Canon 226 §2 Since they have given life to their children, parents have a most grave obligation and possess the right to educate them. Therefore, it is for Christian parents particularly to take care of the Christian education of their children according to the doctrine handed on by the Church.

This booklet is provided for you to aid in this task. The prayers are listed by grade level. Each child should know the prayers and Catholic teachings for their grade level and all grade levels prior to that. Please work with your children at home on these prayers, as our RE class times are limited.

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Prayers and Teachings of the Catholic Church

Catechesis is the act of handing on the Word of God intended to inform the faith community and candidates for initiation into the Church about the teachings of Christ, transmitted by the Apostles to the Church. It also involves the lifelong effort of forming people into witnesses to Christ and opening their hearts to the spiritual transformation given by the Holy Spirit.

<u>Please help us teach your children these age appropriate prayers and Church teachings.</u> They begin with Kindergarten and build each year. Your child should learn the prayers of their grade level and know all of the previous prayers and teachings.

KINDERGARTEN catechesis includes:

<u>Our Father</u> - Our Father, Who art in heaven, hallowed be Thy name. Thy kingdom come. Thy will be done on earth, as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread, and forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us, and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. Amen.

Introduce the <u>Hail Mary</u> - Hail Mary, full of grace, the Lord is with thee. Blessed art thou among women and blessed is the fruit of thy womb, Jesus. Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us sinners, now and at the hour of our death. Amen.

Introduce the <u>Glory Be (Doxology)</u> - Glory be to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit, as it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, world without end. Amen.

<u>Grace Before Meals</u> - Bless us, O Lord, and these Thy gifts, which we are about to receive from Thy bounty, through Christ our Lord. Amen.

<u>Spontaneous Prayer</u> - Pray when you hear an ambulance/police/fire siren. Pray for safe travels when you leave the house. Special intentions of family members/friends/neighbors who are ill or in need of prayer. Add your own.

<u>Morning Offering</u> - O Jesus, through the Immaculate Heart of Mary, I offer You my prayers, works, joys and sufferings of this day for all the intentions of Your Sacred Heart, in union with the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass throughout the world, for the salvation of souls, the reparation for sins, the reunion of all Christians, and in particular for the intentions of the Holy Father this month. Amen.

<u>Prayer to St. Michael the Archangel</u> - St. Michael the Archangel, defend us in battle, be our protection against the wickedness and snares of the Devil. May God rebuke him, we humbly pray. And do thou, O Prince of the Heavenly Host, by the Power of God, thrust into hell Satan and all evil spirits who wander the earth seeking the ruin of souls. Amen.

How to Pray the Rosary

- 2. On the first bead, say an Our Father.
- 3. Say one Hail Mary on each of the next three beads. Say the Glory Be.
- 4. Announce the Mystery, then say the Our Father.
- 5. While fingering the next ten beads (a decade), say ten Hail Marys and meditate on the Mystery. After finishing each decade, say the Glory Be. Some say the following prayer requested by the Blessed Virgin Mary at Fatima: "O my Jesus, forgive us our sins, save us from the fires of hell, lead all souls to Heaven, especially those who have most need of Your mercy." Continue for the remaining decades.

- 6. Prayer Concluding the Rosary: After saying the five decades, holding the medal, say the Hail, Holy Queen, followed by this dialogue and prayer:
 - V. Pray for us, O holy Mother of God.
 - R. That we may be made worthy of the promises of Christ.
 - V. Let us pray.
 - R. O God, Whose only-begotten Son, by His life, death and resurrection, has purchased for us the rewards of eternal life, grant, we beseech Thee, that meditating on these mysteries of the most holy Rosary of the Blessed Virgin Mary, we may imitate what they contain and obtain what they promise, through the same Christ our Lord. Amen.
