Pastor's message

Dear brothers and sisters, this Sunday the Gospel brings us two important metaphors, salt and light. Jesus says, you are the salt of the earth and the light of



the world. These two metaphors call us to reflect on our vocation as baptized, since the dignity of being baptized in Christ impels us to be at the service of others. Jesus presents himself as the light of the world and the salt of the earth. With his words of "eternal life" Jesus gives that flavor to the insipid life of those who are going astray. With his words Jesus enlightens the minds and hearts of the afflicted and the brokenhearted. The Lord called his disciples salt of the earth, because they were to season with

the wisdom of heaven the hearts of men, made insipid by the work of the devil. He also calls them the light of the world, because, having been enlightened by him, who is the true and eternal light, they themselves have become the light that dispels the darkness. Thus, enlightened by the apostles, we too have become light, as the Apostle says, "Once you were darkness, now you are light in the Lord; walk as children of light and children of the day; you are not of the night or of darkness." You see being enlightened by Christ it is our duty to shine more than ever in this world where the darkness of sins and death seems to prevail.

Mother Teresa of Calcutta says, "Each of us is a poor instrument. If you look at the composition of an electrical apparatus, you will find an assemblage of wires large and small, new and worn, expensive and cheap. If the electric current does not pass through it all, there will be no light. These threads are you and me. God is the electricity. We have the power to let the electricity pass through us, to let ourselves be used by God, to let light be produced in the

world, or else to refuse to be instruments and let darkness spread."

Saint John Paul II said the following to the people of Mexico in a visit in 1993 "May the Virgin of Guadalupe protect you and be the star that guides you on your way, so that you may always be salt of the earth and light of the world. Brothers and sisters, how beautiful it is to come together to celebrate the same faith, the same life in Christ. You, I, are not only fruit, but also Sowers of the words of Jesus, to make disciples of all nations; that is, apostles of the new evangelization: for by virtue of our Baptism, we are called. How beautiful it is to come together to celebrate the same faith, the same life in Christ, the same Eucharist."

Liturgy Corner

Sacramentals (Blessings)

Blessings are called "sacramentals" because they prepare us to receive the grace of the sacraments and help us to grow to be more like Christ (see *Catechism of the Catholic Church*, no. 1670).

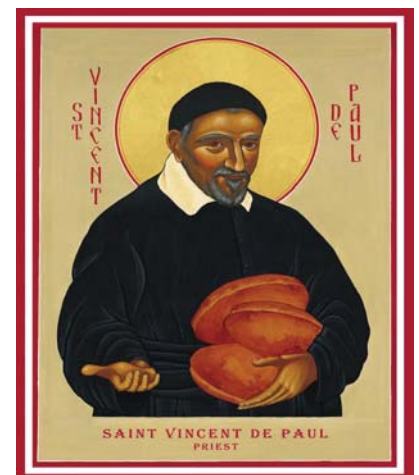
Blessings consist of prayer, Scripture, and sometimes a special ritual sign (see *Catechism of the Catholic Church*, no. 1668).

People are accustomed to seeing bishops, priests, and deacons blessing objects or persons in the name of the Church. Indeed, "the more a blessing concerns ecclesial and sacramental life, the more is its administration reserved to the ordained ministry" (*Catechism of the Catholic Church*, no. 1669), often with the participation of the local parish community gathered in prayer. Whenever an ordained minister is present, he should be called upon to give the blessing. However, there are other blessings, like the ones contained in [Catholic Household Blessings and Prayers](#), that can be

prayed by anyone who has been baptized, "in virtue of the universal priesthood, a dignity they possess because of their baptism and confirmation" (*Book of Blessings*, no. 18). The blessings given by laypersons are exercised because of their special office, such as parents on behalf of their children.

Right after telling his disciples to "love your enemies, do good to those who hate you," Jesus instructs them to "bless those who curse you, pray for those who mistreat you" (Lk 6:28). St. Paul echoes the Lord's command when he exhorts the Romans to "bless those who persecute [you], bless and do not curse them" (Rom 12:14). St. Peter urges that each time we are on the receiving end of evil, we should return "a blessing, because to this you were called, that you might inherit a blessing" (1 Pt 3:9). This is why the *Catechism of the Catholic Church* tells us that "every baptized person is called to be a 'blessing,' and to bless" (no. 1669; see Gn 12:2; Lk 6:28; Rom 12:14; 1 Pt 3:9).

Like the Lord into whom they have been baptized, parents should bless and pray for their children. Each one of us should remember the sick and those who suffer. Each time we gather around the family table, we should bless God and the food he has given us. On special occasions, we will observe the traditions of the season, sanctifying by prayer and blessing all the seasons of grace that God has given to us. [Sacramentals \(Blessings\) | USCCB](#)

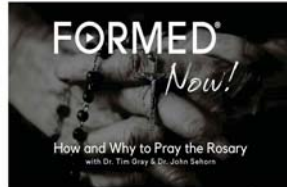

Mensaje del Padre Marcelo

“Vosotros sois la luz del mundo”

Hoy, el Evangelio nos hace una gran llamada a ser testimonios de Cristo. Y nos invita a serlo de dos maneras, aparentemente, contradictorias: como la sal y como la luz.



La sal no se ve, pero se nota; se hace gustar, paladear. Hay muchas personas que “no se dejan ver”, porque son como “hormiguitas” que no paran de trabajar y de hacer el bien. A su lado se puede paladear la paz, la serenidad, la alegría. Tienen —como está de moda decir hoy— “buenas radiaciones”.

La luz no se puede esconder. Hay personas que “se las ve de lejos”: Santa Teresa de Calcuta, el Papa, el Párroco de un pueblo. Ocupan puestos importantes por su liderazgo natural o por su ministerio concreto. Están “encima del candelero”. Como dice el Evangelio de hoy, «en la cima de un monte» o en «el candelero» (cf. Mt 5,14.15).

Todos estamos llamados a ser sal y luz. Jesús mismo fue “sal” durante treinta años de vida oculta en Nazaret. Dicen que san Luis Gonzaga, mientras jugaba, al preguntarle qué haría si supiera que al cabo de pocos momentos habría de morir, contestó: «Continuaría jugando».
