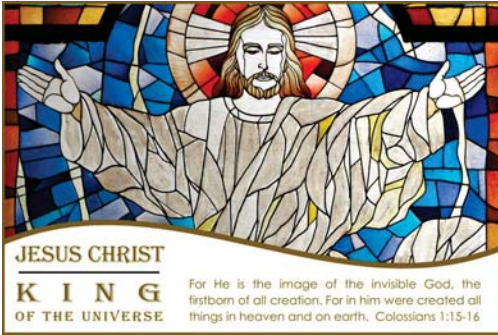

As we celebrate the Solemnity of Christ the King this weekend, we are reminded of the profound truth that Jesus is not only the Lord of our hearts, but also the sovereign ruler of all creation. This feast invites us to reflect deeply on what it truly means for Christ to reign—not just in our personal lives, but



throughout our entire society. In a world often marked by division, injustice, and uncertainty, the kingship of Jesus calls us to permeate every aspect of our communities with the life-giving values of the Gospel.

The message of Christ the King is radical and countercultural. Jesus reigns not

through earthly power or authority, but through humility, service, and sacrificial love. He stands as the ultimate example of mercy, justice, and compassion. If we truly believe that Jesus is our King, then we are called to make Him known in the public square, in the workplace, in our families, and in every social encounter. Christ's values—truth, peace, forgiveness, and charity—are meant to shape our laws, policies, and daily interactions. We must ask ourselves: does Jesus reign in our society, or have we allowed other voices to dominate? Our answer begins with our willingness to be transformed by the Gospel and to become agents of His kingdom in the world.

As we approach Thanksgiving Day, I am especially grateful for your generosity and the spirit of kindness that you have shown in the different projects we launched in the church, most especially with our *Grant annual parish appeal*. Your actions reflect the love of Christ and help to bring His kingdom nearer to those in need. It is through such acts of selfless giving that the Gospel becomes alive

and visible. Let us continue to work together to infuse our society with the values of Christ, so that His reign may be recognized in every heart and every home.

May this season of thanksgiving and the celebration of Christ's kingship inspire us to live with renewed commitment to His mission. Let us strive, day by day, to let Jesus reign in our society—through our words, our deeds, and our unwavering hope. Thank you for being a living witness to Christ's love.

From the Choir Loft

From the Choir Loft: Solemnity of Christ the King

"The Lord sits as King forever. The Lord will bless His people with peace." Psalm 29 (28)

This weekend we celebrate the kingship of Christ, but not the kingship the world expects. While earthly kings demand tribute and display their power through force, our King reigns from a cross, crowned with thorns, offering mercy to a dying thief. This is the great paradox we proclaim: the King of the Universe reveals His glory precisely in His humiliation.

Our opening hymn, "Crown Him with Many Crowns," captures this mystery beautifully. We crown Christ as "the Lamb upon His throne"—not the lion, but the Lamb who was slain. The second verse draws our eyes to the wounds that remain even in glory: "Behold His hands and side,—rich wounds, yet visible above, in beauty glorified." These are the marks of a King who saved others not by coming down from the cross, as the rulers sneered, but by remaining on it. When the good thief asks, "Jesus, remember me when You come into Your kingdom," he recognizes what the rulers cannot: true kingship is revealed in self-giving love.

At the Offertory, "Glory Be to Jesus" leads us to adore the Blood poured out on Calvary. The hymn proclaims that "grace and life eternal in that blood I find"—the very grace that opened Paradise to the repentant thief. Saint Paul tells us in the second reading that through Christ's blood "we have redemption, he forgiveness of sins," and that God has made "peace by the blood of His cross." While Abel's blood cried out for vengeance, "the blood of Jesus for our pardon cries." This is the power of our King: not to destroy His enemies, but to transform them into citizens of His kingdom.

The Communion Chant from Psalm 29 proclaims the majesty we might have expected all along: "The Lord sits as King for ever. The Lord will bless His people with peace." Here we see the full reality of Christ's kingship—He who chose to remain on the cross in obedience to the Father now reigns in glory, and "in Him all things hold together," as Paul writes. The God whose voice "shatters cedars" and "thunders upon the waters" is the same God who whispered to a thief, "Today you will be with Me in Paradise."

Our recessional hymn, "Rejoice, the Lord Is King," sends us forth with confident joy. "His kingdom cannot fail, He rules o'er earth and heav'n"—this is the King who holds "the keys of death and hell." As we close this liturgical year and prepare to begin Advent, we look forward to the day when our "Lord the Judge shall come, and take His servants up to their eternal home." Until then, we live as citizens of His kingdom, knowing that our King has already won the victory through His sacrifice on the cross.

The 33 Days to Eucharistic Glory begins on November 26 and consecration date is December 28, feast day of the Most Holy Family.

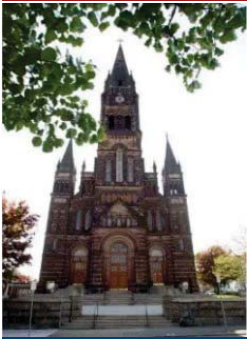
