





## PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Dear brothers and sisters, this week we commemorate another anniversary of the infamous law that allows any woman to terminate the course of pregnancy legally. This act constitutes a violation of the main right that everyone has from the moment of conception, which is the right to life. Obviously, this action as such is a sin, because it threatens human life, the most precious gift that God has given to the human person.

Life is a gift from God, and as such it must be protected. All citizens, both the president and legislators and judges, have the duty to protect, defend and issue laws that help the full development of the person in all their stages of life. The termination of pregnancy should not be seen as an act of liberation of a person or an action that re-

lieves a consequence of indirectly sought actions, but as a bad and selfish action. Abortion looks more to the personal and individualistic good than to the protection of the person. The person has a spiritual soul infused by God at the moment of conception, with the

right to exercise the gift of life, and after his pilgrimage on earth, eternal life in heaven. That is why the Church always im-

posed medicinal penalties against these sins. The penalty imposed on abortion is the penalty of excommunication, that is, the person is excluded from all the graces received for being members of the church family. The church does this as a medicinal action, to bring the sinner to consciousness. Automatic excommunication (*latae sententiae*) "in

such a way that the person committing the crime incurs *ipso facto*." These are extremely serious crimes: procuring or participating in an abortion or the cooperation necessary for an abortion to be carried out (CIC 2272; Canon Law 1398). Therefore, "The excommunicated and those who are in question after the imposition or declaration of the penalty, and those who obstinately persist in manifest grave sin, should not be admitted to holy communion." (Can 915)

May our prayers and the sacrifices join to those who will gather this year in Washington DC for the annual march in manifestation that we have to defend and protect the right to live of every undefended person. May the Lord bless and protect those young people from our parish who attend the pro life march along with Fr. Marcelo and the sisters.

## LITURGY CORNER

### How to receive Holy Communion Properly.

**Guidelines for the reception of Communion:** As Catholics, we fully participate in the celebration of the Eucharist when we receive Holy Communion. We are encouraged to receive Communion devoutly and frequently. In order to be properly disposed to receive Communion, participants should not be conscious of grave sin and normally should have fasted for one hour. A person who is conscious of grave sin is not to receive the Body and Blood of the Lord without prior sacramental confession except for a grave reason where there is no opportunity for confession. In this case, the person is to be mindful of the obligation to make an act of perfect contrition, including the intention of confessing as soon as possible (canon 916). A frequent reception of the Sacrament of Penance is encouraged for all.

**For those not receiving Holy Communion:** All who are not receiving Holy Communion are encouraged to ex-


press in their hearts a prayerful desire for unity with the Lord Jesus and with one another." accessed on 31 December 2019, <http://www.usccb.org/prayer-and-worship/the-mass/order-of-mass/liturgy-of-the-eucharist/guidelines-for-the-reception-of-communion.cfm>.

Canon 915 says "Those who have been excommunicated or interdicted after the imposition or declaration of the penalty and others obstinately persevering in manifest grave sin are not to be admitted to holy communion."

### Who may incur in excommunication?

"A person who procures a completed abortion incurs a *latae sententiae* excommunication." Can. 1398

After being said this, it follows that politicians who vote in favor of abortion should not receive the sacrament of Holy Communion. "Legislative action in favor of abortion is incompatible with participation in the Eucharist. ... Politicians exclude themselves from Communion."





## Mensaje del Párroco

Queridos hermanos, esta semana conmemoramos otro aniversario de la injusta ley que permite a cualquier mujer interrumpir el curso del embarazo de manera legal. Este acto constituye una violación al principal derecho que toda persona tiene desde el momento de la concepción, que es el derecho a la vida. Obviamente, esta acción como tal es un pecado, porque atenta contra la vida humana, el don más precioso que Dios ha otorgado a la persona humana. La vida es un regalo de Dios, y como tal debe ser protegido. Todos los ciudadanos tanto el presidente como los legisladores y jueces, tienen el deber de proteger, defender y emitir leyes que ayuden al desarrollo pleno de la persona en toda sus etapas de la vida. La interrupción del embarazo no debe ser visto como un acto de liberación de una persona o una acción que alivia de una consecuencia de acciones buscadas indirectamente, sino como un acción mala y egoísta. El aborto mira mas al bien personal e individualista que a la protección de la persona. La persona tiene un alma espiritual infundida por Dios en el momento de la concepción, con el derecho de vivir a plenitud el regalo de la vida y después de su peregrinación en la tierra, la vida eterna en el cielo.

Por eso la Iglesia siempre impone penas medicinales contra estos pecados. La pena impuesta al aborto es la *pena de excomunión*, es decir que se la excluye a la persona de todas las gracias que se reciben por ser miembros de la familia de la iglesia. La iglesia hace esto como una acción medicinal, para traer al pecador a la conciencia. La excomunión automática (*latae sententiae*) "de modo que incurre ipso facto en ella quien comete el delito". Se trata de delitos sumamente graves: el procurar o participar en un aborto o la cooperación necesaria para que un aborto se lleve a cabo (CIC 2272; Ley Canónica 1398). Por lo tanto, "No deben ser admitidos a la sagrada comunión los excomulgados y los que están en entredicho después de la imposición o declaración de la pena, y los que obstinadamente persistan en un manifiesto pecado grave." (Can 915)


