





Pastor's message

Dear brothers and sisters, this coming Tuesday we will celebrate the solemnity of all the saints, a holy day of obligation. In the solemnity of all the saints first of all we give thanks to God for the graces and crowns of all his elects, secondly it encourages us to a fervent imitation of their virtues by considering the holy example of so many faithful servants of God of all ages, sexes, and conditions. They are saints because they knew how to fulfill God's will in their daily life. Some of them even gave their lives for their faith. The Book of Revelation describes them as "a great multitude which no man could number, from every nation, from all tribes and peoples and tongues" (Rv 7:9) This people includes the Saints of the Old Testament, starting with the righteous Abel and the faithful Patriarch, Abraham, those of the New Testament, the numerous early Christian Martyrs and the Blesses and Saints of later centuries, to the witnesses of Christ in this epoch of ours. They are all brought together by the common desire to incarnate the Gospel in their lives under the impulse of the Holy Spirit, the life-giving spirit of the People of

God. Looking at the Saints reawaken within us the great longing to be like them; The Church's experience shows



that every form of holiness, even if it follows different paths, always passes through the Way of the Cross, the way of self-denial. Holiness demands a constant effort, but it is possible for everyone because, rather than a human effort, it is first and foremost a gift of God. Also on Wednesday we celebrate all Souls. This celebra-



tion gives us an opportunity to pray for those souls forgotten of prayers, but also to reminds us on the mystery of death. At the end of the liturgical year, it is fitting to consider the scatological reality of our life: death, purgatory, and heaven. May we be always alert not to neglect to work for our salvation, knowing that "What no eye has seen, what no ear has heard, and what no human mind has conceived" the things God has prepared for those who love him." (1 Cor. 2:9)

Happy Sunday to everyone and come to Immaculate Conception Parish to celebrate all the saints today Sunday at 5:30 pm.

Liturgy Corner

The following teaching on Purgatory is taken from the My Catholic Faith! book - Chapter 8 - The Glorious and Final Things!

The Church Suffering: Purgatory is an often misunderstood doctrine of our Church. What is Purgatory? Is it the place we go to be punished for our sins? Is it God's way of "getting back at us" for the wrong we've done? Is it the result of God's anger? None of these questions really answer the question of Purgatory. Purgatory is nothing other than the burning and purifying love of God in our lives! When someone dies in God's grace they are most likely not 100% converted and perfect in every way. Even the greatest of saints would have some imperfection left in their lives. Purgatory is nothing other than that final purification of all remaining attachment to sin in our lives. By analo- is the progy, imagine that you had a cup of 100% pure water, pure HO. This cup will represent Heaven. Now imagine that you want to add to that cup of water but all

you have is water that is 99% pure. This attachment, then we simply say that the will represent the holy person who dies with just some slight attachments to sin. If you add that water to your cup, then the cup will now have at least some impurities in the water as it mixes together. The problem is that Heaven (the original cup of 100% HO) cannot contain any impurities. Heaven, in this case, cannot have even the slightest attachment to sin in it. Therefore, if this new water (the 99% pure water) is to be added to the cup, it must first be purified


even of that last 1% of impurities (attachments to sin). This is ideally done while we are on Earth. This cess of getting holy. But if we die with any

process of entering into the final and full vision of God in Heaven will purify us of any remaining attachment to sin. All may already be forgiven, but we may not have detached fully from those sins which were forgiven.


Wreaths Across America


Mensaje del Párroco

"Zaqueo, baja en seguida, porque hoy tengo que alojarme en tu casa"

Hoy, la narración evangélica parece como el cumplimiento de la parábola del fariseo y el publicano (cf. Lc 18,9-14). Humilde y sincero de corazón, el publicano oraba en su interior:




«Oh Dios, ten compasión de mí, que soy un pecador» (Lc 18,13); y hoy contemplamos cómo Jesucristo perdona y rehabilita a Zaqueo, el jefe de publicanos de Jericó, un hombre rico e influyente, pero odiado y despreciado por sus vecinos, que se sentían extorsionados por él: «Zaqueo, baja en seguida, porque hoy tengo que alojarme en tu casa» (Lc 19,5). El perdón divino lleva a Zaqueo a convertirse; he aquí una de las originalidades del Evangelio: el perdón de Dios es gratuito; no es tanto por causa de nuestra conversión que Dios nos perdona, sino que sucede al revés: la misericordia de Dios nos mueve al agradecimiento y a dar una respuesta.



Como en aquella ocasión Jesús, en su camino a Jerusalén, pasaba por Jericó. Hoy y cada día, Jesús pasa por nuestra vida y nos llama por nuestro nombre. Zaqueo no había visto nunca a Jesús, había oído hablar de Él y sentía curiosidad por saber quién era aquel maestro tan célebre. Jesús, en cambio, sí conocía a Zaqueo y las miserias de su vida. Jesús sabía cómo se había enriquecido y cómo era odiado y marginado por sus convecinos; por eso, pasó por Jericó para sacarle de ese pozo: «El Hijo del Hombre ha venido a buscar y a salvar lo que estaba perdido» (Lc 19,10).

El encuentro del Maestro con el publicano cambió radicalmente la vida de este último. Después de haber oído el Evangelio, piensa en la oportunidad que Dios te brinda hoy y que tú no debes desaprovechar: Jesucristo pasa por tu vida y te llama por tu nombre, porque te ama y quiere salvarte, ¿en qué pozo estás atrapado? Así como Zaqueo subió a un árbol para ver a Jesús, sube tú ahora con Jesús al árbol de la cruz y sabrás quien es Él, conocerás la inmensidad de su amor, ya que «elige a un jefe de publicanos: ¿quién desesperará de sí mismo cuando éste alcanza la gracia?» (San Ambrosio).

Que Dios te bendiga y que tenga una bendecida semana. Padre Marcelo.
