ABSTINENCE: Everyone fourteen years of age and older is bound to abstain from meat on *ASH WEDNESDAY*, the *FRIDAYS of Lent* and *GOOD FRIDAY*.

When health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the law does not oblige. In doubt concerning fast or abstinence, a priest assigned to pastoral ministry or confessor should be consulted. In the spirit of penance, the faithful should not lightly excuse themselves from this obligation.

St Patrick St Vincent de Paul (SVdP) Conference 2025 Annual Report. The Conference 2025 fiscal year ended September 30, 2025 and the following figures are provided to inform the Parish community of the monetary receipts and expenses and contacts with neighbors seeking assistance.

Receipts: \$62,098 from Parish donations; \$18,303 from Parish Pennies fundraising; \$9,500 from other SVdP Entities; Larkspur Foundation \$1,000, Lions Club \$1,000, SF Archdiocese Food Grant \$1,000 and St. Patrick School Fundraiser \$1003.

Expenses: \$53,274 for general assistance to neighbors; \$39,485 for housing assistance; \$9,800 Twinning for assistance of neighbors to other Marin County SVdP Conferences; Disaster Contribution LA Fires \$1,000; \$738 Pennies and \$324 for Miscellaneous Expenses.

During the fiscal year conference members made 148 visits via phone and in person, helping 333 people. Conference members were only able to provide this assistance through the generosity of the parish community for which the Conference is truly grateful.

Funds from this collection provide food to the hungry, support displaced refugees, and bring Christ's love and mercy to vulnerable people here and abroad. 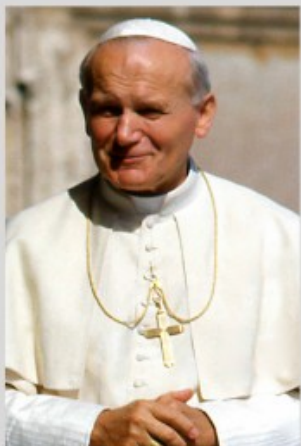
Catholic Men's Conference Called to Lead

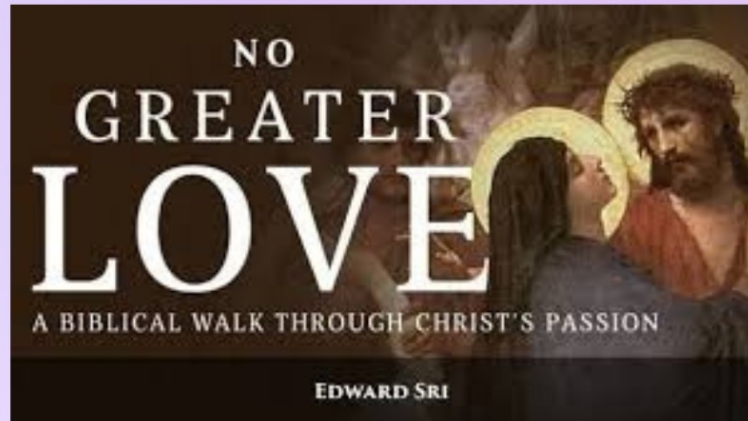

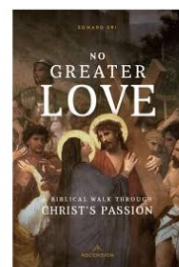

Those who hope in the Lord will renew their strength. — Isaiah 40:31

The theme for this year's Annual Appeal is from Isaiah 40:31, *"Those who hope in the Lord will renew their strength."* As Catholics, we use our talents and provide our gifts for God's Glory. One way we vividly do so is by supporting the programs and ministries of the Archdiocesan Annual Appeal. The gifts received through the Appeal support ministries, programs and services at a level that an individual donor or individual parish would not be able to by itself.

The following are a few specific ways that you help change lives through making a gift to the AAA:

- * **Youth & Young Adult Ministry** – Through leadership support, formation, partnerships, retreats and gatherings, our Youth & Young Adult Ministry walks with the Young Church to foster a real encounter with Christ. We help them know they belong in the Church, engage more fully in its life, and become living witnesses of Christ's love.
- * **Chaplaincy Program** – Chaplaincy is offered in hospitals and prisons. Chaplains bring support, healing, and counseling to individuals and families during their times of greatest need, in the most vulnerable moments of their lives. They administer sacraments, provide spiritual guidance, and foster hope through their presence.
- * **Tribunal** – Your generosity supports the Archdiocesan Tribunal, which accompanies God's people through their lives in the Church ... helps ensure fidelity to Canon Law, particularly regarding a Sacramental life...reviews cases, often involving marriage, and helps bring clarity and healing to people who often carry heavy burdens...safeguards the dignity and rights of the faithful as a reflection of Christ's mercy.
