

Pastor's message

Dear brothers and sisters, with the Ash Wednesday liturgy we are entering into the forty days and forty nights of prayers, penance and almsgiving. These three devotions are the hallmarks of the Holy Season of Lent. First of all on Ash Wednesday we will be marked with ashes on our forehead signifying our humble attitude before God Our Father that we are in need of penance. In the Old Testament as with the New Testament as well, ashes is the symbol of our return tites, such as pleasure, passions etc. to our father home, "remember you are dust and to dust you shall return", these words reminds us of the brevity of our life and therefore the devotions of lent equips us to atone for our sins and to be ready as a good steward before our heavenly Father. We are called to pray; prayer was the daily bread of our blessed Lord on earth. He wished to begin his public life by entering into a forty day and forty night of retreat in the ing fire, so almsgiving atones for desert of Judea with fasting. Jesus teach-

es us that we human not only live by bread alone, that is material things, but also by the words that comes from God. What is the food for our body is prayer for our immortal soul. So let us increase the quality of our prayer during this Lenten season. Fasting and abstinence is what the church recommends us to practice. Why this sort of sacrifice? Because we as imperfect and week human beings need to restrain our disordinate appe-Fasting and abstinences are the exercises we need to dominate the passions in order to be fit spiritually. Jesus endured this penance to give us an example of victory over temptations. Let us renounce to those legitimate pleasures by doing fasting and abstinence. Almsgiving is an opportunity to give of our resources, but also because according to the scripture "As water quenches a flamsins." (Sirach 3:30) Also The Catechism

of the Catholic Church refers to these three as "acts of religion" flowing from the New Law of Christ, the Gospel. (CCC no. 1969).



Found in the Scriptures and the writings of the Fathers of the Church, they express conversion in relation to oneself (fasting), to God (prayer), and to others (almsgiving.) (CCC no. 1434)

May this Lenten season be a time of renewal and sincere conversion of heart and mind, that we may be spiritually fit to give a true worship to our heavenly Father and through our act of mercy be ready to serve our brothers and sisters. Blessings and have a holy season of lent.

Liturgy Corner

Why Ashes? By Fr. Larry Rice

For centuries, Catholic Christians have marked the beginning of the season of Lent by receiving ash on their foreheads on Ash Wednesday. This tradition has its roots in the Old Testament, where wearing ashes was a common sign of repentance for sins, and a sign of one's humility before God. Since Lent is a season of penitential renewal through prayer, fasting, and almsgiving, it's appropriate that this ancient sign marks the beginning of the season.

The ashes themselves are usually made by burning the palm fronds from the previous year's Palm Sunday. This symbolically connects the beginning of Lent with its end, connecting our change of heart with Christ's passion, death, and resurrection.

Ashes are usually distributed as part of the Mass on Ash Wednesday, of-



ten after the homily. As people approach the priest or oth-er minister, he presses the ashes to their foreheads, and speaks one of two phrases: "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return,"


or "Repent and believe in the Gospel."

In many places, Ash Wednesday services are among the most popular of the whole year—a day that's not even a Holy Day of Obligation. Cynics have suggested that this is because people "get" something, as they do on Palm Sunday. But there's nothing particularly appealing about getting smudged with ashes. Perhaps, the appeal is the ex-pression through a physical sign of a desire for interior conversion.

The Gospel for Ash Wednesday is a reminder that the real purpose of the season of Lent isn't to make public demonstrations of piety—even the wearing of ashes—but to seek conversion of heart.







Mensaje del Padre Marcelo

"Sed perfectos como es perfecto vuestro Padre celestial"

Hoy, la Palabra de Dios, nos enseña que la fuente original y la medida de la santidad están en Dios: «Sed perfectos co-



mo es perfecto vuestro Padre celestial» (Mt 5,48). Él nos inspira, y hacia Él caminamos. El sendero se recorre bajo la nueva ley, la del Amor. El amor es el seguro conductor de nuestros ideales, expresados tan certeramente en este quinto capítulo del Evangelio de san Mateo.

La antigua ley del Talión del libro del Éxodo (cf. Ex 21,23-35) —que quiso ser una ley que evitara las venganzas despiadadas y restringir al "ojo por ojo", el desagravio bélico— es definitivamente superada por la Ley del amor. En estos versículos se entrega toda una Carta Magna de la moral creyente: el amor a Dios y al prójimo.

El Papa Benedicto XVI nos dice: "Solo el servicio al prójimo abre mis ojos a lo que Dios hace por mí y a lo mucho que me ama". Jesús nos presenta la ley de una justicia sobreabundante, pues el mal no se vence haciendo más daño, sino expulsándolo de la vida, cortando así su eficacia contra nosotros.

Para vencer —nos dice Jesús— se ha de tener un gran dominio interior y la suficiente claridad de saber por cuál ley nos regimos: la del amor incondicional, gratuito y magnánimo. El amor lo llevó a la Cruz, pues el odio se vence con amor. Éste es el camino de la victoria, sin violencia, con humildad y amor gozoso, pues Dios es el Amor hecho acción. Y si nuestros actos proceden de este mismo amor que no defrauda, el Padre nos reconocerá como sus hijos. Éste es el camino perfecto, el del amor sobreabundante que nos pone en la corriente del Reino, cuya más fiel expresión es la sublime manifestación del desbordante amor que Dios ha derramado en nuestros corazones por el don del Espíritu Santo (cf. Rom 5,5).
