Pastor's Message

Dear brothers and sisters, at times people come frustrate that they can't advance in virtues or get rid of certain imperfection they are struggling with. They complained that their loved ones don't practice the faith, etc. My respond is do you pray for that? Do you pray with in-

While Jesus is talking about prayer he stressed the necessity of perseverance in our prayer. We must keep on asking for our temporal and spiritual needs. St. Paul tells us to "rejoice always, pray without ceasing" 1 Thes 5:16. St. Augustine says, that "prayer is the power of man..." and I think it is because Jesus promised that "Whatsoever ye shall ask the Father in my name, he will give it you...: Jn 16: 23. Also Jesus says, "And whatever you ask in my name, I will do, so that the Father may be glorified in the Son." Jn 14:13.

Prayer is divided into private prayer and public or liturgical prayer. Private prayer is divided into vocal prayer and mental prayer. Vocal prayer is that said in a standard form, such as the rosary. Vocal prayer, like all prayer, has four main purposes: adoration, thanksgiving, reparation, and petition. We know that we are to make prayers of petition because Christ Himself told us to ask God for

things when He taught us the Our Father. The public Prayer is the "Our Father" and the Liturgical Prayer, the Holy Mass and prayer that we are called to respond during mass.

Prayer is for our soul, what nourishment is for our body. If we don't eat we get weak. If we don't pray we are spiritually weak in our spiritual life and we cannot resist the temptation of the devil and the difficulties of our daily life. "Ask and you shall receive; seek and you will find; knock and it shall be opened to you" If Jesus says so, let us do so, ask, seek, and knock and He will act and remember, "Whatever you ask the Father in My name you shall receive".

sistence and perseverance? Both in the first reading, and in the gospel we have a great example of what it means to intercede for. The disciples asked our blessed Lord how to pray to God. Jesus gave them the most important prayer, known as "The Lord's Prayer". In this prayer, God is addressed as our Father.

Liturgy's Corner

Have you ever wonder about the silence in the liturgy? At time we forget what important is the silence in the liturgy. God speaks to us in the silence of our hearts. If we make silence within us we will be able to hear clearly and audible the voice of God and carrying it in our life. This is the passage of the scripture that tells us where to find God.

"The Lord said, "Go out and stand on the mountain in the presence of the Lord, for the Lord is about to pass by." Then a great and powerful wind tore the mountains apart and shattered the rocks before the Lord, but the Lord was not in the wind. After the wind there was an earthquake, but the Lord was not in the earthquake. After the earthquake came a fire, but the Lord was not in the fire. And after the fire came a gentle whisper. When Elijah heard it, he pulled his

cloak over his face and went out and stood at the mouth of the cave. Then a voice said to him, "What are you doing here, Elijah?" (1 King 19:11-13)

Number 45 of the *General Instruction of the Roman Missal* (Third and Emended Typical Edition, 2008) prescribes:



Sacred silence also, as part of the celebration, is to be observed at the designated times. Its purpose, however, depends on the time it occurs in each part of the celebration. Thus within

the Act of Penitence and again after the invitation to pray, all recollect themselves; but at the conclusion of a reading or the homily, all meditate briefly on what they have heard; then after Communion, they praise and pray to God in

their hearts. Even before the celebration itself, it is commendable that silence be observed in the church, in the sacristy, in the vesting room, and in adjacent areas, so that all may dispose themselves to carry out the sacred action in a devout and fitting manner.

Paragraph 30 of the Liturgy Constitution, *Sacrosanctum Concilium*, likewise prescribes: "And at the proper times all should observe a reverent silence."

Number 56 of the General Instruction specifies better the importance of silence within the Liturgy of the Word, while number 78 makes the same clear for the Liturgy of the Eucharist: "The Eucharistic Prayer demands that all listen to it with reverence and in silence." Number 84 then underscores the importance of the observance of silence as a means of good preparation for the reception of Holy Communion: "The priest prepares himself by a prayer, said quietly, that he may fruitfully receive Christ's Body and Blood. The faithful do the same, praying silently."

It also fosters profound respect for one's spouse, which is necessary for... authentic intimacy. (*Marriage: Love and Life in the Divine Plan*, U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops, 2009, p. 20)

Mensaje del P. Mariano

Queridos hermanos y hermanas, a veces las personas se frustran porque no pueden avanzar en las virtudes o deshacerse de ciertas imperfecciones con las que luchan. Se quejan de que sus seres queridos no practican la fe, etc. Mi respuesta es: ¿oras por eso? ¿Oras con insistencia y perseverancia? Tanto en la primera lectura como en el Evangelio tenemos un gran ejemplo de lo que significa interceder. Los discípulos le preguntaron a nuestro bendito Señor cómo orar a Dios. Jesús les dio la oración más importante, conocida como "El Padre Nuestro". En esta oración, se dirige a Dios como nuestro Padre. Mientras Jesús hablaba de la oración, enfatizó la necesidad de perseverar en nuestra oración. Debemos seguir pidiendo por nuestras necesidades temporales y espirituales. San Pablo nos dice: "Estén siempre alegres, oren sin cesar" (1 Tes 5:16). Dice San Agustín, que "la oración es el poder del hombre..." y creo que es porque Jesús prometió que "Todo lo que pidáis al Padre en mi nombre, os lo dará...": Jn 16, 23. También Jesús dice, "Y todo lo que pidáis en mi nombre, yo lo haré, para que el Padre sea glorificado en el Hijo." Jn 14:13.

La oración se divide en oración privada y oración pública o litúrgica. La oración privada se divide en oración vocal y oración mental. La oración vocal es la que se reza de forma estándar, como el rosario. La oración vocal, como toda oración, tiene cuatro propósitos principales: adoración, acción de gracias, reparación y petición. Sabemos que debemos hacer oraciones de petición porque Cristo mismo nos dijo que pidiéramos a Dios cuando nos enseñó el Padrenuestro. La oración pública es el Padrenuestro y la oración litúrgica, la Santa Misa y la oración que estamos llamados a responder durante la misa.

La oración es para nuestra alma, lo que el alimento es para nuestro cuerpo. Si no comemos, nos debilitamos. Si no oramos, somos espiritualmente débiles en nuestra vida espiritual y no podemos resistir la tentación del diablo ni las dificultades de nuestra vida diaria. «Pedid y se os dará; buscad y hallaréis; Llamad, y se os abrirá» Si Jesús así lo dice, hagámoslo nosotros, pidamos, busquemos, llamemos y Él actuará y recordará: "Todo lo que pidáis al Padre en mi nombre, lo recibiréis".
