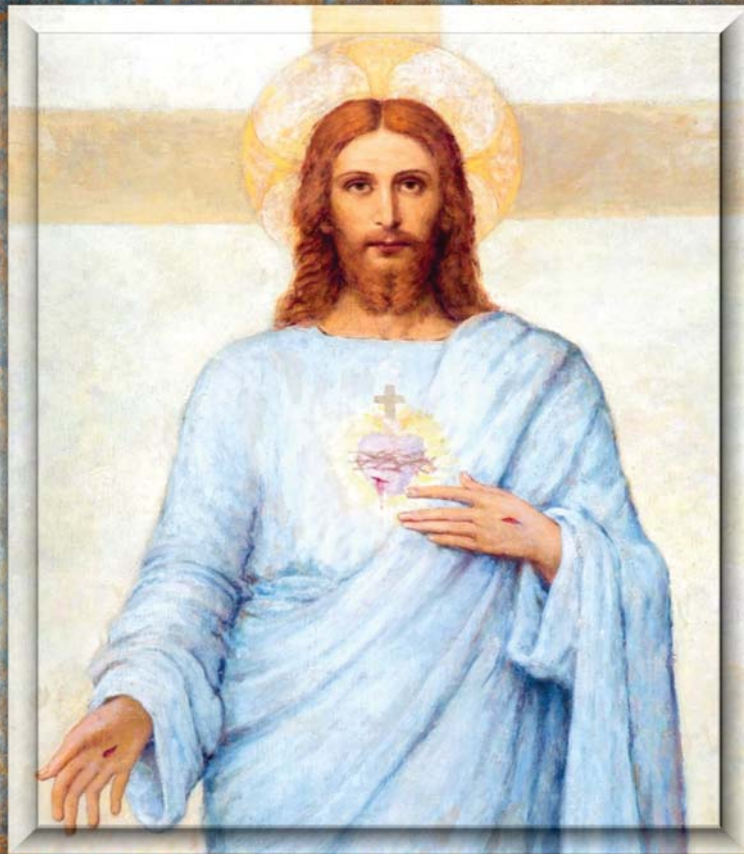

## Pastor Message

Dear friends this Sunday's liturgy offers us a profound glimpse into the promises and challenges that await those who choose to remain faithful to Jesus. The words of Jesus remind us that, while we are called to live in this world, we are not defined by it. Our true citizenship is in heaven, and our actions and



beliefs often set us apart from the standards and values of the world around us.

As followers of Christ, we are forewarned that persecution may come our way. The Gospel does not shy away from the reality that Catholics, and indeed all Christians, may face opposition, misunderstanding, and

even hostility for their faith. These challenges are not signs of defeat, but rather opportunities for us to witness to the truth and love of Christ with courage and hope.

Jesus also speaks of natural disasters and tribulations that will take place. These events, though frightening, are part of the unfolding story of salvation. They serve as reminders of our dependence on God and the need to place our trust in His providence. Rather than causing despair, such signs should inspire us to deepen our faith and remain steadfast in our commitment to living out the Gospel.

In light of these teachings, we are called to be prepared—not with fear, but with faith and good actions. Our readiness is shown in our daily choices to love, to serve, and to act justly. The trials and uncertainties of life become opportunities for us to grow in virtue and to be living witnesses of Christ's love in the world.

I would also like to extend a heartfelt thank

you to everyone who has shown generosity in supporting our annual Bazaar. Your participation and contributions help strengthen the bonds of our parish community and enable us to continue our mission of service and outreach.

Additionally, thank you for your support of the *Grand Annual Parish Appeal*. Your commitment and generosity ensure that our parish can continue to be a place of worship, fellowship, and spiritual growth for all. May God bless you and your families abundantly for your faithfulness and generosity. Let us continue to support one another and to be signs of God's presence in the world.

## From the Choir Loft

### From the Choir Loft: 33<sup>rd</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time

*To be near God is my happiness, to place my hope in God the Lord..*" (Psalm 73:28)

As we approach the end of the liturgical year, the Church directs our gaze toward the Lord's coming—both in judgment and in glory. This weekend's readings challenge us to live with vigilance and faithful perseverance, knowing that Christ will return to "rule the earth with justice." Our processional hymn, *At the Name of Jesus*, proclaims the kingship of Christ with majestic confidence. The closing verse foreshadows the promise of today's Gospel reading perfectly: "Brothers, this Lord Jesus shall return again, with his Father's glory, with his angel train." While Jesus warns of tribulations, persecutions, and the destruction of the temple, He assures His disciples that "by your perseverance you will secure your lives." The hymn calls us to "crown Him as your Captain in temptation's hour" and to "let His will unfold you in its light and power"—exactly the steadfastness Christ asks of us in the face of trial.

At the Offertory, *Jesu, Joy of Man's Desiring* offers a moment of contemplative beauty amid the urgency of the readings. The second verse speaks of those who follow "through the way where hope is guiding," drinking "of joy from deathless springs." This mirrors Saint Paul's instructions in the second reading about working quietly and faithfully, avoiding disorder and *idle busyness*. We are called to trust that Christ "dost ever lead thine own in the love of joys unknown," even when the path is difficult.

The Communion Antiphon from Psalm 73 captures the heart of faithful perseverance: "To be near God is my happiness, to place my hope in God the Lord." In times of trial and persecution, our anchor is not in earthly security but in God's presence. Like the psalmist who confesses, "My body and my heart waste away; God is the strength of my heart," we find our courage not in ourselves but in the One who promises that "not a hair on your head will be destroyed."

Lastly, I would like to draw your attention to the text of our recessional hymn, *The Advent of Our King*, which bridges us into the coming season while echoing today's themes. "As Judge, on clouds of light, He soon will come again," the hymn proclaims, calling us to prepare: "Before that dreadful day let sin's dark deeds be gone." Malachi's prophecy of the blazing day of judgment finds its answer in our preparation—not in fear, but in joyful readiness for the "sun of justice with its healing rays" to arise for those who fear the Lord's name. May our perseverance secure our lives as we await His glorious return.

### Saint Cecilia

THIRD CENTURY  
FEAST DAY — NOVEMBER 22

Cecilia has been honored as a martyr since about 545. According to a written legend, The Passion of Saint Cecilia, she was a Roman Christian of the patrician class betrothed to the pagan Valerian. The Cecilia Passion has her singing to God in her heart on her wedding day. Cecilia tells Valerian she has made a vow of virginity and persuades him to convert to Christianity and enter into a celibate marriage. His brother, Tiburtius, also becomes a Christian. The brothers are later martyred. When Cecilia refuses to perform an idolatrous act, she too is martyred. Cecilia is the patron of musicians.

The 33 Days to Eucharistic Glory begins on November 26 and consecration date is December 28, feast day of the Most Holy Family.

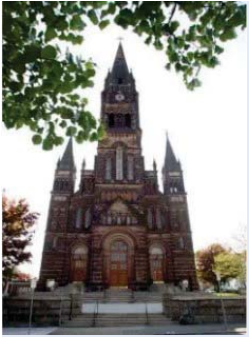
