




PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Does the Church need a place to celebrate the liturgy?

The worship "in spirit and in truth" (Jn 4:24) of the New Covenant is not linked to an exclusive place, because Christ is the true temple of God, by means of which also the Christians and the whole Church become, by the action of the Holy Spirit, temples of the living God.

However, the People of God, in their earthly condition, needs a place where the community can gather to celebrate the liturgy. The sacred buildings are the houses of God, symbol of the Church that lives in that place and images of the heavenly dwelling.

They are places of prayer, in which the Church celebrates above all the Eucharist and worships Christ truly present in the tabernacle. The main places within the sacred buildings are these: the altar, the tabernacle or tabernacle, the receptacle where the holy chrism and the other holy oils, the seat of the bishop (chair) or the priest, the



ambo, the baptismal font, and the confessional.



LITURGY CORNER

Words of Wisdom of St. John Paul II to the Youth to discover their vocation.

"Dear adolescents and young people, it is to you in a particular way that I renew the invitation of Christ to "put out into the deep". You find yourselves having to make important decisions for your future."



"Dear young men and women! Trust Christ; listen attentively to his teachings, fix your eyes on his face, persevere in listening to his Word. Allow Him to focus your search and your aspirations, all your ideals and the desires of your heart."

"To you, young people, I repeat the word of Jesus: "Duc in altum!". In proposing His exhortation once more to

you, I think at the same time of the words which Mary, his Mother, addressed to the servants at Cana in Galilee: "Do whatever he tells

you" (Jn 2,5). "Dear young people, Christ is asking you to "put out into the deep" and the Virgin Mary is encouraging you not to hesitate in following Him.

May an ardent prayer sustained by the motherly intercession of Mary, rise from every corner of the earth, to the heavenly Father to obtain "labourers for his harvest" (Mt 9,38). May He give zealous and holy priests to every part of his flock. Sustained by this awareness we turn to Christ, the High Priest, and we pray to Him with renewed trust:

*Jesus, Son of God,
in whom the fullness of the Divinity
dwells, You call all the baptized to "*

put out into the deep", taking the path that leads to holiness.

Waken in the hearts of young people the desire to be witnesses in the world of today to the power of your love. Fill them with your Spirit of fortitude and prudence, so that they may be able to discover the full truth about themselves and their own vocation.

Our Saviour, sent by the Father to reveal His merciful love, give to your Church the gift of young people who are ready to put out into the deep, to be the sign among their brothers of Your presence which renews and saves.

Holy Virgin, Mother of the Redeemer, sure guide on the way towards God and towards neighbour, You who pondered his word in the depth of your heart, sustain with your motherly intercession our families and our ecclesial communities, so that they may help adolescents and young people to answer generously the call of the Lord. Amen.







Tiene la Iglesia necesidad de lugares para celebrar la liturgia?

El culto «en espíritu y en verdad» (Jn 4, 24) de la Nueva Alianza no está ligado a un lugar exclusivo, porque Cristo es el verdadero templo de Dios, por medio del cual también los cristianos y la Iglesia entera se convierten, por la acción del Espíritu Santo, en templos del Dios vivo.



Sin embargo, el Pueblo de Dios, en su condición terrenal, tiene necesidad de lugares donde la comunidad pueda reunirse para celebrar la liturgia. Los edificios sagrados son las casas de Dios, símbolo de la Iglesia que vive en aquel lugar e imágenes de la morada celestial. Son lugares de oración, en los que la Iglesia celebra sobre todo la Eucaristía y adora a Cristo realmente presente en el tabernáculo.

Los lugares principales dentro de los edificios sagrados son éstos: el altar, el sagrario o tabernáculo, el retablo donde se conservan el santo crisma y los otros santos óleos, la sede del obispo (cátedra) o del presbítero, el ambón, la pila bautismal y el confesionario.




