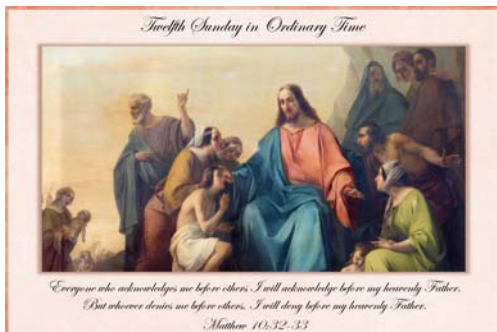
Pastor Message

Dear parish family, the readings for this Twelfth Sunday in Ordinary Time speak powerfully to the reality of being a believer in a world that often misunderstands, dismisses, or even opposes faith. Many Christians today, including Catholics, experience moments when living and expressing their faith seems inconvenient or unpopular. In such

circumstances, the Word of God offers both encouragement and strength.

will stumble so they can accuse him and take revenge. Jeremiah knows the loneliness and fear that come from standing firmly for God's truth. Yet he does not give in to despair. Instead, he places his trust in the Lord, confident that God is with him as a mighty champion. In the end, Jeremiah praises God, who rescues him from the hands of those who seek to harm him.

avoid criticism or conflict. However, Jesus calls us to bear witness to Him with confidence, not through aggression or judgment, but through lives marked by faith, hope, charity, integrity, and compassion.



The Gospel echoes this same message of courage and trust. Jesus tells His apostles, and each one of us, "Fear not." He knows that following Him will not always be easy. The disciples would face rejection, persecution, and misunderstanding. Yet Jesus assures them that they are precious in the eyes of God. If the Father knows even the number of hairs on their heads, they have no reason to be afraid. God's loving care accompanies them in every trial.

The Lord does not promise a life free from difficulties, but He does promise His presence. Like Jeremiah, we may face opposition; like the apostles, we may encounter challenges. Yet we are never alone. Christ continues to say to us: "Fear not." May we find courage in His words and boldly witness to our faith, trusting that God will sustain and guide us in every circumstance.

"Fear not; you are worth more than many sparrows." (Matthew 10:31).

In the First Reading, the prophet Jeremiah shares his painful experience of rejection and hostility. He hears the whispering of his enemies all around him: "Terror on every side!" They watch his every move, hoping he

This message remains relevant today. We live in a society where faith is often pushed to the margins and where Christian values may be questioned or ridiculed. It can be tempting to remain silent about our beliefs to

Why do we have votive candles in our parish?

Votive candles are a beautiful expression of prayer and faith. When we light a candle before a saint, the light symbolizes our faith and our trust in the saint's intercession before God. The flame also represents the particular intention we are bringing in prayer—whether for the repose of a soul, the healing of someone who is sick, a difficult situation, the return of a loved

one to the faith, or any other personal need.

The burning candle is a visible reminder of our prayer and our hope in God's loving care. Even after we leave the church, the flame continues to symbolize our intention being offered to God. And if the candle should go out, we can be confident that God has already heard our prayer; His attention to our needs does not depend on the flame itself.

I encourage everyone to make use of the votive candles available in our church. They are a simple yet meaningful way to entrust our intentions to God and to unite ourselves more deeply to prayer.

As we gather for Mass and other sacred celebrations, we are reminded that the way we dress reflects our respect for the occasion and for those we are meeting. In many places, there is an expected protocol of dress when attending important events or meeting distinguished persons. How much more should we be mindful when we come into the presence of God?

When we enter the church, we come to worship the Lord, offer Him our prayers and sacrifices, and encounter Him in the Holy Eucharist. Our attire should reflect the sacredness of this encounter. Dressing modestly, respectfully, and appropriately is not about fashion or judging others; it is a way of expressing reverence for God and respect for the holiness of His house.

Sacred Scripture reminds us that our bodies are temples of the Holy Spirit. Therefore, the way we present ourselves should reflect the dignity that God has given us and our awareness that we are entering a sacred space.

We warmly encourage everyone—children, youth, and adults—to choose clothing that is fitting for Mass and religious events. By doing so, we help foster an atmosphere of prayer, reverence, and devotion for ourselves and for those around us.

