

My dear friends, September is the month dedicated to the reading and meditation of the Holy Scriptures. This event is due to the celebration of the memory of St. Jerome (September 30th) a great scholar



of the Holy Scriptures. St. Jerome translated the books of the Scriptures in Hebrew and Greek into the Latin language, which is the official language of the Church. After this translation from Hebrew and Greek into latin, the Church prepared other translations into the vernacular languages for the better appreciation of the faithful of different nations.

The Bible, as we commonly called;

should be the main book in our journey of life while we make our pilgrimage to heaven. In the Bible we find a sure guide to walk according to the commandments of God, light for those who are in darkness, "Your Word is a lamp to my feet and a light to my path" (Psalm 119:115) safe instruction for those who live in doubt.

St. Paul tells us in the letter to Timothy that "Everything in the scripture has been divinely inspired, and has its uses; to instruct us, to expose our errors, to correct our faults, to educate us in holy living." (2 Tim 3: 16-17) That is why we as Christians must give the Sacred Book the importance it deserves, to always put it as the main book, because it is not only our light for our feet but also a nourishment for our soul, "How sweet are your words to my taste, sweeter than honey to my mouth" (Psalm 119:113)

The Church in the liturgy at Mass, emphasizes the importance of the liturgy of the word and the liturgy of the Eucharist. When the Christian comes to Mass, one is nourish himself with the two

nourishments, the liturgy of the Word and the liturgy of the Eucharist.





Liturgy Corner

Celebrating the month of Bible



("NABRE").

Besides the various editions of the translation, many different publishers have produced editions of the NAB. Each publisher has added material, such as photographs, maps, devotions and prayers, and reference matter to the biblical text.

What's the difference between a "Catholic Bible" and a "Protestant Bible"?

Catholic and Protestant Bibles both include 27 books in the New Testament. Protestant Bibles have only 39 books in the Old Testament, however, while Catholic Bibles have 46. The seven books included in Catholic Bibles are Tobit, Judith, 1 and 2 Maccabees, Wisdom, Sirach, and Baruch. Catholic Bibles also include sections in the Books of Esther and Daniel which are not found in Protestant Bibles. These books are called the deuterocanonical books. The Catholic Church believes these books to be inspired by the Holy Spirit.

What's the difference between a Bible and a Lectionary?

A Lectionary provides the readings and the responsorial psalm assigned for each Mass of the year (Sundays, weekdays, and special occasions). The readings are divided by the day or the theme (baptism, marriage, vocations, etc.) rather than according to the books of the Bible. Introductions and conclusions have been added to each reading. Not all of the Bible is included in the Lectionary.

Individual readings in the Lectionary are called pericopes, from a Greek word meaning a "section" or "cutting." Because the Mass readings are only portions of a book or chapter, introductory phrases, called incipits, are often added to begin the Lectionary reading, for example, "In those days," "Jesus said to his disciples," etc.

How many versions of the New American Bible are there?

The original version of the New American Bible (NAB) was published in 1970. The translation of the New Testament was revised and published in 1986. The translation of the Book of Psalms (the Psalter) was revised in 1991. A revision of the translation of the Old Testament, including the Psalter, was published in March 2011. This version is called the New American Bible Revised Edition

Mensaje del P. Marcelo

No podéis servir a Dios y al dinero

Hoy el Evangelio nos presenta la figura del administrador infiel: un hombre que se aprovechaba del oficio para robar a su amo. Era un simple administrador, y actuaba como el amo. Conviene que tengamos presente:



1) Los bienes materiales son realidades buenas, porque han salido de las manos de Dios. Por tanto, los hemos de amar.

2) Pero no los podemos “adorar” como si fuesen Dios y el fin de nuestra existencia; hemos de estar desprendidos de ellos. Las riquezas son para servir a Dios y a nuestros hermanos los hombres; no han de servir para destronar a Dios de nuestro corazón y de nuestras obras: «No podéis servir a Dios y al dinero» (Lc 16,13).

3) No somos los amos de los bienes materiales, sino simples administradores; por tanto, no solamente los hemos de conservar, sino también hacerlos producir al máximo, dentro de nuestras posibilidades. La parábola de los talentos lo enseña claramente (cf. Mt 25,14-30).

4) No podemos caer en la avaricia; hemos de practicar la liberalidad, que es una virtud cristiana que hemos de vivir todos, los ricos y los pobres, cada uno según sus circunstancias. ¡Hemos de dar a los otros!

¿Y si ya tengo suficientes bienes para cubrir mis gastos? Sí; también te has de esforzar por multiplicarlos y poder dar más (parroquia, diócesis, Cáritas, apostolado). Recuerda las palabras de san Ambrosio: «No es una parte de tus bienes lo que tú das al pobre; lo que le das ya le pertenece. Porque lo que ha sido dado para el uso de todos, tú te lo apropias. La tierra ha sido dada para todo el mundo, y no solamente para los ricos».

¿Eres un egoísta que sólo piensa en acumular bienes materiales para ti, como el administrador del Evangelio, mintiendo, robando, practicando la cicatería y la dureza de corazón, que te impiden conmoverse ante las necesidades de los otros? ¿No piensas frecuentemente en las palabras de san Pablo: «Dios ama al que da con alegría» (2Cor 9,7)? ¡Sé generoso!
