“Brothers and sisters, with the opening of the Holy Door we have inaugurated a new Jubilee, and each of us can enter into the mystery of this extraordinary event. Tonight, the door of hope has opened wide to the world. Tonight, God speaks to each of us and says: there is hope also for you! There is hope for each of us.”

– Pope Francis, December 24, 2024

2025 is the Jubilee Holy Year, the 2,025th anniversary of the Incarnation of our Lord, an "event of great spiritual, ecclesial, and social significance in the life of the Church." The concept of "Jubilee" has its origins from Jewish tradition, the Book of Leviticus (chapter 25) as a special year of reconciliation, pilgrimage, and coming home.

In ancient Judaism, the Jubilee Year (which was called the year of the yōbēl, "of the goat", because the holiday was proclaimed by the sound of a goat's horn) was a year that was declared holy. During this period, the Mosaic law prescribed that slaves could regain their freedom, and that land, (of which God is the sole master), should be returned to its former owners. A jubilee year was typically celebrated every 50 years.

The first Jubilee in the Catholic Church was celebrated in 1300 and over time has continued as a year of pilgrimage and renewal in the Church. Pope Boniface VIII referred to the first Jubilee as a “Holy Year,” since it is a time in which God’s holiness transforms us.

The frequency of Holy Years has changed over time: at first, they were celebrated every 100 years; later, in 1343 Pope Clement VI changed the frequency to every 50 years, and in 1470 Pope Paul II set the Jubilee Years every 25 years.


Open the Hallow app, navigate to the Community tab (bottom of screen), search for our parish by zip code, and join.

2025 ARCHDIOCESAN ANNUAL APPEAL

The theme for this year's Annual Appeal is from 1 Corinthians 10:31, "***Do everything for the Glory of God.***" As Catholics, we use our talents and provide our gifts for God's Glory. One way we vividly do so is by supporting the programs and ministries of the Archdiocesan Annual Appeal. The gifts received through the Appeal support ministries, programs and services at a level that an individual donor or individual parish would not be able to by itself.

The following are a few specific ways that you help change lives through making a gift to the AAA:

- ◆ Permanent Diaconate – Deacons are an integral part of parish life in our Archdiocese. Many teach RCIA, Faith Formation, Marriage Preparation, and Baptismal Preparation classes. They are also intimately involved with their parish communities through visiting the sick, engaging in various forms of charitable works, and many other ways.
- ◆ Marriage & Family Life – The Office of Marriage and Family Life serves couples and families through programs for engaged and married couples, ministries for parents, and others. Ongoing programs include an annual Wedding Anniversary Mass, couples' retreat, support for marriages in crisis, grief ministry, a healing retreat for adults with divorced parents, Mother/Daughter events, and men's and women's conferences. New ministries include skills-based workshops for couples, and increased support for those suffering from marital loss through divorce or widowhood.
- ◆ Consecrated Life – The Office of Consecrated Life serves and collaborates with 32 religious communities who minister and live in the Archdiocese. We are blessed with the presence of such communities as the Daughters of Charity of St. Vincent de Paul, the Missionaries of Charity, and the Sisters of the Blessed Virgin Mary. The Council of Religious supports the Director in organizing activities such as retreats, ongoing formation of religious, and outreach to the needy.
