



love.? This parable is a challenge to us to reconsider the boundaries we set up whether the person is of my race, my neighborhood, my color, my social status, etc. and etc.. We are all made in the image of our heavenly Father, and so we have the potentiality to care and to love, "God's love has been poured out into

our hearts through has been given to us" Rom 5:5 God's providence

allows us to put into practice this command of the Lord, "Go and do likewise" to say a kind word, to give a little support, lend a listening ear, to offer a little sympathy.

The Brown Scapular and other the need for prayer. Scapulars

The history of Marian piety also includes "devotion" to various scapulars, the most common of which is devotion to the Scapular of Our Lady of Mount Carmel. Its use is truly universal and, undoubtedly, its is one of those pious practices which the Council described as "recommended by the Magisterium throughout the centuries" (255). The Scapular of Mount Carmel is a reduced form of the religious habit of the Order of the Friars of the Blessed Virgin of Mount Carmel. Its use is very diffuse and often independent of the life and spirituality of the Carmelite family. The Scapular is an external sign of the filial relationship established between the Blessed Virgin Mary, Mother and Queen of Mount Carmel, and the faithful who entrust themselves totally to her protection, who have recourse to her maternal intercession, who are mindful

of the primacy of the spiritual life and

The Scapular is imposed by a special rite of the Church which describes it as "a reminder that in Baptism we have been clothed in Christ, with the assistance of the Blessed Virgin Mary, solicitous for our conformation to the Word Incarnate, to the praise of the Trinity, we may come to our heavenly home wearing our nuptial garb"(256).

The imposition of the Scapular should be celebrated with "the seriousness of its origins. It should not be improvised. The Scapular should be imposed following a period of preparation during which the faithful are made aware of the nature and ends of the association they are about to join and of the obligations they as-

sume"(257).

The Mount Carmel brown scapular is

the oldest among eight scapulars that have a Marian character and were approved by the Church. (Four of the others are white, one is blue, one black and one green.) The brown scapular owes its origin and existence to Saint Simon Stock who received a large brown scapular from Our Lady in a vision on July 16, 1251. A scapular is actually a sleeveless outer garment of a monk's habit that falls from the shoulders. The original significance implied that one was clothed with Mary's garment in the sense of being clothed with her attitudes and devotion to Christ. The small piece of cloth (or medal) used today recalls the intention of being clothed in the garments of salvation."





Amar a los otros con obras es lo más alto; es donde se manifiesta el amor. ¡No pasar de largo!: «Es el propio Cristo quien alza su voz en los pobres para despertar la



caridad de sus discípulos», afirma el Concilio Vaticano II en un documento.

Hacer de buen samaritano significa cambiar los planes («llegó junto a él»), dedicar tiempo («cuidó de él»)... Esto nos lleva a contemplar también la figura del posadero, como dijo san Juan Pablo II: «¡Qué habría podido hacer sin él? De hecho, el posadero, permaneciendo en el anonimato, realizó la mayor parte de la tarea. Todos podemos actuar como él cumpliendo las propias tareas con espíritu de servicio. Toda ocupación ofrece la oportunidad, más o menos directa, de ayudar a quien lo necesita (...). El cumplimiento fiel de los propios deberes profesionales ya es practicar el amor por las personas y la sociedad».

Dejarlo todo para acoger a quien lo necesita (el buen samaritano) y hacer bien el trabajo por amor (el posadero), son las dos formas de amar que nos corresponden: «'¿Quién (...) te parece que fue prójimo?'. 'El que practicó la misericordia con él'. Díjole Jesús: 'Vete y haz tú lo mismo'» (Lc 10,36-37).
