O, the Love of God!

God loves us so much! Do we realize everything He has <u>freely given</u> to us? We do not have to do <u>nor</u> are expected to do anything to receive the things God has provided for us. Jesus already paid the price! For those of you that want to challenge that statement, the only thing that is necessary to receive from God is to ask forgiveness and live according to His Will. But, He will forgive us when we sin against Him and turn back with a repentant heart intent on serving Him.

Isaiah 50:4-9 (Quoted scriptures from The Message Bible) "The Master, God, has given me a well-taught tongue, So I know how to encourage tired people. He wakes me up in the morning, Wakes me up, opens my ears to listen as one ready to take orders. The Master, God, opened my ears, and I didn't go back to sleep, didn't pull the covers back over my head. I followed orders, stood there and took it while they beat me, held steady while they pulled out my beard. Didn't dodge their insults. faced them as they spit in my face. And the **Master**, God, stays right there and helps me, so I'm not Therefore I set my face like flint. confident that I'll never regret this. My champion is right here. Let's take our stand together! Who dares bring suit against me? Let him try! Look! The Master, God, is right here. Who would dare call me guilty? Look! My accusers are a clothes bin of threadbare socks and shirts, fodder for moths!"

Yes, Jesus was pierced for our rebellion, crushed for our sins, beaten so we could be whole. He was whipped so we could be healed. All of us, like sheep, have strayed away. We have left God's paths to follow our own. Yet, the Lord laid on Jesus the sins of us all.

Isaiah 53:2-8 - "The servant grew up before God—a scrawny seedling, a scrubby plant in a parched field. There was nothing attractive about him, nothing to cause us to take a second look. He was looked down on and passed over, a man who suffered, who knew pain firsthand. One look at him and people turned away. We looked down on him, thought he was scum. But the fact is, it was our pains he carried—our disfigurements, all the things wrong with us. We thought he brought it on himself, that God was punishing him for his own failures. But it was our sins that did that to him, that ripped and tore and crushed him—our sins! He took the punishment, and that made us whole. Through his bruises we get healed. We're all like sheep who've wandered off and gotten lost. We've all done our own thing, gone our own way. And God has piled all our sins, everything we've done wrong, on him, on him.

He was beaten, he was tortured, but he didn't say a word. Like a lamb taken to be slaughtered and like a sheep being sheared, he took it all in silence. Justice miscarried, and he was led off—and did anyone really know what was happening? He died without a thought for his own welfare, beaten bloody for the sins of my people. They buried him with the wicked, threw him in a grave with a rich man, Even though he'd never hurt a soul or said one word that wasn't true."

Our God sent His Son to save us, to help us, to redeem us! We left God, quit following Him so we could do what we wanted to do. We didn't want anyone telling us what to do. But 'when we came to ourselves' we found we were still lacking, still incomplete, still unfulfilled, and still searching. God saw our sins, but He didn't dwell on them. He looked past our failures and saw our need. He chose us a long, long time ago. In Isaiah 54:9-10 is recorded God response to our failures: "'This exile is just like"

the days of Noah for me: I promised then that the waters of Noah would never again flood the earth. I'm promising now no more anger, no more dressing you down. For even if the mountains walk away and the hills fall to pieces, My love won't walk away from you, my covenant commitment of peace won't fall apart.' The God who has compassion on you says so."

Oh, to be filled with the love of God that looks past sin and sees the need. To be given a well-taught tongue that would encourage the tired people around us. How blessed to wake up in the morning with ears to hear and an urgency to obey the Lord's instructions for the day. When the task we are given is not what we expected or desired, God is right there with us! God's love is so deep, such an all-consuming fire that cleanses us from our sin. He knows our heart, knows our thoughts, and doesn't get nervous by our misguided actions. What a wonderful God we serve! Oh, how marvelous is the Savior's love for **ME**.