Thank you for helping to preserve the sense of the sacred in our parish and for your commitment to honoring the Lord in all that we do. May God bless you and your families. Fr. Mariano Varela, IVE

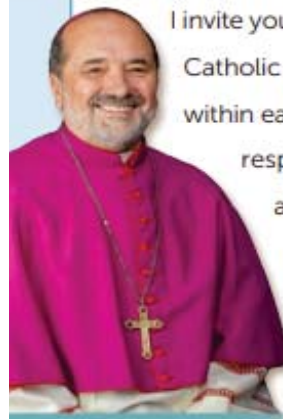

Mensaje del Padre Mariano

Queridos hermanos y hermanas en Cristo: las lecturas de este XII Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario nos invitan a reflexionar sobre el valor y la perseverancia que requiere dar testimonio de nuestra fe en el mundo actual. Vivimos en una sociedad donde, para muchas personas, incluso para algunos bautizados, la fe cristiana resulta incómoda o

susurros de quienes hablan contra él y percibe cómo sus enemigos vigilan cada uno de sus pasos, esperando cualquier error o debilidad para acusarlo, derrotarlo y vengarse de él. Jeremías experimenta el miedo, la soledad y la persecución. Sin embargo, no pierde la confianza en Dios. Sabe que el Señor está a su lado como un poderoso defensor.

Por eso, después de ser librado de las manos de sus enemigos, eleva un canto de alabanza y gratitud al Señor, que nunca abandona a quienes ponen en Él su esperanza.

El Evangelio continúa este mismo mensaje de confianza. Jesús dice a sus apóstoles y también a nosotros: “No tengan miedo.” El Señor conoce las dificultades que enfrentan quienes anuncian el Evangelio. Sabe que habrá momentos de incomprensión, rechazo o burla. Sin embargo, nos recuerda que somos valiosos ante los ojos del Padre y que nada escapa a su amorosa providencia.

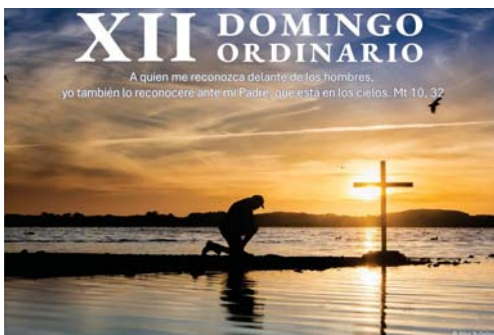

¿Por qué tenemos velas votivas en nuestra parroquia?

Las velas votivas son una hermosa expresión de oración y fe. Cuando encendemos una vela ante un santo, su luz simboliza nuestra fe y nuestra confianza en la intercesión de ese santo ante Dios. La llama también representa la intención particular que presentamos en oración: ya sea por el eterno descanso de un ser querido, la salud de una persona enferma, una situación difícil, el regreso de un familiar a la fe o cualquier otra necesidad personal.

La vela encendida es un recordatorio visible de nuestra oración y de nuestra esperanza en el amor y la providencia de Dios. Incluso después de que dejamos la iglesia, la llama continúa simbolizando la intención que hemos confiado al Señor. Y si la vela llegara a apagarse, podemos estar seguros de que Dios ya ha escuchado nuestra oración; Su atención y Su amor por nuestras necesidades no dependen de la llama misma.

Las velas votivas nos ayudan a expresar exteriormente lo que llevamos en el corazón y nos recuerdan que estamos llamados a perseverar en la oración y a confiar en la voluntad de Dios.

Animo a todos a hacer uso de las velas votivas disponibles en nuestra iglesia. Son una forma sencilla, pero profundamente significativa, de poner nuestras intenciones en las manos de Dios y de unirnos más íntimamente a la oración de toda la Iglesia.

Al reunirnos para la Santa Misa y otras celebraciones sagradas, recordamos que la manera en que nos vestimos refleja nuestro respeto por la ocasión y por aquellos con quienes nos encontramos. En muchos lugares existe un protocolo de vestimenta para asistir a eventos importantes o para encontrarse con personas distinguidas. ¡Cuánto más debemos ser conscientes de ello cuando nos presentamos ante la presencia de Dios!

Animamos cordialmente a todos —niños, jóvenes y adultos— a elegir una vestimenta adecuada para la Santa Misa y los actos religiosos.
