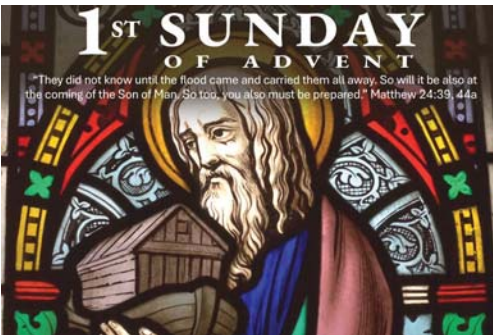

## Pastor's message

Dear brothers and sisters,  
This weekend we start this holy season of Advent and with it a new liturgical year, that is A. The meaning and purpose of the season of Advent is a call, and also a reminder that the Messiah is coming. A long time ago, before Jesus birth, the coming of the Messiah was



anticipated by the prophets and holy patriarchs who, teaching and exhorting their people to prepare their mind and their hearts for the arrival of the Messiah, did not stop preaching to the one who will restore everything to its proper dignity. The mission of the prophets, especially Isaiah, was to lift up the people's hope in the Lord. The "Emmanuel" whom he preached will

refine, instruct and make us walk in his paths giving us peace and security.

*"There shall be no harm or ruin on all my holy mountain; for the earth shall be filled with knowledge of the Lord."*  
In the New Testament John the Baptist, contemporaneous to Jesus, would usher the people to recognize the Messiah, already present in their midst.

The Advent season reminds us that we are close to Christmas. A time that seems to reminds us just to get ready to buy our gifts to share, meals to plan etc. We risk the temptation of getting so caught up in those secondary preparation that the most important, such as recollection, prayers, mortification, resolutions, gets put on the bottom of the Christmas list. Jesus invites us to be awake during this season. Christ with a compassion heart tells us not to be deceived like the people in the time of Noah, until the flood came and carried them all away. Cfr Matt 24:37. Let us celebrate these beautiful four weeks with our lighted advent candles, both in our hearts and those of our homes. May we be alert and awake to listen and put into practice Christ's exhortation.

## Jubilee reunion:

As some of you may have already known, I will be leaving tomorrow, Monday November 28th for a class reunion in my home country in Argentina.



On December 6th, I and seventeen other priests from my class will be celebrating our twenty-fifth priestly anniversary. We will participate in a priesthood ordination Mass, and a Mass of thanksgiving in the Basilica of Our Lady of Lujan in Buenos Aires. I will also have the opportunity to visit with my family and friends in my home town to give thanks to the Lord for the gift of the priesthood. I will be returning on the 21st of December. Please pray for me that I may continue being faithful to my ministry in a humble imitation of Jesus, the Good Shepherd. Please be assured of my prayers to you and your families. Happy Advent!

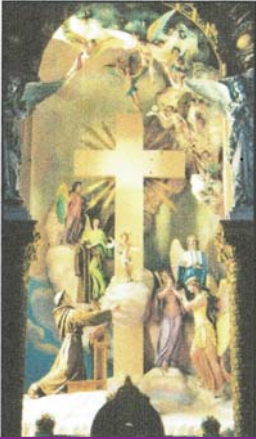

## Mensaje del Padre Marcelo

***“En los días que precedieron al diluvio, comían, bebían (...). Velad, pues, (...) también vosotros estad preparados”***

Hoy, en este domingo, comenzando el tiempo de Adviento, inauguramos a la vez un nuevo año litúrgico. Esta circunstancia la podemos tomar como una invitación a renovarnos en algún aspecto de nuestra vida (espiritual, familiar, etc.).

De hecho, necesitamos vivir la vida, día a día, mes a mes, con un ritmo y una ilusión renovados. Así alejamos el peligro de la rutina y del tedio. Este sentido de renovación permanente es la mejor manera de estar alerta. Sí, ¡hay que estar alerta!: es uno de los mensajes que el Señor nos transmite a través de las palabras del Evangelio de hoy.



Hay que estar alerta, en primer lugar, porque el sentido de la vida terrenal es el de una preparación para la vida eterna. Este tiempo de preparación es un don y una gracia de Dios: Él no quiere imponernos su amor ni el cielo; nos quiere libres (que es el único modo de amar). Preparación que no sabemos cuándo acabará: «Anunciamos el advenimiento de Cristo, y no solamente uno, sino también otro, el segundo (...), porque este mundo de ahora terminará» (San Cirilo de Jerusalén). Hay que esforzarse por mantener la actitud de renovación y de ilusión.

En segundo lugar, conviene estar alerta porque la rutina y el acomodamiento son incompatibles con el amor. En el Evangelio de hoy el Señor recuerda cómo en tiempos de Noé «comían, bebían» y «no se dieron cuenta hasta que vino el diluvio y los arrastró a todos» (Mt 24,38-39).
