Pastor's message

Dear brothers and sisters, with the Solemnity of Palm Sunday we begin the most important week of the liturgical year. This holy week is called the week of weeks, because in three blessed days Our Lord Jesus Christ will accomplish the redemption of the human race. Three very important highlights of the Easter Triduum are: the institution of the



Holy Eucharist, his passion and death on Good Friday, and the glorious resurrection of Christ in the early hours of the first day, that is, Sunday.

"The account of the institution of the Eucharist may be found in the Gospels of Matthew, Mark, and Luke as well as in Paul's First Letter to the Corinthians (see Mt 26:17-29; Mk 14:12-25; Lk 22:7-20; 1 Cor 11:23-26). Jesus chose the Passover feast as the time in which he

would institute the Eucharist and would undergo his dying and rising (cf. CCC, nos. 1339-1340). With the institution of the Eucharist, Jesus gave the Passover its new and definitive meaning. He showed himself to be the High Priest of the New Covenant, offering himself as a perfect sacrifice to the Father. Jesus changed the bread and wine into his Body and Blood, given now as an offering for the salvation of all people. For I received from the Lord what I also handed on to you, that the Lord Jesus, on the night he was handed over, took bread, and after he had given thanks, broke it and said, "This is my body that is for you. Do this in remembrance of me." In the same way also the cup, after supper, saying, "This cup is the new covenant in my blood. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me." For as often as you eat this bread and drink the cup, you proclaim the death of the Lord until he comes. (1 Cor 11:23-26)

By the words "Do this in memory of me," Jesus commanded the Apostles and their successors to repeat his actions and words "until he comes again." From

earliest times, the Church has remained faithful to this command. Particularly on Sunday, the day of Christ's Resurrection, the faithful has gathered for the Breaking of the Bread. This practice has continued unbroken for two thousand years right up to the present day.

Christ's Last Supper discourse (Jn 14:1-17;26) reflects Eucharistic themes of divine love, a union with Christ as intimate as a branch is to a vine, and a priestly prayer for the Apostles and those who would believe through them." *Excerpt from the United States Catholic Catechism for adults.*

May you have a blessed Week, and be an active protagonist of the Paschal mystery of our Blessed Lord. God bless you all.

Liturgy Corner

During the evening of **Holy Thursday**, the Mass of the Lord's Supper is celebrated. It is celebrated in the evening because the Passover began at sundown. There is only one Mass, at which the whole community and priests of the parish participate. We recall the institution of the Holy Eucharist and the priesthood.

he priests wear white vestments, the altar is filled with flowers, the Gloria is sung and the bells are rung. After the Gloria, we shall not hear organ music and the bells until the Easter Vigil. After the Communion Prayer, there is no final blessing. The Holy Eucharist is carried in procession through Church and then transferred into a place of reposi-tion, usually a side chapel. The hymn *Pange Lin-gua* is also usually sung at this time. After the Mass, we recall the Agony in the Garden, and the arrest and imprisonment of Jesus. The altar is stripped bare, crosses are removed or covered. The Eucharist has been placed in an altar of repose, and most churches are open for silent adoration, to answer Christ's invitation "Could you not, then, watch one hour with me?" (Matt 26:40)

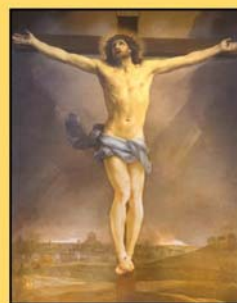
When does the Triduum begin and end?

The Easter Triduum begins with the evening Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday, reaches its high point in the Easter Vigil, and closes with Evening Prayer on Easter Sunday.

On **Good Friday** the altar is completely bare, with no cloths, candles nor cross. The service is divided into three parts: Liturgy of the Word, Veneration of the Cross and Holy Communion. The priest and deacons wear red or black vestments. The liturgy starts with the priests and deacons going to the altar in silence and prostrating themselves for a few moments in silent prayer, then an introductory prayer is prayed.

Holy Saturday (from *Sabbatum Sanctum*, its official liturgical name) is sacred as the day of the Lord's rest; it has been called the "Second Sabbath" after creation. The day is and should be the most calm and quiet day of the entire Church year, a day broken by no liturgical function. Christ lies in the grave, the Church sits near and mourns.

"**mother of all vigils**" is the "greatest and most noble of all solemnities and it is to be unique in every single Church." On this holy night, the Church keeps watch, celebrating the resurrection of Christ in the sacraments and awaiting his return in glory. It is the turning point of the Triduum, the Passover of the new covenant, which marks Christ's passage from death to life.

