ABSTINENCE: Everyone fourteen years of age and older is bound to abstain from meat on *ASH WEDNESDAY*, the *FRIDAYS of Lent* and *GOOD FRIDAY*.

When health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the law does not oblige. In doubt concerning fast or abstinence, a priest assigned to pastoral ministry or confessor should be consulted. In the spirit of penance, the faithful should not lightly excuse themselves from this obligation.

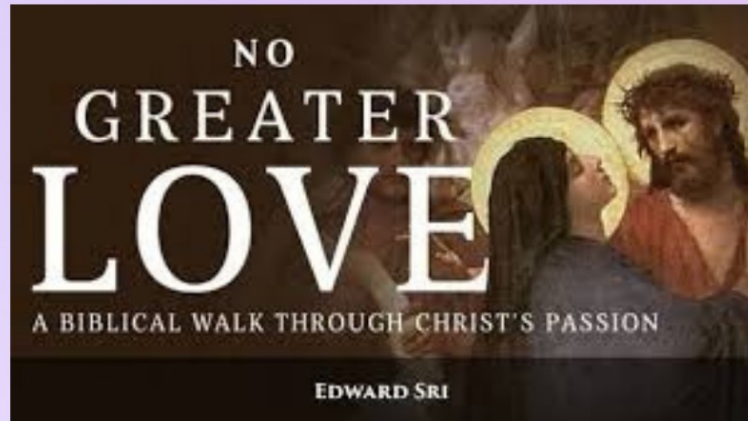

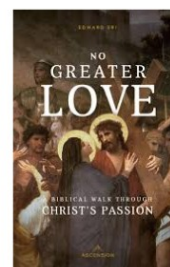

The theme for this year's Annual Appeal is from Isaiah 40:31, ***“Those who hope in the Lord will renew their strength.”*** As Catholics, we use our talents and provide our gifts for God's Glory. We help them know they belong in the Church, engage more fully in its life, and become living witnesses of Christ's love.
- * **Chaplaincy Program** – Chaplaincy is offered in hospitals and prisons. Chaplains bring support, healing, and counseling to individuals and families during their times of greatest need, in the most vulnerable moments of their lives. They administer sacraments, provide spiritual guidance, and foster hope through their presence.
- * **Tribunal** – Your generosity supports the Archdiocesan Tribunal, which accompanies God's people through their lives in the Church ... helps ensure fidelity to Canon Law, particularly regarding a Sacramental life...reviews cases, often involving marriage, and helps bring clarity and healing to people who often carry heavy burdens...safeguards the dignity and rights of the faithful as a reflection of Christ's mercy.
