Pastor's message

Dear friends in Christ, Gaudete Sunday is the Third Sunday of Advent. The Introit for Gaudete Sunday, is taken from Philippians 4:4,5: "*Gaudete in Domino semper*" ("Rejoice in the Lord always"). Like Lent, Advent is a penitential season, so the priest normally wears purple vestments. But on Gaudete Sunday, having passed the midpoint of Advent, the

as well, when the restoration of all things takes place. Too often many of us tremble at the thought of our Lord's coming in glory, as if it were a frightening event, certainly it will be for those who knowingly rejected Jesus. But for Christians who persevere it will be our great deliverance from the troubles and trials of this world. The entire world will bend the knee, some in terror, but as for God's friends, they will bend the knee in joyful adoration as Jesus takes His place as King. The earliest Christians cried 'Maranatha! Come Lord Jesus!' expecting Jesus to come at any moment. So, we should long for His return with our lamps trimmed and our souls ready. It is indeed something to celebrate and prepare for. Before that "Make straight the way of the Lord'

Liturgy Corner | History of Our Lady of Guadalupe, the Empress of the Americas

In 1531 a "Lady from Heaven" appeared to a humble Native American at Tepayac, a hill northwest of what is now Mexico City. She identified herself as the ever virgin Holy Mary, Mother of the True God for whom we live, of the

ed her for a sign, the Mother of God obeyed without delay or question to the Church's local Bishop, and sent her native messenger to the top of the hill in mid-December to gather an assortment of roses for the Bishop. After complying

to the Bishop's request for a sign, She also left for us an image of herself imprinted miraculously on the native's tilma, a poor quality cactus-cloth, which should have deteriorated in 20 years but shows no sign of decay 479 years later and still defies all scientific explanations of its origin.

It apparently even reflects in her eyes what was in front of her in 1531. Her to believe that at Tepeyac Mary came in her glorified body, and her actual physical hands rearranged the roses in Juan Diego's tilma, which makes this apparition very special. An incredible list of miracles, cures and interventions are attributed to Her. Within six years of this apparition, six million Aztecs had converted to Catholicism. Yearly, between 18 - 20 million pilgrims visit the Basilica, making it Christianity's most visited sanctuary. Altogether 26 popes have officially honored Our Lady of Guadalupe.

In 1910, St. Pius X named her Patroness of Latin America, and in 1945, at the urging of bishops from the U.S. and Canada, Ven. Pius XII bestowed on her the title Empress of the Americas.



Our Lady of Guadalupe

Creator of all things, Lord of heaven and the earth. She made a request for a church to be built on the site, and submitted her wish to the local Bishop. When the Bishop hesitated, and request-





"No ha surgido entre los nacidos de mujer uno mayor que Juan el Bautista"




Queridos hermanos,

Hoy, como el domingo anterior, la Iglesia nos presenta la figura de Juan el Bautista. Él tenía muchos discípulos y una doctrina clara y diferenciada: para los publicanos, para los soldados, para los fariseos y saduceos... Su empeño es preparar la vida pública del Mesías. Primero envió a Juan y Andrés, hoy envía a otros a que le conozcan. Van con una pregunta: «Eres tú el que ha de venir, o debemos esperar a otro?» (Mt 11,3). Bien sabía Juan quién era Jesús. Él mismo lo testimonia: «Yo no lo conocía, pero el que me envió a bautizar con agua me dijo: 'Aquel sobre el que veas descender el Espíritu y permanecer sobre él, ése es el que bautiza en el Espíritu Santo'» (Jn 1,33). Jesús contesta con hechos: los ciegos ven y los cojos andan...

Juan era de carácter firme en su modo de vivir y en mantenerse en la Verdad, lo cual le costó su encarcelamiento y martirio. Aún en la cárcel habla eficazmente con Herodes. Juan nos enseña a compaginar la firmeza de carácter con la humildad: «No soy digno de desatarle las sandalias» (Jn 1,27); «Es preciso que Él crezca y que yo disminuya» (Jn 3,30); se alegra de que Jesucristo bautice más que él, pues se considera sólo "amigo del esposo" (cf. Jn 3,26).

Hablando de sí mismo como el que vino a presentar, dijo cierta vez: "Yo no soy digno de desatar la correa de su calzado" (Juan 1:27). En otras palabras: Yo no soy digno de ser ni su esclavo.



En una palabra: Juan nos enseña a tomar en serio nuestra misión en la tierra: ser cristianos coherentes, que se saben y actúan como hijos de Dios. Debemos preguntarnos: —¿Cómo se prepararían María y José para el nacimiento de Jesucristo? ¿Cómo preparó Juan las enseñanzas de Jesús? ¿Cómo nos preparamos nosotros para conmemorarlo y para la segunda venida del Señor al final de los tiempos? Pues, como decía san Cirilo de Jerusalén: «Nosotros anunciamos la venida de Cristo, no sólo la primera, sino también la segunda, mucho más gloriosa que aquélla. Pues aquélla estuvo impregnada por el sufrimiento, pero la segunda traerá la diadema de la divina gloria».
