



PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Dear brothers and sisters, this Sunday the Church celebrates the Baptism of Jesus in the river Jordan by John the Baptist. With this celebration we close

the Christmas season, and we prepare to celebrate and contemplate during the coming Sundays the mystery of Christ public life; this will be until the Sunday before ash Wednesday, March 2nd. The Baptism is a sacrament and therefore instituted by Christ. We know that baptism takes away the original sin and any other sins the person may have committed,


now if Jesus was true God, he did not need the baptism. How is that Christ was baptized then? St. Ambrose says on Luke 3:21: "Our Lord was baptized

because He wished, not to be cleansed. but to cleanse the waters, that, being purified by the flesh of Christ that knew no sin, they might have the virtue

of baptism;" and Saint John Chrysostom afirms "although Christ was not a sinner, vet did He take a sinful nature and the likeness of sinful flesh. Wherefore, though He needed not baptism for His own sake, yet carnal nature in others had need thereof." In the natural order, when we are born of humanity, we are born into human society. In the supernatural order, when we are born of water and the Holy Spir-

it, we enter a supernatural society, the Catholic Church. Baptism makes us shares in the Divine Nature. Divine

Nature is the life of soul, what we call the sanctifying grace, a new life. In baptism, we are joined with Christ. Immersed into his



life and love, his mission is our mission. Today, reflect on your baptismal call to live as a member of Christ's body. How are you living the mission of Christ, to make God's love and mercy known in the world? Is Christ's mission your mission? Let us renews today our baptismal promises that we may always profess our faith and renounce to the work of the evil one. Therefore, as we renew our baptismal promises, we also ask ourselves, Do I remember the day of my own baptism? Do I celebrate the day of my children baptism? Do I as parents light the baptism candle for my children? Do I fulfil my obligations as Christian parents or Godparents?

LITURGY CORNER

What does the Church say about Sponsor for baptism? This is what the Code of Canon law states about sponsors.

SPONSORS

Can. 872 Insofar as possible, a person to be baptized is to be given a sponsor who assists an adult in Christian initiation or together with the parents presents an infant for baptism. A sponsor also helps the baptized person to lead a Christian life in keeping with baptism and to fulfill faithfully the obligations inherent in it.

Can. 873 There is to be only one male sponsor or one female sponsor or one of each.

Can. 874 §1. To be permitted to take on the function of sponsor a person must:

1/ be designated by the one to be baptized, by the parents or the person who takes their

place, or in their absence by the pastor or minister and have the aptitude and intention of fulfilling this function;

2/ have completed the sixteenth year of age, unless the diocesan bishop has established another age, or the pastor or minister has granted an exception for a just cause;


3/ be a Catholic who has been confirmed and has already received the most holy sacrament of the Eucharist and who leads a life of faith in keeping with the function to be taken on;

4/ not be bound by any canonical penalty legitimately imposed or declared;

5/ not be the father or mother of the one to be baptized.

§2. A baptized person who belongs to a non-Catholic ecclesial community is not to participate except together with a Catholic sponsor and then only as a witness of the baptism.

Mensaje del Párroco

Queridos hermanos y hermanas, este domingo la Iglesia celebra el Bautismo de Jesús en el río Jordán por Juan el Bautista. Con esta celebración cerramos el tiempo de Navidad, y nos preparamos para celebrar y contemplar durante los próximos domingos el misterio de la vida pública de Cristo; esto será hasta el domingo ante-



rior al miércoles de ceniza, 2 de marzo. El Bautismo es un sacramento y, por tanto, instituido por Cristo. Sabemos que el bautismo quita el pecado original y cualquier otro pecado que la persona pueda haber cometido, ahora bien, si Jesús era el verdadero Dios, nunca cometió pecado, según San Pedro, "El cual nunca cometido pecado" (I Ped 2-22) entonces Jesús no necesitaba el bautismo. ¿Cómo es que Cristo fue bautizado? Jesús no necesita el baptismo pero si necesitaba purificar las aguas con su



cuerpo glorioso. Jesús le dio a las aguas el poder de santificar y de limpiar toda mancha de pecado, y de este modo instituyó el Sacramento del Bautismo. Por medio del bautismo nos incorporamos a la familia que es la iglesia aquí en la tierra, y lo mas importante es que nos hacemos coherederos de la gloria del Cielo. Podemos decir que somos verdaderamente hijos de Dios, participe de su vida divina aquí ya en la tierra. Hoy también es una oportunidad muy bella

para todos nosotros recordar el día de nuestro bautismo. Hay gente que ni se acuerda el día del bautismo, ni siquiera tienen el certificado de bautismo. Es importante que los padres y padrinos pidan inmediatamente a la iglesia el certificado de bautismo para que se pueda dar gracias a Dios por ese día tan especial. Seria muy triste que los padres dejen el bautismo de los hijos para mas adelante, pensando muchas veces en el bienestar material que el espiritual. Los niños necesitan recibir el bautismo para así recibir las gracias que la Iglesia como madre derrama sobre sus hijos.
