PASTOR'S MESSAGE

True Joy

"Do whatever he tells you", this short phrase said by Our Lady contains the whole program of life that She herself carried out together with her Son, and that teaches us to contemplate in this Mystery. It is the program of a life that rests on the solid foundation called Jesus. What to do to give meaning to life? The world we live in is going through times of crisis.

One of the most dangerous, St. John Paul II affirms, is the loss of the meaning of life, which leads many of our contemporaries to wonder what to do so that their existence does not sink into emptiness, sadness and despair. In the end, how should we behave in the difficult situations that come our way on a daily basis, in personal life, in marriage, in the family, at work, in our spiritual and moral dilemmas?

If we want to have a life based on a solid foundation, capable of resisting adversity, we must hear the voice of

Mary at Cana, who shows us her Son saying, "Do whatever he tells you." Listen to Jesus, obey Him and His commandments, trust Him.

Mother who anticipates our needs.

In the Holy Scriptures wine is also a symbol of the Holy Spirit poured out in abundance, a symbol of celebration and life. Without wine, the party is over. In the context of Jewish weddings that lasted several days, the bride and groom and their families had a responsibility to ensure that the wine was not lacking ahead of time, so as not to have to interrupt the feast.

Mary is attentive to our difficulties

When she realized that the wine had run out, Maria, mother always attentive, did not rush to comment on what happened to her friends or to censure the bride and groom. She did only one thing: she sought Jesus out and simply told him what was going on. In other words, Mary prayed and interceded for the bride and groom.

She is the Help of Christians, always attentive to our needs.

Here is a fact that should fill us with comfort: to know

that our concerns interest the Mother of God. Therefore, let us learn with her to place all our problems in the hands of Jesus, trusting in the intercession of the Blessed Mother. Let us have great confidence in his piety, which will always grant us what we ask of him, for unsolicited he interceded at Cana, how much more will he not intercede when we plead with him?

LITURGY CORNER

The Precepts of the Church The catechism of the Catholic Church teaches

CCC 2041

The precepts of the Church are set in the context of a moral life bound to and nourished by liturgical life. The obligatory character of these positive laws decreed by the pastoral authorities is meant to guarantee to the faithful the very necessary *minimum* in the spirit of prayer and moral effort, in the growth in love of God and neighbor:

CCC 2042 The first precept

("You shall attend Mass on Sundays and holy days of obligation and rest from servile labor.") requires the faithful to sanctify the day commemorating the Resurrection of the Lord.

CCC 2042 The second precept

("You shall confess your sins at least once a year.") ensures preparation for the Eucharist by the reception of the sacrament of reconciliation, which continues Baptism's work of conversion and forgiveness.



CCC 2043 The fourth precept

("You shall observe the days of fasting and abstinence established by the Church") ensures the times of asceticism and penance which prepare us for the liturgical feasts and help us acquire mastery over our instincts and freedom of heart.

CCC 2043 The fifth precept

("You shall help to provide for the needs of the Church") means that the faithful are obliged to assist with the material needs of the Church, each according to his own ability.

CCC 2042 The third precept

("You shall receive the sacrament of the Eucharist at least during the Easter season") guarantees as a minimum the reception of the Lord's Body and Blood in connection with the Paschal feasts, the origin and center of the Christian liturgy.



La verdadera alegría

“Haced lo que él os diga”, esta corta frase dicha por Nuestra Señora contiene todo el programa de vida que Ella misma realizó junto a su Hijo, y que nos enseña a contemplar en este Misterio. Es el programa de una vida que se apoya en el fundamento sólido que se llama Jesús. ¿Qué hacer para dar sentido a la vida? El mundo en que vivimos atraviesa por momentos de crisis. Una de las más peligrosas, afirma San Juan Pablo II, es la pérdida del sentido de la vida, que lleva a muchos de nuestros contemporáneos a preguntarse qué hacer para que su existencia no se hunda en el vacío, en la tristeza y en el desespero. Tengamos mucha confianza en su piedad, que siempre nos concederá lo que le pedimos, pues sin ser solicitada intercedió en Caná, ¿Cuánto más no intercederá cuando le suplicamos?


