Pastor Message

The Feast of the Baptism of the Lord is a profound moment in the liturgical calendar, marking the end of the Christmas season and inviting us to contemplate the significance of Jesus's baptism in the Jordan River. This event, described in the Gospels, was not only a public revelation of Jesus as the beloved Son of

God, but also a powerful affirmation of God's presence among us. Jesus was baptized not for His own sake, but for ours. Christ did not need the cleansing of sins, but by receiving baptism, He sanctified the waters for all future baptisms and set an example of humility and obedience. Jesus' baptism also marked the

beginning of His public ministry and served as a manifestation of the Holy Trinity: the Father's voice was heard, the Son was baptized, and the Holy Spirit descended like a dove. For Christians, the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord serves as a powerful reminder of our own baptism. It is a time to remember that in baptism, we are welcomed into the family of God, cleansed of original sin, and called to live as disciples of Christ. Baptism is not a one-time event, but a lifelong gift and responsibility. It marks the beginning of our spiritual journey, and each day we are invited to renew our commitment to the faith, striving to live out the grace we have received.

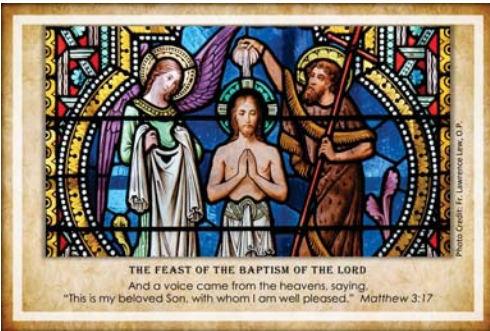

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THE BAPTISM OF THE LORD

The origin and foundation of Christian Baptism is Jesus. Before starting his public ministry, Jesus submitted himself to the baptism given by John the Baptist. The waters did not purify him; he cleansed the waters. "He comes to sanctify the Jordan for our sake . . . to begin a new creation through the Spirit and water" (St. Gregory Nazianzen, *Liturgy of the Hours*, I, 634). Jesus' immersion in the water is a sign for all human beings of the need to

die to themselves to do God's will. Jesus did not need to be baptized because he was totally faithful to the will of his Father and free from sin. However, he wanted to show his solidarity with human beings in order to reconcile them to the Father. By commanding his disciples to baptize all nations, he established the means by which people would die to sin—Original and actual—and begin to live a new life with God.

Santa Margarita Bourgeoys

Margarita creció en Troyes, Francia, formando una relación especial con Nuestra Señora. Ella fue rechazada por dos comunidades religiosas pero luego, cuando regresó a Francia para visitar a su hermana, conoció al fundador de Montreal, Canadá. Él la invitó a abrir una escuela en el Nuevo Mundo; a pesar de sus dudas, y luego de rezarle a María, ella aceptó. Desde aquella primera escuela en un establo abandonado, su ministerio creció incluyendo la enseñanza de artesanía a mujeres y fundando las Hermanas de la Congregación de Notre Dame. A pesar de la oposición del obispo, ella logró mantener a las religiosas sin tener que estar encaustradas y, por muchos años, prestó servicios como superiora. En 1982, cuando el papa Juan Pablo II la canonizó, ella se convirtió en la primera mujer santa de Canadá.

Del Padre Mariano

La fiesta del Bautismo de Jesús, que celebramos cada año al concluir el tiempo de Navidad, es una ocasión profunda para renovar nuestra fe y recordar el sentido trascendente de nuestro propio bautismo. Este acontecimiento, narrado en los Evangelios, marca el inicio de la vida pública de Jesús y revela la identidad de Cristo como Hijo amado del Padre, sobre quien desciende el Espíritu Santo en forma de paloma.



Santo Tomás de Aquino, uno de los grandes pensadores y santos de la Iglesia, profundizó en el misterio del bautismo de Jesús en su obra "Suma Teológica". Él enseña que, aunque Jesús era impecable y no necesitaba ser purificado de pecado alguno, quiso recibir el bautismo para darnos un ejemplo de humildad y obediencia, y para santificar las aguas, de modo que por medio del agua bautismal todos pudiéramos recibir la gracia divina. Según Santo Tomás, el bautismo de Cristo es el modelo y la causa eficiente de nuestro propio bautismo: en Él, el agua se convierte en instrumento de salvación y puerta para la vida nueva en Dios.

Para nosotros, los cristianos, vivir nuestro bautismo significa mucho más que un simple recuerdo de un rito pasado. Implica renovar cada día nuestra identidad como hijos de Dios, hermanos en Cristo y templos del Espíritu Santo. Ser bautizados es ser llamados a la santidad, a la conversión continua y a la misión. Nuestra vida debe reflejar la luz de Cristo, como Él mismo fue proclamado "luz de las naciones" en el momento de su bautismo.

Podemos vivir nuestro bautismo a través de pequeños y grandes gestos: amando a nuestros prójimos, participando activamente en la comunidad cristiana, orando y recibiendo los sacramentos, especialmente la Eucaristía y la Reconciliación. Además, estamos invitados a ser testigos de la fe en el mundo, a ser artesanos de paz, justicia y fraternidad, sin temor a dar razón de nuestra esperanza.

Que la celebración del Bautismo de Jesús nos ayude a redescubrir la belleza de nuestra vida bautismal, a vivir con alegría nuestra condición de hijos amados por Dios y a renovar nuestro compromiso de seguidores de Cristo, siendo siempre luz y sal en medio del mundo.
