






Pastor's message

Dear brothers and sisters, we begin Holy Week today. Indeed, this is the Week of the weeks par excellence. We are going to commemorate the triumphal entry of our blessed Lord into the holy city of Jerusalem and thus to carry out the Paschal mystery. It is the week where once again we will see the love of God made flesh, "God so loved the world that he gave his only Son." Our Blessed Lord faces all this suffering with complete willingness, knowing that in this way the Father's eternal plan will be fulfilled in his obedience. Jesus' willingness to die for all mankind is depicted as the "Lamb of God who is going to take away the sin of the whole world." (jjj) The Paschal lamb that was


a commemoration of the liberation of Egypt, will now become the true Paschal Lamb that will liberate the human race

from the slavery of sin and the devil, given them the freedom of the children of God, thus leading all the new Christians to the new promised land which is heaven. The Easter triduum is the peak of the Easter celebration. On Holy Thursday Jesus will establish the sacrament of his love, the Holy Eucharist and with it the Mass is born. Jesus is going to give a new and definitive

commemoration by celebrating the Last Supper with his disciples. Jesus transforms the bread into his Body and the wine into his Most Precious Blood. This commemoration will be foreshadowed in the coming days when our Lord enters on that first Good Friday of his Passion to die and rise again on the third day from the dead. As we prepare our hearts and our minds to accompany to our Lord, may we have the same attitude of the protagonists of that first Holy Week. May we become his true disciples who will not abandon him in this most crucial hour, but console him as he consoles us in our daily life. May all of you have a fruitful Holy Week, and may the blessings of the almighty God remain always with all the families in the parish of St. Anthony, "for by your cross and resurrection you have set us free."



Liturgy Corner



THE SACRED TRIDUUM

When does the Triduum begin and end?

The Easter Triduum begins with the evening Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday, reaches its high point in the Easter Vigil, and closes with Evening Prayer on Easter Sunday.

During the evening of **Holy Thursday**, the Mass of the Lord's Supper is celebrated. It is

celebrated in the evening because the Passover began at sundown. There is only one Mass, at which the whole community and priests of the parish participate. We recall the institution of the Holy Eucharist and the priesthood. The priests wear white vestments, the altar is filled with flowers, the Gloria is sung and the bells are rung. After the Gloria, we shall not hear organ music and the bells until the Easter Vigil. After the Communion Prayer, there is no final blessing. The Holy Eucharist is carried in procession through Church and then transferred into a place of reposition, usually a side chapel. The hymn *Pange Lingua* is also usually sung at this time. After the Mass, we recall the Agony in the Garden, and the arrest and imprisonment of Jesus. The altar is stripped bare, crosses are removed or covered. The Eucharist has been placed in an altar of repose, and most churches are open for silent adoration, to answer Christ's invitation "Could you not, then, watch one hour with me?" (Matt 26:40)

On **Good Friday** the altar is completely bare, with no cloths, candles nor cross. The service is divided into three parts: Liturgy of the Word, Veneration of the Cross and Holy Communion. The priest and deacons wear red or black vestments. The liturgy starts with the priests and deacons going to the altar in silence and prostrating themselves for a few moments in silent prayer, then an introductory prayer is prayed.

Holy Saturday (from *Sabbatum Sanctum*, its official liturgical name) is sacred as the day of the Lord's rest; it has been called the "Second Sabbath" after creation. The day is and should be the most calm and quiet day of the entire Church year, a day broken by no liturgical function. Christ lies in the grave, the Church sits near and mourns.

"**mother of all vigils**" is the "greatest and most noble of all solemnities and it is to be unique in every single Church." On this holy night, the Church keeps watch, celebrating the resurrection of Christ in the sacraments and awaiting his return in glory. It is the turning point of the Triduum, the Passover of the new covenant, which marks Christ's passage from death to life.






Domingo de Ramos.

El Domingo de Ramos abre solemne-mente la Semana Santa, con el recuerdo de las Palmas y de la Pasión, de la entra-dada de Jesús en Jerusalén y la liturgia de la palabra que evoca la Pasión del Señor en el Evangelio de San Mateo.



En este día, se entrecruzan las dos tradiciones litúrgicas que han dado origen a esta celebración: la alegre, multitudinaria, festiva liturgia de la Iglesia madre de la ciudad santa, que se convierte en mimesis, imi-tación de los que Jesús hizo en Jerusalén, y la austera me-moria - anamnesis - de la pasión que marcaba la liturgia de Roma. Liturgia de Jerusalén y de Roma, juntas en nuestra celebración. Con una evocación que no puede dejar de ser actualizada.

Vamos con el pensamiento a Jerusalén, subimos al Mon-te de los Olivos para recalar en la capilla de Betfagé, que nos recuerda el gesto de Jesús, gesto profético, que entra como Rey pacífico, Mesías aclamado primero y condenado después, para cumplir en todo las profecías. .

Palabras con una extraña evocación de las mismas que anuncianaron el nacimiento del Señor en Belén a los más hu-mildes. Jerusalén, desde el siglo IV, en el esplendor de su vida litúrgica celebraba este momento con una procesión multitudinaria. Y la cosa gustó tanto a los peregrinos que occidente dejó plasmada en esta procesión de ramos una de las más bellas celebraciones de la Semana Santa.

Con la liturgia de Roma, por otro lado, entramos en la Pasión y anticipamos la proclamación del misterio, con un gran contraste entre el camino triunfante del Cristo del Domingo de Ramos y el Vía Crucis de los días santos.


"Padre, en tus manos encomiendo mi espíritu". Este es el Evangelio, esta la nueva noticia, el contenido de la nueva evangelización. Desde una paradoja este mundo que parece tan autónomo, necesita que se le anuncie el misterio de la debilidad de nuestro Dios en la que se demuestra el culmen de su amor. Como lo anunciaron los primeros cristianos con estas narraciones largas y detallistas de la pasión de Jesús.

La liturgia de las palmas anticipa en este domingo, illa-mado Pascua florida, el triunfo de la resurrección; mientras que la lectura de la Pasión nos invita a entrar consciente-mente en la Semana Santa de la Pasión gloriosa y amorosa de Cristo el Señor.


