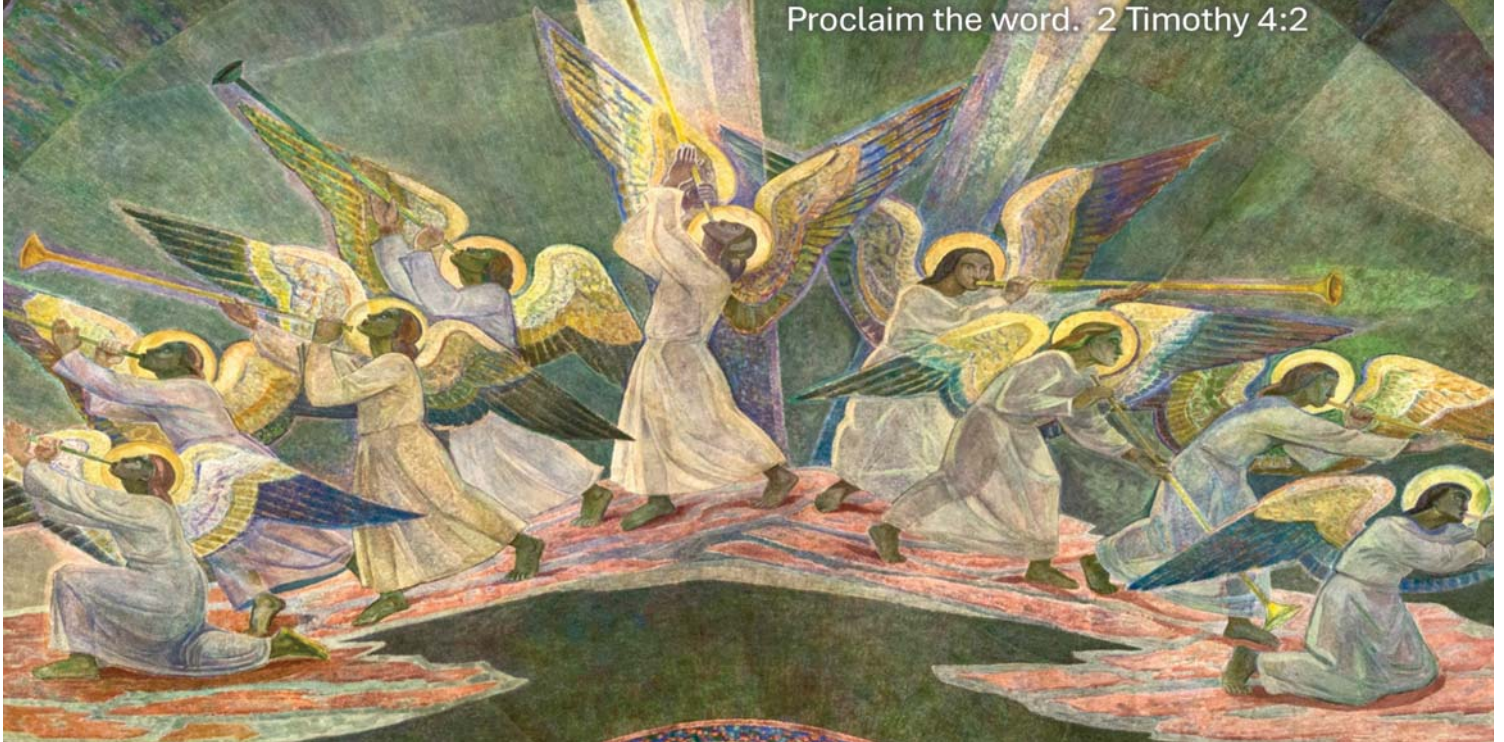

From the Choir Loft: *Lifting Our Eyes to the Lord*

THE TWENTY-NINTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME confronts us with a compelling question: when the Son of Man comes, will he find faith on earth? Our readings aren't about casual belief—they're about the exhausting, steady work of faithfulness. Moses holding up his hands until sunset. The widow who refuses to give up. Saint Paul's charge to "be persistent whether it is convenient or inconvenient." This is faith as endurance, prayer as spiritual combat.

Our entrance hymn, *For the Beauty of the Earth*, begins not with ourselves but with creation's testimony to God. The fifth stanza captures the heart of the Mass: "For your Church, that evermore lifts her holy hands above, offering up on every shore her pure sacrifice of love." Like Moses on the mountain, the Church raises her hands in perpetual intercession—and we join that offering today.

The offertory hymn, *Abide with Me*, answer's the responsorial psalm's question—"whence shall help come to me?"—directly: "Help of the helpless, O abide with me!" This isn't sentimental piety—it's the widow's cry, the exhausted intercessor asking for strength to continue. Here we bring our weariness and our desperate need for God's abiding presence—just as Aaron and Hur supported Moses' tired arms.

All Hail the Pow'r of Jesus' Name sends us out with the answer to Christ's haunting question. Yes, Lord, you will find faith on earth—faith that crowns you Lord of all, faith that joins "the everlasting song." The hymn's triumphant melody isn't cheap celebration; it's the sound of Joshua's victory, the vindication God promises his chosen ones "who call out to him day and night."

This Sunday, let your singing be your answer to Christ's question. Lift these hymns up like Moses' staff, persist in them like the widow's plea, and let them be the steady hands that support your brothers and sisters in the fight.

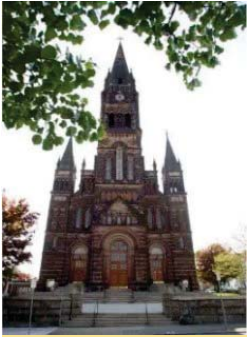

San Juan Pablo II

Cuando falleció este popular papa, las multitudes en la Plaza de San Pedro coreaban "santo subito" ("santo ya"). El Vaticano escuchó y la causa de santidad para el pontífice viajero que ayudó a derrotar al comunismo europeo fue acelerada rápidamente, siendo beatificado en el 2001 y Juan Pablo II, gran admirador de santa Faustina y de su devoción a la Divina Misericordia, fue canonizado por el papa Francisco en el 2014 en el Domingo de la Divina Misericordia. Este polaco y otrora actor, cardenal Karol Wojtyła de Cracovia (Juan Pablo II), moldeado por la Segunda Guerra Mundial y por la Guerra Fría, fue el primer papa no-italiano en 455 años. En sus 26 años de pontificado, el evangelizó en los 129 países que visitó, defendió la doctrina tradicional de la Iglesia contra la diáspora, se conectó con los jóvenes del mundo, estableció la Jornada Mundial de la Juventud y nombró a más de 450 nuevos santos. También fue modelo ejemplar de los valores cristianos perdonando al que intentó asesinarlo y viviendo públicamente una vez cada vez más frágil.

En el año 2000, Juan Pablo II estableció para la Iglesia que el Domingo de la Divina Misericordia se observe en el segundo domingo de Pascua aunque, en Polonia, esa fiesta ya se celebraba desde muchos años atrás. En este primer Domingo de la Divina Misericordia, Juan Pablo II dijo que el amor y la misericordia de Jesús es lo que debía inspirar a toda la humanidad:

“ En este amor debe inspirarse la humanidad hoy para afrontar la crisis de sentido, los desafíos de las necesidades más diversas y, sobre todo, la exigencia de salvaguardar la dignidad de toda persona humana. Así, el mensaje de la misericordia divina es, implícitamente, también un mensaje sobre el valor de todo hombre. Toda persona es valiosa a los ojos de Dios, Cristo dio su vida por cada uno, y a todos el Padre conoce su Espiritu y ofrece el acceso a su intimidad. ”