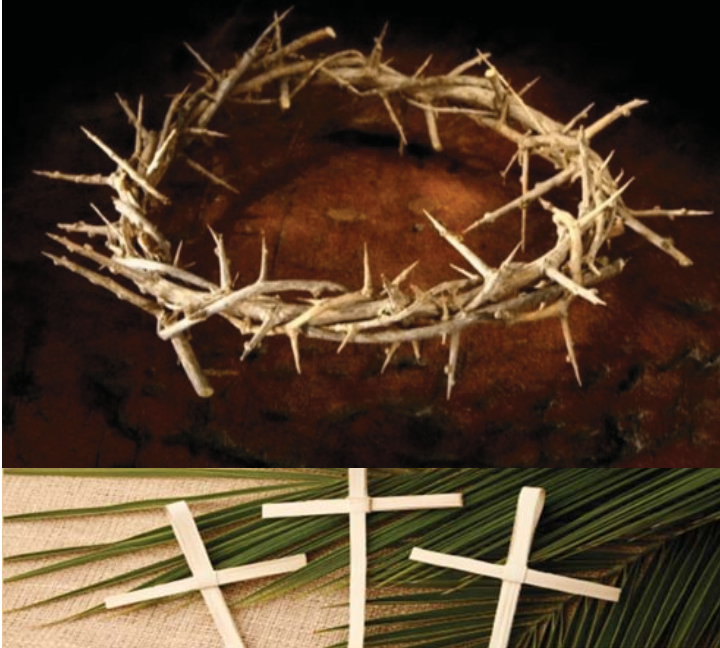

Mensaje del Padre Marcelo

“¿Eres tú el rey de los judíos?”

Hoy se nos invita a contemplar el estilo de la realeza de Cristo salvador. Jesús es Rey, y —precisamente— en el último domingo del año litúrgico celebraremos a Nuestro Señor Jesucristo Rey del universo. Sí, Él es Rey, pero su reino es el «Reino de la verdad y la vida, el Reino de la santidad y la gracia, el Reino de la justicia, el amor y la paz» (Prefacio de la Solemnidad de Cristo Rey). ¡Realeza sorprendente! Los hombres, con nuestra mentalidad mundana, no estamos acostumbrados a eso.



Un Rey bueno, manso, que mira al bien de las almas: «Mi Reino no es de este mundo» (Jn 18,36). Él deja hacer. Con tono despectivo y de burla, «¿Eres tú el rey de los judíos?». Jesús respondió: «Tú lo dices» (Mt 27,11). Más burla todavía: Jesús es parangonado con Barrabás, y la ciudadanía ha de escoger la liberación de uno de los dos: «¿A quién queréis que os suelte, a Barrabás o a Jesús, a quien llaman el Mesías?» (Mt 27,17). Y... ¡prefieren a Barrabás! (cf. Mt 27,21). Y... Jesús calla y se ofrece en holocausto por nosotros, ¡que le juzgamos!

Cuando poco antes había llegado a Jerusalén, con entusiasmo y sencillez, «la gente, muy numerosa, extendió sus mantos por el camino; otros cortaban ramas de los árboles y las tendían por el camino. Y la gente que iba delante y detrás de él gritaba: ‘¡Hosanna al Hijo de David! ¡Bendito el que viene en nombre del Señor! ¡Hosanna en las alturas!’» (Mt 21,8-9). Pero, ahora, esos mismos gritan: «‘Que lo crucifiquen’. Pilato insistió: ‘Pues, ¿qué mal ha hecho?’. Pero ellos gritaban más fuerte: ‘¡Que lo crucifiquen!’» (Mt 27, 22-23). «¿A vuestro Rey voy a crucificar?’ Replicaron los sumos sacerdotes: ‘No tenemos más rey que el César’» (Jn 19,15).

Este Rey no se impone, se ofrece. Su realeza está impregnada de espíritu de servicio. «No viene para conquistar gloria, con pompa y fastuosidad: no discute ni alza la voz, no se hace sentir por las calles, sino que es manso y humilde (...). No echemos delante de Él ni ramas de olivo, ni tapices o vestidos; derramémonos nosotros mismos al máximo posible» (San Andrés de Creta, obispo).

Que Dios los bendiga y que tengan una Semana Santa con muchos frutos y bendiciones!

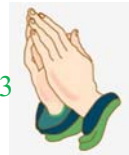
