Trinity Hall will be replaced which is a warranty replacement at zero cost to Trinity. We welcome the moving of the contemporary service to Trinity Hall in the hopes of growing our attendance and participation.
