Chionanthus virginicus (Fringe tree)

Long lived perennial tree
Late spring flowers
Mature dimensions: 10-20' x 8'-15'
Prefers balanced moisture but adaptable
Accent tree

Styrax americanus (American snowbell)


A long lived perennial tree Showy, fragrant spring flowers Mature dimensions: 6-12' x 6-10' Prefers balanced moisture ***Prolific bloomer***





Cartrema americanum (Wild olive)

A long lived perennial tree Fragrant spring flower, summer fruit Mature dimensions: 20' x 10' Prefers well drained sandy soils: drough



Edible fruit





Wisteria frutescens (American wisteria)

Long lived perennial vine Spring flowers Mature dimensions: 20' x 10' Prefers rich soils, but adaptable ***Showy flowers***



Vines



Lonicera sempervirens (Coral honeysuckle)

Long lasting blooming vine Blooms Spring-Fall

Mature stems of larger specimens: 12-15' stems

Adaptable to many different conditions

Nectar for hummingbirds







Vaccinium spp. (Blueberry) Several species to suit your needs Spring flowers, summer fruit



Mature dimensions of smaller species: 1-6' x 2-2' Mature dimensions of larger species: 12-20' x 12-16' Prefers well drained sandy soils

Excellent wildlife plant



Osmundastrum cinnamomea (Cinnamon fern)

Long lived perennial fern Spring fertile orange fronds Mature dimensions: 3-4' x 3'-4' Prefers moist areas, non-spreading

Showy fern



Thelypteris kunthii (Shield fern)

Long lived perennial fern Spreading fern Mature dimensions: 3-4' x 3'-4'

Adaptable to periodic dry conditions, part-sun

Fast growing



Asclepias incarnate (Swamp milkweed) Short lived perennial wildflower

Mature dimensions: 2-4' x 2' Adaptable, easily propagatable ***Host plant for monarch, queen, & soldier

butterflies***



Sisyrinchium angustifolium (Blue-eyed grass)

Long lived perennial wildflower

Spring flowers

Mature dimensions: 1' x 1' Adaptable, good groundcover

Low growing
